THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Teneriffe, reporting that the sliding scale of duties hitherto levied upon wheat, maize, and flour imported into the Canary Islands has been replaced by a fixed rate of duty of 0.09 of an escudo, or about 2½d. the hectolitre of wheat and maize, and 0.18 of an escudo, or about 5d. the 100 kilogrammes or quintal of flour when carried in Spanish vessels, and to double these rates when

imported in foreign bottoms. This order applies to all importations of the before-mentioned articles in vessels which shall have sailed from the ports from which they proceed before the last day of the month of July next.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Manila, reporting that by a Royal Decree, dated Madrid 10th December, 1867, the following articles have been declared free of duty on importation into the Philippine Islands without any distinction as to flag, namely,—olive oil, rice, bacalao, salted and dried meats, beef and mutton, hams and venison, peas, grains, vegetables and cereals such as oats, rye, beans, maize, lentils, and the like, flour, green herbs, garlic, onions, potatoes, butter and lard, salted, dried, and pickled fish, sardines, hung beef, bacon, wheat, cattle, pigs and buffaloes, trees, plants and seeds, coals, and live fish.

ALFORD (PARISH), COUNTY OF LINCOLN;—
NOTICE AND APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION RESCINDING THE RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE ACT IN THAT DISTRICT.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted by the district of the parish of Alford, in the county of Lincoln, on the 29th day of October, 1866, and a resolution has been subsequently, on the 15th day of February, 1868, passed on a requisition of owners and ratepayers of such parish rescinding the previous resolution adopting the said Act, and no appeal has been presented to any one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, under the provisions of the Local Government Act Amendment Act, 1863 (sec. 4), against such rescinding resolution; and whereas I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, have taken the circumstances of the case into consideration, I do hereby approve the aforesaid resolution rescinding the previous re-

solution adopting the Local Government Act, 1858, within the said district of Alford, in the county of Lincoln; and further order that, from the date of the publication of this present notice in the London Gazette, the adoption of the said Local Government Act shall be deemed to be avoided, and that, from the same date, the Local Government Act, 1858, shall cease to be in force within the said district, and such parish shall revert to the position in which it was before the adoption of the said Act; so, nevertheless, that all contracts that may have been entered into by or on behalf of the Local Board thereof, may be enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Local Government Act, 1858, had continued in force, and so far as may be necessary for the enforcement of such contracts, such Local Board and all their powers of levying money shall be deemed to be, and shall be continued, as provided by the aforesaid Acts.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 28.)—PORTUGAL.

Red Light at Cascaes—Entrance of River Tagus.

THE Portuguese Government has given notice, that from the 1st day of March, 1868, a light would be exhibited from a tower recently erected on the fort of Santa Martha, near the village of Cascaes, entrance of the River Tagus.

The light is a *red* light, elevated 52 feet above the high-water level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of five miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses.

The tower is square, cased with white bricks, and has a blue stripe half way up from the base; it has been erected to replace the mark on the wall of the fort of Santa Martha which was difficult to distinguish from a distance. By keeping the red light by night, or the light tower by day, in a line with the Guia Lighthouse, vessels may freely pass the north channel of the Tagus (known as the Corridor) in from 6 to 10 fathoms water, sand.

Directions.—Vessels bound for the River Tagus, coming from the north and passing Cape Roca, must, when nearing Guia Light, keep off the coast sufficiently to open out Cascaes Light, thus avoiding the rocks of Pombeira, Nau, and Ponta da Insua.

Vessels intending to anchor opposite Cascaes may do so with Cascaes and Guia Lighthouses in one, in from 7 to 10 fathoms water, sandy bottom.

PROVISIONAL ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF HIGHWAY DISTRICTS.

AT the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, holden for the North Riding of the County of York at Northallerton, in the said Riding, on Tuesday in the first whole week after the thirty-first day of March, to wit, the seventh day of April, in the thirty-first year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, before John Richard Westgarth Hildyard, Esquire (Chairman); The Right Honourable Thomas, Earl of Zetland; The Right Honourable William Henry

Lord Bolton; and others, their Fellows, Justices of our said Lady the Queen assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lady the Queen in the said Riding, and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespasses, and other Misdemeanors committed in the same Riding.

Whereas at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace holden at Northallerton aforesaid, in and for the said Riding, on the fifteenth day of October last a Final Order for dividing the said Riding into sixteen Highway Districts under the provisions of the Highway Acts, was made in manner and to the effect therein set forth.

And whereas notice in writing was given to the Clerk of the Peace of this Riding, under the hands of five of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace of this Riding, that at this General Quarter Sessions

of the Peace, it would be proposed to make the several alterations in the said Final Order, and in the Highway Districts therein named, which are hereinafter set forth.

And whereas the said Clerk of the Peace added the said notice to that required by law to be given, of the holding of these Sessions, and posted in a prepaid letter, the said notice to the churchwardens and overseers, of all the townships in the said Riding affected by such proposed alterations.

And whereas it appears to this Court expedient that such proposed alterations should forthwith be made :

Now, therefore, it is ordered by this Court that the said several alterations shall be made in the said Final Order, and in the Highway Districts therein named which are hereinafter set forth, that is to say :

In No. 2.—The Birdforth Highway District :

That the several townships of Sinderby and Sowerby shall be added to the said district, and that for each of the same townships shall be elected one waywarden as a member of the Highway Board of the Birdforth Highway District.

That the township of Morton shall be subtracted therefrom.

That Ampleforth shall be subtracted therefrom.

In No. 3.—The Bulmer East Highway District :

That the township of Crambe shall be subtracted therefrom.

In No. 4.—The Bulmer West Highway District :

That the township of Scackleton shall be subtracted therefrom.

In No. 5.—The Greta Bridge Highway District :

That the township of Barforth shall be added to the said district, and that for the same township shall be elected one waywarden as a member of the Highway Board of the Greta Bridge Highway District.

In No. 6.—The Richmond Highway District :

That the township of Barforth shall be subtracted from the said district.

That the township of Grinton shall be added to the said district, and that for the same township shall be elected one waywarden as a member of the Highway Board of the Richmond Highway District.

In No. 7.—The Hang East Highway District :

That the township of Rand shall be separated from Crakehall Great and Little, and that for the township of Rand one waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the Hang East Highway District.

In No. 8.—The Leyburn Highway District :

That the townships of Hauxwell East and West shall be separated, and that for each of the said two townships of East Hauxwell and West Hauxwell one waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the Leyburn Highway District.

That the several townships of Hutton Hang and Stainton shall be added to the said Leyburn Highway District, and that for each of the same two townships one waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the said Leyburn Highway District.

That the township of Grinton shall be subtracted from the said Leyburn Highway District.

In No. 12.—The Malton Highway District :

That the several townships of Brawby, Crambe, Hildenley, and Scackleton shall be added thereto, and that for each of the same four several townships one waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the said Malton Highway District.

In No. 13.—The Pickering Lythe East Highway District :

That Langdale End (not being a township maintaining its own poor, but a hamlet in the township of Wykeham), shall be included in the said township of Wykeham ; and that for the said last-mentioned township, including Langdale End therein, shall be elected only one Waywarden as a member of the Highway Board of the said Pickering Lythe East Highway District.

In No. 15.—The Ryedale Highway District :

That the several townships of Smilesworth and Morton shall be added thereto, and that for each of the same two townships one Waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the said Ryedale Highway District.

That the township of Brawby shall be subtracted therefrom.

In the Schedule of the said Final Order, "Ormesby" shall be subtracted from the First Column, and "Ormesby" and "Upsall" from the Second Column.

And it is further ordered—That the confirmation or otherwise of this Provisional Order shall be taken into consideration at the next Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, for this Riding, to be holden on the 30th day of June next.
