## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levees, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Princess.

### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen, for Her Majesty's approbation. **W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and

seven, intituled "An Act to prevent until the "first day of September, one thousand eight "hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then "session of Parliament, the spreading of conta- "gious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, "and other animals," and from time to time continued by divers subsequent Acts, and lastly by an Act passed in the session of the twenty- eighth and twenty-ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and nineteen, it is (amongst other things) enacted that it shall be lawful for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, from time to time, to make such Orders and Regulations as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the removal to or from such parts or places, as they may designate in such Order or Orders, of sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate infection; and to make any other Orders or Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said Act, and again to revoke, alter, or vary any such Orders or Regulations; and that all provisions for any of the purposes aforesaid in any such Order or Orders contained, shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act:

And whereas the said Act has been amended and explained by an Act passed in the twenty- ninth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Act of the eleventh "and twelfth years of Her present Majesty, "chapter one hundred and seven, to prevent the "spreading of contagious or infectious disorders "among sheep, cattle, and other animals:"

And whereas a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," has lately appeared, and now prevails, amongst cattle in England and Wales:

And whereas by an Order bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March last, duly made by the Lords of the said Council, it was among other things ordered, that until the first of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into any town or place in Eng- land, shall be marked by clipping the hair off the end of the tail, and no such cattle shall be removed alive from such town or place, except by sea:

And whereas there is a certain market held for the sale of cattle in the parish of St. Mary Isling- ton, in the county of Middlesex, known as the Metropolitan Cattle Market, which market has been licensed by the Lords of the said Council for the sale of cattle intended for immediate slaughter until the first day of June next, or until the same licence shall be revoked, and it is advisable that regulations should be made for the removal of certain cattle to such market to be sold for immediate slaughter:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the said Council do hereby order, that from and after the date of this Order, cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom to any place on the rivers Thames or Medway westward of the Nore Light, from which place there may be a railway on which cattle can be taken by trains without change of carriages to within 500 yards of the said market, may be removed along such railway to such market, for the purpose of being sold therein for immediate slaughter, any thing in the

said recited Order to the contrary notwithstanding, subject to the following regulations:

1. All such cattle shall be landed in such manner, at such times, and subject to such supervision and control as the Commissioners of Customs shall from time to time direct, and shall be conveyed without stopping, except for the purpose of feeding or being watered, from the place where they shall be landed to the said market.

2. They shall be brought along the railway in trucks or carriages exclusively set apart and used for the purpose of conveying cattle brought from abroad, and coloured with a special colour, or otherwise by distinct mark to be approved of by the Board of Trade, to designate them as so appropriated, and such trucks and carriages shall, after they have been used for the purpose of conveying any cattle to the said market, be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected in such manner as may be necessary, or as the said Board of Trade may from time to time direct.

3. As soon as any truck or carriage shall have conveyed such cattle as aforesaid to the said market, and discharged them there, and have been so cleansed and disinfected, it shall be removed from the neighbourhood of the said market, and returned forthwith to the place from which it shall have brought the cattle.

4. If any truck or carriage is at any time used in contravention of any regulation herein contained, the company or person by whom it is used shall, every time that such truck or carriage is so used, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

5. This Order shall be construed in like manner as the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, and all the provisions of such last-mentioned Order shall apply to this Order, except so far as they may be inconsistent with anything herein contained.

that it shall be lawful for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, from time to time, to make such Orders and Regulations as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the removal to or from such parts or places as they may designate in such Order or Orders, of sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate infection, and to make any other Orders or Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said Act, and again to revoke, alter, or vary any such Orders or Regulations; and that all provisions for any of the purposes aforesaid in any such Order or Orders contained shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act:

And whereas the said Act has been amended and explained by an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and seven, to prevent the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals":

And whereas a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," has lately appeared, and now prevails, amongst cattle in England and Wales:

And whereas divers Orders in pursuance of the said first-recited Act have been made by the Lords of the said Council in relation to the cattle plague, which were consolidated and amended, by Orders bearing date the 24th day of March and 11th day of April, 1866.

And whereas it is expedient that special provision should be made in respect to the county of Westmoreland, as herein contained:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby order, that from and after the date hereof the Local Authority for the county of Westmoreland may make such regulations for the admission of cattle and other animals into that county as shall seem to them most expedient for the prevention of the spreading of the disease, and no cattle or other animals shall be conveyed, brought, or taken into the said county contrary to such regulations, anything in the Orders of the 24th of March and 11th of April, 1866, to the contrary notwithstanding, after four days from the publication of such regulations, except as hereinafter provided:

Provided that no such regulation shall interfere with the conveyance of any animals by railway into, through, or out of the said county:

This Order shall be construed in like manner as the Orders of the 24th March and 11th April, 1866, and all the provisions therein contained shall apply to this Order, so far as the same can be applicable, and the violation of any part of this Order shall be an offence subject to the penalty incurred under the said Orders by the committing of any offence against them or either of them; and the regulations made by the local authority for Westmoreland, under this Order, shall be published in some newspaper or newspapers circulating within the county or counties bordering on the county of Westmoreland.

An Act for facilitating the public exhibition of Works of Art in certain exhibitions.

An Act to regulate the inspection of Cattle Sheds, Cowhouses, and Byres within Burghs and populous places in Scotland.

An Act to indemnify William Forsyth, Esquire, one of Her Majesty's Counsel, from any penal consequences which he may have incurred by sitting or voting as a Member of the House of Commons while holding the office of Standing Counsel to the Secretary of State in Council of India.

An Act to amend the law relating to Parliamentary Oaths.

An Act to make provision for the transfer of the assets, liabilities, and management of the Bengal, Madras, and Bombay Military Funds, the Bengal Military Orphan Society, and other Funds, to the Secretary of State for India in Council.

An Act for the establishment and regulation of a market near Columbia-square, in the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, in the county of Middlesex; and the opening of a new street and the improvement of streets adjoining or near to the market place; and for other purposes.

An Act to extend the time for the completion of the Central Wales Extension Railway, and for other purposes.

An Act to incorporate the Banbury Gas Light and Coke Company (Limited), and to make further provision for lighting Banbury and places in the neighbourhood thereof, in the counties of Oxford and Northampton, with gas.

An Act for the amalgamation of the Kidwelly and Burry Port Railway Company and the Burry Port Company, and for other purposes.

On and after the 1st of May, 1866, ships of the Imperial Navy, and Semaphores on the coast of France, will be furnished with the *Commercial Code of Signals for the use of ships of all nations*; and they will communicate *exclusively* by the signals of that Code with Merchant ships of France and with foreign ships.

**TREASURY WARRANT.**

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of Postage," it is enacted that it should be lawful for the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury from time to time, and at any time after the passing of that Act, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters, or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant, and that the power thereby given to alter and fix rates of postage should extend to any increase, or reduction, or remission of postage.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers vested in us in and by the said recited Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided, order and direct as follows; that is to say:—

1. On every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight transmitted by the post direct between

any place in the United Kingdom and Norway (the sea conveyance being by private ship) there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage heretofore chargeable on such letters, an uniform British rate of postage of four pence.

2. And on every letter, transmitted as is mentioned in this Warrant, exceeding half an ounce in weight there shall be charged, taken, and paid progressive and additional rates of postage as follows ; that is to say :—

On every such letter exceeding half an ounce in weight and not exceeding one ounce in weight two rates of postage ;

On every such letter exceeding one ounce and not exceeding one ounce and the half of another ounce in weight three rates of postage ;

On every such letter exceeding one ounce and the half of another ounce and not exceeding two ounces in weight four rates of postage ;

And for every half an ounce in weight of any such letter above the weight of two ounces there shall be charged and taken one additional rate of postage, and in charging any additional rate of postage every fractional part of such additional half an ounce shall be charged as an additional half an ounce in weight, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

3. Nothing in this Warrant contained shall in anywise alter, prejudice, or affect the exemptions and privileges granted by the said recited Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, nor in anywise prejudice or affect the privilege which officers, seamen, and soldiers employed in Her Majesty's service now by law enjoy of sending and receiving letters by the post, subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same.

4. The several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

6. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter, alter or repeal any of the rates hereby altered or the regulations hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the 4th year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 96, for the regulation of the duties of postage, certain scales of weight and rates of

postage were fixed and made chargeable and payable upon, for, or in respect of letters, newspapers, parliamentary proceedings, and printed papers, transmitted and forwarded by the post, and various regulations were made for facilitating the transmission of such letters and papers by the post ; and by the same Act powers were given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of postage therein mentioned.

And whereas further powers were given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by another Act of Parliament passed in the 11th year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 85, for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office.

And whereas the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers vested in them in and by the said before-mentioned Acts, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, have, from time to time, by divers Warrants under their hands relating to the colonial book post and the colonial pattern post, authorised and directed that packets consisting of books, publications, or works of literature or art, and packets consisting of patterns or samples of merchandize, might be transmitted by the post to and from the United Kingdom and certain of Her Majesty's colonies, at certain rates of postage, and under and subject to certain conditions, regulations, and restrictions in and by the said several Warrants respectively specified and mentioned.

And whereas it is expedient to reduce the postage now chargeable on certain packets transmitted by the colonial book post and the colonial pattern post, in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us in and by the hereinbefore-recited Acts of Parliament, and each of them and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the Statute in that case made and provided, order, direct, and declare as follows, that is to say :—

1. That all packets consisting of books, publications, or works of literature or art, whether British, Colonial, or Foreign, and all packets consisting of printed votes and proceedings of the Imperial Parliament or the Colonial Legislatures exceeding eight ounces in weight, posted in the United Kingdom addressed to any of Her Majesty's colonies or possessions, or posted in Malta or Gibraltar addressed to the United Kingdom and respectively transmitted by the post from the United Kingdom to any of Her Majesty's colonies or possessions, and from Malta or Gibraltar to the United Kingdom, under the authority of certain Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date respectively the 21st day of July, 1857, the 2nd day of September, 1857, the 13th day of April, 1859, the 19th day of June, 1858, the 1st day of July, 1859, the 11th day of June, 1860, the 25th day of March, 1862, the 8th day of January, 1863, the 25th day of July, 1863, the 26th day of December, 1864, the 11th day of March, 1865, the 27th day of December, 1865, and the 19th day of March, 1866, or under the authority of some or one of such Warrants respectively, or under the authority of any other Warrant or Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury now in force relating to the colonial book post ; and all

packets consisting of patterns or samples of merchandise exceeding eight ounces in weight posted in the United Kingdom addressed to any of Her Majesty's colonies or possessions, or posted in Malta or Gibraltar addressed to the United Kingdom, and respectively transmitted by the post from the United Kingdom to any of Her Majesty's colonies or possessions, and from Malta or Gibraltar to the United Kingdom, under the authority of certain Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date respectively the 5th day of September, 1864, the 24th day of September, 1864, the 3rd day of December, 1864, the 29th day of December, 1864, the 30th day of December, 1864, the 16th day of March, 1865, the 27th day of December, 1865, the 28th day of December, 1865, the 29th day of December, 1865, and the 19th day of March, 1866, or under the authority of some or one of such Warrants respectively, or under the authority of any other Warrant or Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury now in force relating to the colonial pattern post; shall, in lieu of being charged with the postage payable thereon respectively for such transmission thereof as hereinbefore mentioned, according to the scale of weight and number of rates contained in or referred to by the said recited or referred to Warrants respectively, or any or either of them, be charged with such postage according to the scale of weight and number of rates following, that is to say:—

On every such packet exceeding eight ounces, and not exceeding twelve ounces in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid three rates of postage;

And on every such packet, if exceeding twelve ounces, and not exceeding sixteen ounces in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid four rates of postage;

And for every additional four ounces in weight of any such packet, above the weight of sixteen ounces, there shall be charged, taken, and paid one additional rate of postage; and every fractional part of such additional four ounces in weight shall be charged as an additional four ounces in weight; and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this Warrant shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such packet would be charged with under any such Warrants or Warrant respectively as hereinbefore mentioned, if not exceeding four ounces in weight.

2. The several Warrants hereinbefore recited or referred to, relating to the colonial book post and the colonial pattern post respectively, shall, save so far as the same are altered or affected by this present Warrant, or by any other Warrant or Warrants now in force altering or affecting the same, continue in full force and effect as fully and effectually as if the scale of weight and number of rates mentioned and contained in the first clause of this Warrant had been inserted in the said recited or referred to Warrants in lieu of those therein contained applicable to packets exceeding eight ounces in weight.

3. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, revoke, or modify any of the rates of postage hereby fixed, or any of the regulations hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time may appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

**ARTICLE II.**—That an annual salary of thirty pounds shall be paid to the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.
