THE following Address of Condolence on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness the Prince Consort, which has been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been laid before the Queen by Sir George Grey, and has been received very graciously by Her Majesty :

To Her Most Gracious Majesty QUEEN  
VICTORIA.

WE, your Majesty's most loyal and loving subjects, the Ministers and Messengers of the various Churches of Protestant Dissenters known as Baptists, in the county of York, desire to address your Majesty on this the first occasion of our assembling together in our associated capacity since the deeply mournful bereavement sustained by your Majesty.

We humbly beg to assure your Majesty of the feelings of profound sorrow which the sad event occasioned in our hearts; that our prayers have been constantly offered to Him from whom all true consolation comes, that He would continue to sustain you and your illustrious family, granting you not only His counsel and help under the solemn responsibilities of your regal position, but also that purest joy which must result from the many excellencies and virtues of your late Royal Consort being reflected in the character and lives of your Royal Children.
