THE Right Honourable the Board of Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Venice, stating that the Port Lights at Trieste and Venice are to be discontinued until further notice:—

(Translation.)

The Presidency of the Central Maritime Government has the honour to inform the British Consulate, that under the actual circumstances of war, in consequence of a demand of the I. R. Commandant of the Local Division, it was ordered that the lighting of the lantern situated in the Roadstead of Trieste be suspended from this day forward till further orders.

At the same time, the before-named Consulate is informed that, from official communications up to this time received, the lighting of the maritime lighthouses of Capo Compare and Maria Art, in Legna, Punta d'Ostro (South Point), and of Lissa, in Dalmatia, was likewise suspended till further orders.
