THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Notification, published by the Russian Department of Medicine, in the "Official Messenger," stating the conditions on which Foreign Medicines can be imported into Russia.

The following are the conditions in question:

1. When no poisonous matter is contained therein (Art. 310 of the Medical Code, Vol. XIII of the "Corps des lois," edition 1857).

2. When the preparation thereof requires costly apparatus, or careful management, or skilfulness, such as can only be acquired by special and fre-

quent practise.

3. When it can be easily preserved, and is not liable to deterioration from being transported long distances.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Consul-General of Ecuador, a translation of a Decree, issued by the President of that Republic, on the 15th September last, of which the following are the Articles:-

ART. 1. That the charges denominated port dues, be suppressed; viz.:-those for tonnage, anchorage, cleaning, buoys, and lighthouses, with

the exception of those for pilotage.

The lighthouse dues will, however, be collected in the Port of Guayaquil after the lighthouse of Santa Clara has been changed; and in the other ports when the necessary lights shall have been placed in each.

ART. II. Upon the exportation of each quintal of caoutchouc or of bark (quina), a duty of two dollars will be levied, and of each quintal of

orchella weed, one of four reales.

ART. III. For the amortization of coin deficient in weight, an additional six per cent. will be charged on the amount of Import Duties, not including in these those of wharfage (piso), roads, educational establishments, or other special dues.

This duty will be levied from the month following the date on which the contract for the amortization of the before-mentioned light coin shall have been ratified with the "Bank of Ecuador;" the amount will be delivered monthly to the Managers of said Bank, and will cease when the debt proceeding from this amortization shall have been cancelled.

ART. IV. This Decree will take effect from the 1st October next.

# TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 96, for the regulation of the duties of postage, power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof, and from time to time, by Warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by another Act of Parliament passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 85, for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office.

And whereas it is expedient to alter and fix certain rates of postage on certain letters transmitted by the post between the United Kingdom and Norway, and to make certain regulations with regard thereto, in the manner bereinafter mentioned and contained.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us in and by the said hereinbefore recited Acts of Parliament respectively, and all and every or some or one of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided, order, declare, and direct as follows; that is to say:—

1. On every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight posted in the United Kingdom addressed to Norway, or posted in Norway addressed to the United Kingdom, transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and Norway direct by private ship there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of postage (British and foreign combined) of seven pence if prepaid and of nine pence if not prepaid.

2. And on every letter transmitted as is hereinbefore mentioned exceeding half an ounce in weight there shall be charged, taken, and paid progressive and additional rates of postage as

follows, that is to say:—

On every such letter exceeding half an ounce and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage:

On every such letter exceeding one ounce and not exceeding one ounce and the half of another ounce in weight, three rates of postage:

On every such letter exceeding one ounce and the half of another ounce and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage;

And for every half an ounce in weight of any such letter above the weight of two ounces, there shall be charged and taken one additional rate of postage, and in charging any additional rate of postage every fractional part of such additional half an ounce shall be charged as an additional half an ounce in weight, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant, if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

3. Nothing hereinbefore contained shall in anywise alter, prejudice, or affect the exemptions and privileges granted by the said firstly hereinbefore recited Act, nor in anywise prejudice or affect the privilege which seamen, soldiers, and others employed in Her Majesty's service, now by law enjoy of sending and receiving letters by the post subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same.

4. The several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said recited Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter 5. The rates of postage fixed by this present Warrant, on the letters transmitted as hereinbefore mentioned, shall be in lieu of those now chargeable thereon under a certain Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 5th day of June, 1868, and the same together with so much of the said last-mentioned Warrant as relates thereto, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, revoked, and annulled.

6. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, revoke, or modify any of the rates of postage hereby fixed or altered, or any of the regulations hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and may from time to time appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

Fixed Light in Lochandail.

THE Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses have given notice, that from the 15th day of November, 1869, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Dune point, Lochandail, Islay.

The light will be a fixed light, white between the bearings N.E. by E. to about N. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.; red from about N. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. to about W  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.; and white from about W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. to S.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W.; it will be elevated 50 feet above high water springs, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.
