THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from the French Ambassador at this Court, announcing, with reference to the provisions of the 2nd Article of the Supplementary Convention of the 12th October last between this country and France, that the French Government have authorised the French Consular Agents in the United Kingdom to affix their visa to Certificates of Origin issued by the Special Commissioners appointed by the High Court of Chancery to administer Oaths in Chancery.
