2nd Battalion, 24th Regiment	Assistant-Surgeon Campbell Millis Douglas, M.D. Private Thomas Murphy „ James Cooper „ David Bell „ William Griffiths	<p>For the very gallant and daring manner in which, on the 7th of May, 1867, they risked their lives in manning a boat and proceeding through a dangerous surf to the rescue of some of their comrades, who formed part of an expedition which had been sent to the Island of Little Andaman, by order of the Chief Commissioner of British Burmah, with the view of ascertaining the fate of the Commander and seven of the crew of the ship "Assam Valley," who had landed there, and were supposed to have been murdered by the natives.</p> <p>The officer who commanded the troops on the occasion reports : "About an hour later in the day, Dr. Douglas, 2nd Battalion, 24th Regiment, and the four Privates referred to, gallantly manning the second gig, made their way through the surf almost to the shore, but finding their boat was half filled with water, they retired. A second attempt made by Dr. Douglas and party proved successful, five of us being safely passed through the surf to the boats outside. A third and last trip got the whole of the party left on shore safe to the boats."</p> <p>It is stated that Dr. Douglas accomplished these trips through the surf to the shore by no ordinary exertion. He stood in the bows of the boat, and worked her in an intrepid and seamanlike manner, cool to a degree, as if what he was then doing was an ordinary act of every-day life. The four Privates behaved in an equally cool and collected manner, rowing through the roughest surf when the slightest hesitation or want of pluck on the part of any one of them would have been attended by the gravest results. It is reported that seventeen officers and men were thus saved from what must otherwise have been a fearful risk, if not certainty of death.</p>

Alteration in Buoys and Lights in the Bristol Channel.

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice that the following alterations have taken place in the buoys in the Bristol Channel :—

Ranie Spit Buoy has been coloured *black and white* in vertical stripes.

West Cardiff Buoy has been surmounted by a staff and ball.

Cardiff Hook Buoy has been coloured *black*.

East Cardiff Buoy has been changed to a conical buoy, with staff and ball, and coloured *black*.

Nash Swatchway Buoy has been coloured *black and white* in vertical stripes.

Breaksea Buoy has been coloured, *chequered black and white*.

Wolves Buoy has been coloured *red*.

West Culver Buoy has been changed to a conical buoy, with staff and triangle, and coloured *black and white* in horizontal bands.

East Culver Buoy has been changed to a conical buoy, with staff and diamond, and coloured *red and white* in horizontal bands.

New Patch Buoy has been coloured *red and white* in horizontal bands.

South-west Patch Buoy has been changed to a conical buoy, with staff and diamond, and coloured *red and white* in horizontal bands.

Welsh Hook Buoy has been coloured, *chequered red and white*.

West Usk Buoy has been coloured, *chequered red and white*.

East Usk Buoy has been coloured *red*.

Flatholm and Usk Lights.

Also the following alterations will shortly be effected in the Flatholm and Usk lights.

Flatholm Light will be coloured *red* from and between the bearings of S. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. and S.W.

Usk Light will be coloured *red* from and between the bearings of N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. and N.N.W., and also from N. by W. to N.N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. from whence into the land it will be *white*. It will also show *white* between N.N.W. and N. by W. to mark the channel into the river, and a *white* strip will show up the river between the bearings S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. and W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

And also that due notice will be given when these alterations have been effected.

Alteration in Perim Light.

THE Marine Department at Bombay has given notice, that the following alterations have been made in Perim light, Cambay gulf :—

The light is now exhibited from a lighthouse, is elevated 128 feet above the level of the sea, and

in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The lighthouse is built of stone, 78 feet high, white, and its position is in lat. $21^{\circ} 35' 54''$ N., long. $72^{\circ} 23' 38''$ East of Greenwich.

Alteration in Tapti Light.

Also that the following alterations have been made in Tapti light (Vaux's tomb) mouth of Surat river, Cambay gulf:—

The light is now exhibited from a lighthouse, is elevated 100 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The lighthouse is stone, 91 feet high, and painted with three bands, red and white.
