**T**HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to grant certain duties of customs and inland revenue, and to repeal and alter other duties of customs and inland revenue.

An Act for raising the sum of two million three hundred thousand pounds by Exchequer Bonds, for the service of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

An Act to remove doubts as to the qualification of persons holding civil service pensions, or re-

ceiving superannuation allowances, to sit in Parliament.

An Act to amend so much of the Act of the session of the sixth and seventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter thirty-five, as provides that Norfolk Island is to be part of the diocese of Tasmania.

An Act for the preservation of sea birds.

An Act to remove doubts as to the validity of certain statutes made by the Convocation of the University of Oxford.

An Act to amend the law relating to the payment of the expenses of Commissioners of Inquiry into corrupt practices at elections of Members to serve in Parliament.

An Act for amending the law relating to mining partnerships within the Stannaries of Devon and Cornwall, and to the Court of the Vice-Warden of the Stannaries.

An Act to amend the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act.

An Act to confirm a scheme under "The Metropolitan Commons Act, 1866."

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under "The Drainage and Improvement of Lands (Ireland) Act, 1863," and the Acts amending the same.

An Act for making provision for the execution of the London Coal and Wine Duties Continuance Act, 1868, as far as relates to the freeing from toll of the following bridges on the Thames, namely, Kew, Kingston-upon-Thames, Hampton Court, Walton-upon-Thames, and Staines, and Chingford Bridge and Tottenham Mills Bridges on the Lee; and for other purposes.

An Act to enable the West Ham Gas Company to increase their capital; and for other purposes with respect to the same Company.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Law passed by the Parliament of the North German Confederation, imposing a stamp tax on bills of exchange; which will come into force on the 1st January, 1870.

This stamp tax will be reckoned at the standard of 30 thalers, with the subdivision into 30 groschen per thaler, and will be imposed as follows, according to the amount of the bill:—

	Sgr.
For the sum of 50 thalers or less ...	1
"    50 to 100 thalers ...	1½
"    100 to 200 " ...	3
"    200 to 300 " ...	4½

and so on for each further sum of 100 thalers — 1½ silver groschen more, any portion of 100 thalers to be reckoned as a full 100.

The following are exempted from the stamp tax:—

1. Foreign bills drawn on foreign countries and only payable in foreign countries.
2. Home bills drawn on a foreign country, only payable in a foreign country and either at sight or at latest within ten days after the date of drawing, in the case where they are sent back direct to a foreign country by the drawer.

For the payment of the tax to the Federal Treasury, all persons who take part in the circulation of the bill of exchange within the territory of the Confederation are jointly liable.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, reporting that an Agricultural Exhibition will be held in that city from the 6th to the 10th

The Exhibition will comprise four principal divisions:—

1st. Animals, including horned cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, poultry, and fat prize animals for slaughtering.

2nd. Machines, farm implements, &c., used for purposes of agriculture, forest-work, fishing, and general husbandry.

3rd. Raw produce of agriculture, including that of forests, bees, fisheries, &c.

4th. Garden produce in general.

No candidate will be admitted who does not obtain at least two-thirds of the full number of marks in the two first-named subjects, and three-fifths of the full number, either for practical shipbuilding or marine engineering.

The last four subjects, although counting in the competition, will not be considered obligatory.

The candidates who may be selected will be treated, while attached to the school, in all respects as the Admiralty pupils; they will receive wages the same as dockyard apprentices, commencing at 1s. 6d. per day for six days per week for first year, and increasing yearly 3d. per day till it reaches 2s. per day; and in addition a subsistence allowance of 3s. per day for seven days per week while away from their homes, either at the school or in the dockyards.

Seven months of each year—viz., from October till May—will be devoted to study at the school, and the remaining five months to actual work and the acquirement of practical knowledge in the dockyards.
