Hook Point Lighthouse.

THE Port of Dublin Corporation has given Notice, that on, or shortly before, the 1st day of December 1859, the Hook lighthouse, standing near the extreme of Hook point, on the east side of the entrance to Waterford harbour, will, in order to render it a better day mark, be painted with three horizontal *red* belts, and the lantern dome will also be coloured *red*; the remainder of the lighthouse will continue to be coloured *white*.

The painting of these red belts will be proceeded with at the same time; the work will be commenced at the south-west side of the lighthouse, and will be continued from thence around until completed, when the lantern dome will be coloured. The belts will each be 10 feet wide, and 9 feet apart.

The lighthouse is a circular tower 110 feet high from its base to the top of its lantern. Its position is lat. 52° 7' 25" N., long. 6° 55' 53" West of Greenwich.

Bells are tolled during foggy weather.

Caution.—Mariners are reminded that the entrance to Waterford harbour is marked on its eastern side by the Hook lighthouse, which is a single conspicuous tower; and the entrance to Tramore bay, the next inlet to the westward, by two towers on Brownstown head, its eastern point,
