(No. 59.)—CAPE OF GOOD HOPE—TABLE BAY.

Fixed Light on Robben Island.

THE Colonial Government at the Cape of Good Hope has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of January, 1865, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Robben Island, Table Bay.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, at an elevation of 154 feet above the mean level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen at a distance of about 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the first order.

The tower is round, white, 76 feet high from base to vane, and stands on Minto Hill, the southern and highest part of Robben Island, in lat. 33° 48' 52" S., long. 18° 22' 33" East of Greenwich.

Alteration of Lights on Green and Mouillé Points.

Also, that on and after the 1st day of January 1865, the following alterations will be made in the lights on Green and Mouillé Points.

A white light, showing a *flash* every ten seconds, will be exhibited from the lighthouse on Green Point, at an elevation of 65 feet above the sea, visible in clear weather at a distance of 13 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The two fixed lights hitherto shown on Green Point will be discontinued.

A *fixed red* light will be exhibited from a tower recently erected on Mouillé Point, at an elevation of 44 feet above the sea, visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower is round, 30 feet high, and painted in alternate red and white bands.

The fixed white light hitherto shown from Mouillé Point will be discontinued, and the old tower demolished.

Directions.

Vessels bound for Table Bay from the south ward should not shut in Cape Point light with the land at Slangkop Point until Robben Island light—which will be seen before the *flashing* light on Green Point—bears N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., when they may steer for it; and when Green Point light bears East, an E.N.E. course may be followed until the *red* light on Mouillé Point comes open northward of Green Point light, bearing S.E. by S. This route will clear the Vulcan Rock and the reefs in its vicinity. The course may now be altered to S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., which will carry a vessel one mile northward of Mouillé Point light, and within this distance no stranger should round the Point at night. When Mouillé *red* light bears S.S.W., a course about S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. may be steered for the anchorage, bearing in mind not to approach the *green* light on the end of the breakwater too close. When the *flashing* light on Green Point is shut in with the hillocks near Mouillé Point, or Mouillé Point *red* light bears N.W., distant about one mile, a vessel may anchor in from 6 to 8 fathoms water. Small vessels may anchor in 4 or 5 fathoms, with Mouillé Point light bearing about N.W. by N.

Vessels bound to Table Bay from the northward should give Robben Island a good berth, and not be misled by its light, for the island is low, and the dangerous Whale Rock lies S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., only $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the lighthouse, and 9 cables from the nearest point of the island. Having

sighted Robben Island light, a vessel should haul to the S.W., if the vessel bear anything to the westward of South, until the *flashing* light on Green Point bears S. by E., or S.S.E., then steer for it until Robben Island light bears N.E.; when steer S.E.; and when Mouillé *red* light bears S.S.W., steer about S. by E. for the anchorage.

With Robben Island light and Green Point or Mouillé Point light, a vessel may readily determine her position by cross bearings; but in working for the anchorage, the safest and easiest plan to adopt is, whilst Green and Mouillé lights are open of each other, to tack when Robben Island light bears N. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., and when they approach each other or become in line, to tack when Robben Island light bears N. by W. This will prevent accidents from the low Blaawubergh beach, on the eastern shore of the bay, and its deceptive appearance at night. Little, if anything, can be lost in thus beating in by giving up the smooth water near the shore, as a constant northerly current sets out between Robben Island and the main land; added to which, the wind blows with greater violence from the S.E. on the east side of the bay than it does more to the westward, though not in such sudden and violent gusts.

A *fixed* white leading light, at an elevation of 70 feet above high water, will also be exhibited from a flag-staff, at the distance of 110 feet seaward of the principal white light, which in line bearing N. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. will lead in the middle of the fairway channel.

After passing between Castle and Kettle points, a smaller white light near the coast-guard station, at the southern part of the town of Dartmouth, will indicate the fairway to the anchorage; a *red*

light will show over the shoals on the north side of the harbour; and a *green* light over the shoal of the One Gun point on the south.

A Beacon of masonry, built of gray granite, in the form of a pyramid, 80 feet high, will be erected on the high land, about 500 feet above the sea, at nearly half a mile, N.E. by N. from the outer Froward point, at the eastern side of entrance to the harbour.

Whitstable Fishery (Extension).

Extension and maintenance of Oyster Fishery.

Exclusive Right of depositing and dredging for Oysters; Purchase of Lands, Rights, and other Privileges; Construction of Landing Places, Slips, Warehouses, and other Buildings and Conveniences; Levying Penalties; Powers of Borrowing Money; Amendment of Acts; and for other purposes.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for an Act to enable the Company of Free Fishers and Dredgers of Whitstable, in the county of Kent (hereinafter called "The Company"), to extend their oyster fishery in the Estuary of the River Thames, within the limits or boundaries hereinafter mentioned, and to maintain the same, and to confer on such Company the exclusive right of depositing, breeding, dredging, and fishing for oysters in that part of the Estuary of the River Thames, which is situate within, near, or adjacent to the several parishes or places of Whitstable, Swalecliffe, Herne, Herne Bay, and Reculver, all in the county of Kent, and which is comprised within the following limits or boundaries; that is to say:—

Firstly, Westward.—An imaginary line drawn from a point (A) at Trinity high water mark on the shore of the parish of Whitstable (being on the eastern boundary of the oyster grounds of the Company), along such boundary to a point (B) (being the northern or sea extremity of such boundary), distant 150 chains from the point (A), and thence northward, along the eastern boundary of the oyster grounds of the Faversham Oyster Company to a point (C), distant 80 chains from the point (B).

Secondly, Northward.—An imaginary straight line drawn from the point (C) to a point (D) east of and distant 480 chains from the point (C).

Thirdly, Eastward.—An imaginary straight line drawn from the point (D) to a point (E), south of and distant 80 chains from the point (D), and an imaginary straight line drawn from a point (G) at Trinity high water mark on the shore of the parish of Swalecliffe, and at a distance of 133 chains eastward, from the point (A) along the western boundary of the oyster grounds of the Herne Bay, Hampton, and Reculver Oyster Fishery Company to a point (F), due north of and distant 110 chains from the point (G).

Fourthly, Southward.—An imaginary straight line drawn from the point (F) to the point (E) along the northern boundary of the oyster grounds of the said Herne Bay, Hampton, and Reculver Oyster Fishery Company, and also the line of Trinity high water mark from the point (A) to the point (G).

And it is intended by the said Act to enact that, after the expiration of one month after the erecting and providing by the Company of boundary stones and buoys, to denote the limits of their extended fishery, and the publishing by them of the prescribed notice of the limits of their extended fishery, and the provisions of the said Act relating to such fishery and the Company's existing fishery, no person other than the officers, members, agents, or servants of the Company, in the due exercise of their duties or privileges under the bye-laws, or rules, or regulations of the Company, or under such Act, or persons thereunto expressly authorized by the Company by writing under the hand of the fore-

man or deputy-foreman of the Company, shall, within the limits, as well of the Company's existing fishery as of their extended fishery, do any of the following things; that is to say:—

- (A). Fish, for, or take, or attempt to take any oysters.
- (B). Dredge or trawl for any oysters.
- (C). Fish for, or take, or attempt to take, otherwise than by line and hook, or by net solely adapted for catching floating fish, any eels, or any soles, flounders, plaice, turbot, halibut, or other flat-fish, or any other fish whose natural habit it is to be in the mud or sand, or at or near the bottom of the water.
- (D). Use any other net, or any engine, implement, tackle, apparatus, or device, other than line and hook, for any of the above-mentioned purposes.
- (E). Dredge for any ballast, mud, sand, or other substance, except for the purpose of improving the navigation.
- (F). Deposit any ballast, rubbish, or other substance.
- (G). Place any weir, engine, work, implement, apparatus, or device prejudicial, or likely to be prejudicial, to any oyster bed, or oysters, or to the oyster fishery.
- (H). In any other manner wilfully disturb any oyster bed or oysters.
- (I). Wilfully do, or occasion in any other manner, any injury or damage to any oyster bed, or oysters, or to the oyster fishery.
- (K). Wilfully damage, or injure, or moor any vessel to any buoy provided by the Company for denoting the limits of the Company's oyster grounds.
- (L). And no person other than as aforesaid shall, within or without the limits of such existing or extended fishery, wilfully buy or sell, or expose for sale, or have in his possession, without the authority or permission of the Company, any oyster the property of the Company.

And that if any person act in any respect in contravention of such enactment, every person so offending shall for every such offence incur the following penalties (that is to say):

- (M). He shall forfeit all the fish and ballast found in his possession.
- (N). He shall forfeit all nets, engines, implements, tackle, weirs, works, anchors, moorings, apparatus, and devices used in committing any of the offences.
- (O). He shall pay a penalty not exceeding two pounds for the first offence, and not exceeding five pounds for the second offence, and not exceeding ten pounds for the third and every subsequent offence.

And in addition to the penalties, and whether or not they shall be inflicted, he shall make full compensation to the Company for all damage or injury sustained by them by reason or in consequence of his offence.

And it is intended by the said Act to confer upon the Company powers for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):

To purchase and take by compulsion and also by agreement messuages, lands, tenements, and hereditaments of any tenure within, near, or adjacent to the said parishes or places of Whitstable, Swalecliffe, Herne, Herne Bay, and Reculver.

To make, construct, maintain, and provide landing places, slips, houses, warehouses, and other buildings and conveniences.

To confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of tolls, rates, and duties, and to confer, vary, or extinguish other rights and privileges.

To enable the Company to apply money raised by grant, sale, demise, mortgage, alienation, or any disposition of their existing fishery in the purchase of lands or for the purposes of such fishery and of the extended fishery, or of either of them, or otherwise of the said Act.

To enable the Company to raise money on bond for the same or any of such purposes.

To enable the Company to raise money by mortgage of their extended fishery and of messuages, lands, tenements, and hereditaments to be purchased under the said Act for the same or any of such purposes.

And it is intended by the said Act, so far as may be necessary for the purposes thereof, to repeal, alter, amend, extend, or enlarge, all or some of the powers and provisions of the local and personal Act, 33rd George III, cap. 42, and to make other provisions in lieu of any provisions so repealed, altered, or amended.

And it is intended to incorporate with the intended Act, wholly or in part, "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845;" "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860," or one of such Acts.

And notice is hereby further given, that on or before the 30th day of November instant, plans delineating the lands intended to be taken compulsorily, with a book of reference to such plans respectively, and a copy of this notice, as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Kent, at his office at Maidstone, in that county; and on or before the said 30th day of November instant, a copy of so much of the said plans and book of reference as relates to each of the parishes in which the land intended to be taken compulsorily is situate, together with a copy of the Gazette notice, will be deposited for public inspection with the parish clerk of each such parish, and in case of an extra-parochial place, with the clerk of the parish adjoining.
