THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at St. Petersburg, at extract from the "Journal de St. Pétersbourg," of the 5th instant, which contains an Official Notice announcing the extension till the 1st January, 1869, of the immunity granted by the observations annexed to Articles 48 and 206 of the Russian Customs Tariff now in force.

These observations have reference to the importation, either free or at reduced rates of duty, of detached pieces of agricultural machines and implements, into Russia by the Southern Ports, and by the Custom-houses of the districts of Radzivilow, Skouliany, and Koubaï.
