THE following Correspondence has passed between Earl Russell, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and Monsieur de Bille, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of His Danish Majesty at this Court:

Legation of Denmark,

MY LORD,

May 23, 1864.

I AM directed to inform Her Britannic Majesty's Government that the Blockade of the ports of Cammin, Swinemünde, Wolgast, Greifswalde, Stralsund, Barth, Dantzig, and Pillau, in the Baltic, as well as the Blockade of the ports and inlets in the Duchies of Sleswig and Holstein, which were raised on the 12th of this month, in conformity with the stipulations of the suspension of hostilities, will immediately be re-established on the 12th of June next, the date on which the suspension of hostilities terminates, unless the negotiations carried on at the Conference of London should before then have led to at least some preliminary agreement.

My government has thought it due to the interests of the commercial world that timely notice of the re-establishment of the Blockade should be given; and I am also directed to state that no neutral ship, which after the renewal of the war might attempt to enter any one of the blockaded ports would be subject to capture, except where previous notice of the re-establishment of the Blockade had been received in the ordinary way, or through the ships of the blockading squadron itself.

Alteration of Lights at Demerara.

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty, that the following alterations have been made in the lights at Demerara, British Guayana.

The light shown from the lighthouse at the east side of entrance to the river has been altered from a fixed to a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every *minute*. It should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 16 miles.

The light vessel off the mouth of the river is in $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water, has only one mast, and now exhibits a *fixed* white light.

Also, that Bel Air beacon has been removed. The white buoy on the edge of the bank on the east side of the channel now lies at about a mile N.E. by E. of its former position.

The red buoy on the west side of the channel has been replaced by a black buoy, distant about a mile from the white buoy on the eastern side; and a small black buoy lies abreast the lighthouse in 14 feet at low water springs, on the edge of the western bank.

There are only 10 feet at low water springs, at the entrance to the Demerara, between the white and black buoys; and the depths of water in the navigable channels and over the banks have changed considerably since the last survey.

The windmills and high tree at the western side of entrance to the river have disappeared.

A large red buoy lies on the edge of the bank north-westward of the mouth of the river, in 9 feet at low water springs; it bears N.N.W. distant $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the lighthouse. The Sugar bank beacon has been placed about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of its former position; and a black buoy

at about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-westward of it marks the channel to the Essequibo river.
