THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from the Acting British Consul-General in Costa Rica a Despatch, of which the following is a copy:—

British Legation, San José, Costa Rica, March 20, 1867.

I HAVE the honour to report that by a Decree of the Legislature of Nicaragua, dated the 18th of January last, the importation into that Republic of spirituous liquors is prohibited at the expiration of four months from that date.
