WHEREAS one of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company's vessels, called the "Tamar," has lately arrived, from the West Indies, and has been directed to proceed to, and remain under quarantine at, the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight, and during and in the course of her voyage from the West Indies, the Yellow Fever, being a dangerous and infectious disease, appeared on board the said vessel, and attacked several persons on board thereof, and the said vessel arrived under alarming and suspicious circumstances; and whereas several persons who were on board the "Tamar," on her arrival, being all the persons on board the said ship who were known to be or suspected of being affected by the said disease, have since been ordered to be removed to the Quarantine Lazarette or Hulk called the "Menelaus," lying at the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the disposition of the other persons remaining on board the said ship:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, in exercise of the powers vested in them, do hereby order,—

1. That the said vessel, called the "Tamar," shall remain and continue at the Motherbank aforesaid, until the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

2. That the persons now on board the said vessel called the "Tamar," not ordered to be removed to the "Menelaus," shall be removed to the ship called the "Parana," or the ship called the "Æolus," unless ordered to remain on board the "Tamar," by the Medical Superintendent of Quarantine at Southampton.

3. That all persons so removed on board the "Menelaus" Quarantine Hulk, or who shall hereafter be removed on board the said Hulk, or on board the "Parana," or the "Æolus," and who shall have been on board the "Tamar," shall be kept and detained on board the said Hulk, or the "Parana," or the "Æolus," until the said Lords of the Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

**WESTBURY-UPON-TRYM.—ORDER FOR DIVISION
INTO SPECIAL DRAINAGE DISTRICTS.**

WHEREAS, Memorials have been presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State from inhabitants of parts of the parish of Westbury-upon-Trym, in the county of Gloucester, under and in pursuance of the provisions of the Sanitary Act, 1866, and of the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867, such parts of the said parish being beyond the boundaries of the District of the Bristol Local Board of Health, praying that portions of such parish should be constituted into Special Drainage Districts, under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts; and whereas due investigation has been made into the circumstances of the case, and into the prayer of such Petitions, by Robert Morgan, Esq., the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose, and he has duly reported to me thereon:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as aforesaid, do hereby, under the authority conferred upon me by the said Acts, order and direct that, from and after the date of this present Order, such portion of the parish of Westbury-upon-Trym, in the county of Gloucester, as is bounded in its whole length on the north-east side by the parish of Henbury, and on all other sides by the Rivers Severn and Avon, shall for the purposes of the Acts hereinbefore recited, be constituted a Special Drainage District, under the title of "The Shirehampton Drainage District." That the tithing of Stokebishop, in the parish of Westbury-upon-Trym, in the county of Gloucester aforesaid, shall for the purposes of such Acts be constituted a Special Drainage District under the title of the "Stokebishop Drainage District," and that the tithing of Westbury, in the said parish of Westbury-upon-Trym, be constituted into four Special Drainage Districts with the boundaries and descriptions hereinafter set forth.

The boundaries of the Special Drainage District, No. 1, to commence at the point A on the accompanying plan No. 2, on the road between Westbury and Henbury, where it crosses the boundary between the parishes of Westbury-upon-Trym and Henbury; thence, north-easterly, along the said parish boundary, until it joins the boundary between the parishes of Westbury-upon-Trym and Filton; thence, southerly, along this boundary, until it joins the boundary between the parishes of Westbury-upon-Trym and Horfield; thence, southerly, along this boundary, to B, on the north side of Southmead-lane; thence, westerly, along the north side of the said lane, to C; thence, along the west side of field numbered 1098, to D; thence, along the south-west side of fields numbered 1097 and 1119, and the east side of fields numbered 1120, 1123, and 1124, to E, on the River Trym; thence, along the north side of fields numbered 1125 and 1126, to F; thence, along the east and north sides of field numbered 1129, to G, on the road from Westbury to Charlton; thence, along the west side of the said

road, and including it, to H; thence, along the north side of fields numbered 843, 844, and 833, to I, on the road from Westbury to Henbury; thence, along the east side of the said road to the starting point at A, thus completing the boundaries of the Special Drainage District No. 1.

The boundaries of the Special Drainage District, No. 2, to commence at the said point A on the accompanying plan No. 2; thence, westerly and south-westerly, along the boundary between the parishes of Westbury-upon-Trym and Henbury, to J, on the River Trym, where it joins the boundary between the tithings of Westbury and Stokebishop; thence, south-easterly, along the said tithing boundary, to K; thence, northerly, along the east side of fields numbered 663, 686, and 689, to Stoke-lane; thence, crossing the said lane, and northerly, along the west side of fields numbered 718, 702, 725, and 726, to L, at Canford-lane; thence, crossing the said lane along the west and north sides of fields numbered 785 and 786, the west side of fields numbered 787 and 819, and the west and north sides of field numbered 818, to I, on the road between Westbury and Henbury; thence, along the east side of the said road, and including it to the starting point at A, thus completing the boundaries of the Special Drainage District No. 2.

separates the parish of Whippingham from the parish of Arreton.
