THE following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland having been transmitted by Robert Montgomery, Lord Belhaven, K.T., Her Majesty's Commissioner, to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., G.C.B., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the Queen, which Address Her Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, met in General Assembly of the National Church, desire to acknowledge, with profound gratitude, your most gracious letter, in which you are pleased to express your undiminished interest in our continued welfare and prosperity.

It was, may it please your Majesty, in entire accordance with their feelings of loyalty and attachment to your Majesty's person and Government, that the Commission of last General Assembly embraced the earliest opportunity of sending an address to the Crown, on an event so interesting to your Majesty as a Queen and a mother, as the marriage of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and seeing the same sentiments continue to animate this General Assembly, we feel it at once a privilege and a duty thus early to convey the expression of them to the foot of the Throne.

In our deliberations, as the Supreme Council of the Church, we derive great encouragement from the confidence which your Majesty is pleased to express, that these will be conducted with wisdom and prudence, and that they will be marked by an earnest desire to extend the usefulness of the Church, and to advance the highest interests of all its members.

We regard with unalloyed satisfaction your Majesty's appointment of the Right Honourable Lord Belhaven to represent your Royal person in this Assembly, not more from his known attachment and most munificent liberality to the church

of his fathers, than from his having discharged in many former assemblies the duties of his high office with approved fidelity to His Sovereign, and with the most anxious desire to consult and promote the convenience of all our ministers and elders.

Your Majesty's Royal Warrant for £2000, to promote the reformation of the Highlands and Islands of Scotland, demands our most grateful acknowledgement; and we believe we shall shew our gratitude in the manner most approved by your Majesty, by faithfully administering the fund, and striving, with God's blessing, and in accordance with your benevolent desire and prayer, that the poor may have the gospel preached to them.

That Almighty God, our Father in Heaven, by whom Kings reign and Princes decree justice, may long preserve your Majesty, in health and wealth, to rule over a free, loyal, and religious people, and that in Heaven he may bestow upon your Majesty an unfading crown of glory, is the earnest prayer of,

WHEREAS, by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage, power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British or Inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters, and to subject the same to rates of Postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the post office."

And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made for the transmission by the post of the letters hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such purpose, vested in and by the said Acts or either of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided) order and direct as follows:—

1. On every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to Egypt, or posted in Egypt addressed to the United Kingdom, and transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and Egypt (the conveyance between the United Kingdom and Egypt being via Marseilles, by British packet boat, between that port and Alexandria), there shall be charged, taken, and paid an uniform rate of postage (British and foreign combined) of sixpence; if such respective letters be prepaid, and if such respective letters be not prepaid, an uniform rate of postage (British and foreign combined) of ninepence.

2. On every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to Egypt, and transmitted by the post between Egypt and any of Her Majesty's colonies, or any foreign country through the United Kingdom (the conveyance between the United Kingdom and Egypt being via Marseilles, by British packet boat, between that port and Alexandria), there shall be charged, taken, and paid the rates of postage following, that is to say:—

For the conveyance of every such letter between Egypt and any part of the United Kingdom, an uniform rate of postage (British and foreign combined) of sixpence, if such respective letters be prepaid, and if such respective letters be not prepaid, an uniform rate of postage (British and foreign combined) of ninepence; and for the con-

veyance of every such letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and the colony or foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded such a further or additional rate of postage as shall from time to time be charged and payable for postage on letters posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and transmitted direct between such port and any such colony or foreign country; provided that in all cases where such additional rate includes both inland and sea services, there shall be deducted therefrom the sum of one penny in respect of the inland conveyance under this clause of every such letter sent through the United Kingdom.

3. On every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this Warrant, exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, there shall be charged taken and paid progressive and additional rates of postage as follows, that is to say:—

On every such letter exceeding one-quarter of an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one-half of an ounce in weight two rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding one-half of an ounce and not exceeding three-quarters of an ounce in weight three rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding three-quarters of an ounce and not exceeding one ounce in weight, four rates of postage.

And for every additional quarter of an ounce in weight above the weight of one ounce there shall be charged, taken, and paid one additional rate of postage, and every fractional part of an additional quarter of an ounce above the weight of one ounce shall be charged as one additional quarter of an ounce; and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant if not exceeding one-quarter of an ounce in weight.

4. The postage of every such letter addressed to any part of Egypt (Alexandria, Cairo, and Suez excepted) shall be paid at the time of the same being posted.

5. The rates of postage chargeable on letters transmitted by the post, under the provisions of this Warrant, shall be in lieu of any rates of postage now chargeable by law thereon.

6. The several letters transmitted by the post under the provisions of this Warrant shall be subject to the several orders, directions, and regulations contained in a certain Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 19th day of February, 1855, relating to redirected rates of postage upon letters and packets which shall be redirected and again forwarded by the post, so far as the same shall be applicable to such letters.

7. Nothing in this Warrant contained shall in anywise annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions or privileges granted by or under the said hereinbefore-recited Acts, or either of them, or by or under any other Acts of Parliament relating to the Post Office, or any of the privileges which officers, seamen, and soldiers employed in Her Majesty's service are by law entitled to, of sending and receiving by the post letters subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same.

8. The several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning, in all respects, as they would have had if

inserted in the said recited Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty.

9. The regulations made and established by virtue of a certain Warrant, under the hands of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 8th day of February, 1860, so far as they relate to the letters authorized to be transmitted by the post, under or by virtue of the provisions of this Warrant, are hereby repealed revoked and annulled.

10. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant, under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter alter, repeal, or revoke any of the rates of postage hereby fixed or altered, or any of the orders, regulations, conditions, and restrictions hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates, orders, regulations, conditions, or restrictions in lieu thereof, and from time to time may appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

11. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of July next.

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the providing a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding vestry or other meetings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish.

ARTICLE II.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
