PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Rooms, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's appro-

bation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at these Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Washington, enclosing a copy of an Act recently passed by the Congress of the United States, for "regulating the duties on imported copper and copper ores."

By this Act, the duties hitherto levied on copper imported from foreign countries, have been raised to the following rates:—

	Cents.
All copper imported in the form of ores (per pound of fine copper contained therein)	3
All regulus of copper, and all black or coarse copper (per pound of fine copper contained therein)	4
All old copper, fit only for remanufacture, per pound	4
All copper in plates, bars, ingots, pigs, or other forms not manufactured, or herein enumerated, including sulphate of copper, or blue vitriol, per pound	5
Copper in rolled plates, called braziers, copper sheets, rods, pipes, and copper bottoms, eyelets, and all manufactures of copper, or of which copper shall be a component of chief value, not otherwise herein provided for, <i>ad valorem</i>	45%

Provided, that the increased duty imposed by this Act shall not apply to any of the articles therein enumerated, which shall have been in course of transit to the United States, and actually on shipboard on the 19th January, 1869.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, inclosing an order issued by the Finance Minister of the Provisional Government of Spain, on the 3rd March, 1869: extending to the ships of every nation the power—hitherto enjoyed under Articles 8 and 260 of the Customs Ordinances by Spanish vessels only—of going on to foreign ports with cargoes from foreign* America, and with cargoes of dried fish from the same ports with a Consular Register, under the same rates and formalities as are established by the aforesaid articles.

* NOTE.—By the term "Foreign America," is meant all parts of America not belonging to Spain.
