Cranbrook Union.—Cranbrook Parish.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Cranbrook, in the county of Kent:—

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Cranbrook, in the county of Kent, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting held in the Vestry Room of the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Friday the twentieth day of March last, it was resolved,—

"That the Churchwardens be authorized to "apply to the Poor Law Board to make an "Order to put in force, within the parish of "Cranbrook, so much of the Act of the "13 and 14 Vic., cap. 57, as relates to the "appointment of a Vestry Clerk for this "parish."

And whereas at another meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held in the said Vestry Room, after public notice in that behalf, on Friday the twenty-fourth day of April last, it was resolved,—

"That the Churchwardens be authorized to "apply to the Poor Law Board to make an "Order to put in force within the parish of "Cranbrook so much of the 13th and 14th "Vic., cap. 57, as relates to the preventing "the holding of vestry or other parochial "meetings in the parish church of Cran-"brook, or in the Vestry Room attached to "such church, and in building a Vestry "Hall."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to each of the above resolutions.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct, that the whole of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said parish of Cranbrook.

And, at the request of the said Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish, we do hereby prescribe and direct, that the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, shall perform all the dutics specified in the said Act, except the following, namely:—

"To attend the audit of Accounts of the Over-"seers, and conduct all correspondence "arising therefrom.

"To ascertain and make out the list of persons "liable to serve on Juries, and to cause the "same to be printed and duly published, and "returned to the Justices.

"To give the notices for claims to vote for "Members of Parliament, and to make out "Lists of Voters, and get the same printed "and published and duly returned according "to law, and to attend the Court for revising "them, and to prepare, make out, and pub-"lish the Burgess Lists and the List of Con-"stables."

That an annual salary of thirty pounds shall be paid to the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed, under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.

That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual Feast days in the year, namely, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, Lady Day, and Midsummer Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office; but it shall be competent for the Churchwardens and Overseers to defer, in whole or in part, the payment of the salary of such Vestry Clerk until his accounts shall have been audited and allowed by the Auditor, after which audit and allowance the sum due up to the date of his accounts so audited shall forthwith be paid.

And we do hereby order and direct, that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London

Gazette.
