HEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixtythree, Her Majesty was pleased, under or by virtue of the provisions of "The Medical Act," by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to nominate and appoint Edmund Alexander Parkes, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, Professor in the Army Medical School, Netley, Richard Quain, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, of Harley-street, London, and Henry Wyldbore Rumsey, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, of Cheltenham, to be respectively members of "The General Council of "Medical Education and Registration of the "United Kingdom" for England and to re period. "United Kingdom," for England, and to re-nominate and re-appoint Robert Christison, Doctor of Medicine, Professor in the University of Edinburgh, to be a member of the said General Council for Scotland, and also to re-nominate and re-appoint William Stokes, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, Regius Professor in the University of Dublin, to be a member of the said General Council for Ireland: And whereas, under or by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, the said Edmund Alexander Parkes, Richard Quain, Henry Wyldbore Rumsey, Robert Christison, and William Stokes will, on the seventeenth November instant, respectively cease, by lapse of time, to be members of the said General Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth, under and by virtue of the provisions in that behalf contained in the said "Medical Act," nominate the said Edmund Alexander Parkes, Richard Quain, and Henry

Wyldbore Rumsey to be again, from and afthe said seventeenth November instant, respece tively members of the said General Council for England, the said Robert Christison to be again, from and after the same date, member of the said General Council for Scotland, and the said William Stokes to be again, from and after the same date, member of the said General Council for Ireland; the said several nominations to continue for the term of five years from the day aforesaid.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the nineteenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Marsden, in the parish of Almondbury, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Almondbury, and of the parish of Huddersfield, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of
