"The Bankruptcy Act, 1869."

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Washington, enclosing the following further Proclamation, which has been issued by the President of the United States, relative to the abolition of discriminating duties between France and the United States:—

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Proclamation of the President of the United States of the 12th day of June last, the levying of discriminating duties on merchandize imported into the United States in French vessels from the countries of its origin was discontinued:

And whereas satisfactory information has since been received by me that the levying of such duties on all merchandize imported into France on vessels of the United States, whether from the countries of its origin or from other countries, has been discontinued:

Now, therefore, I, U. S. Grant, President of the United States of America, by virtue of the authority vested in me by an Act of Congress of the 7th day of January, 1824, and by an Act in addition thereto of the 24th of May, 1828, do hereby declare and proclaim that on and after this date, so long as merchandize imported into France in vessels of the United States, whether from the countries of its origin or from other countries, shall be admitted into the ports of France on the terms aforesaid, the discriminating duties heretofore levied upon merchandize imported into the United States in French vessels, either from the countries of its origin or from any other country, shall be, and are, discontinued and abolished.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my

hand and caused the Seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the City of Washington, this 20th day of November, in the year of our Lord 1869, and of the independence of the United States of America the ninety-fourth.

"METROPOLITAN PUBLIC CARRIAGE ACT, 1869."

THE following Order has been approved of by the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and will be made by him and be in force on and after the First day of January, 1870.

ORDER as to Licensing Hackney and Stage Carriages, as to Licensing Drivers of Hackney and Stage Carriages, and as to certain Regulations relating to Hackney and Stage Carriages, made in pursuance of "The Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869," 32 and 33 Vic. cap. 115, secs. 6, 8, 9, 10, and 11, by the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

I do order, prescribe, and direct as follows (that is to say):—

As to Licensing Hackney and Stage Carriages.

1. Licences to be granted for Hackney Carriages under the said Act shall be in the Form A contained in the Schedule to this Order, and Licences granted under the said Act for Stage Carriages shall be in the Form B contained in the same Schedule.

2. Licences to be granted under the said Act shall be granted by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, who has been appointed by me for that purpose; but no Licence shall be granted to any person under the age of 21 years, or to any person who shall have been previously convicted of felony.

3. Before any such Licence shall be granted, the person applying for the same shall pay to the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District, or to some person appointed by the said Receiver to receive the same, the sum of £2, which I hereby prescribe to be the sum and price to be paid in respect thereof. The application for a Hackney Carriage Licence shall be made in the Form C, and for a Stage Carriage Licence in the Form D, in the Schedules hereto.

4. Before any such Licence shall be granted, a Certificate is to be signed by an Inspector of Public Carriages, stating that the Hackney or Stage Carriage in respect of which the application is made has been examined by him, and that it is fit for public use, and specifying the number of persons which the carriage may be licensed to carry, and the number so specified shall be stated in the Licence.

5. Any Licence granted on the application of any Copartnership or Company shall be issued to the senior partner, or to the Secretary or Manager of the Company, as the case may be; and the senior partner, or the Secretary or Manager, to whom the Licence shall be issued, shall be responsible for the observance of the regulations hereby made, and of the conditions under which the Licence is granted, and shall be liable to all penalties for breaches of these regulations and the provisions of this Order as if they were the persons solely interested in the Carriage and in the Licence.

6. So soon as may be after the signing of the Certificate as to the fitness of any Carriage for public use, the Carriage shall be brought to the Police Station of the District, where a metal plate bearing the distinguishing number of such Carriage will be fixed, in the presence of an Inspector of Public Carriages, in the case of a four-wheeled Hackney Carriage, on the back panel thereof; in the case of a Hansom Carriage, on the off-side panel; and in the case of a Metropolitan Stage carriage, on the back thereof. And I hereby prescribe that each Carriage licensed shall be distinguished by such plate, and such plate shall not be removed from the place where it shall have been so fixed without the authority of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis.

7. A Licence will afterwards be prepared bearing the distinguishing number of the Carriage, and will be sent to the Proprietor.

8. Each Licence shall be issued in respect of one Carriage only, and shall distinguish the Carriage licensed by a Number.

9. Every Licence to be granted in pursuance of the said Act and this Order shall continue in force for one year from the date of such Licence, unless suspended or revoked; and the Licence shall be subject to revision or suspension for any period in any events in which any Hackney or Stage Carriage Licence might have been suspended or revoked at the time of the passing of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869; and in the event of any breach of the provisions of the said Act, or of this Order, or of any regulations made thereby, which provisions and regulations relate to Hackney or Stage Carriages and the Proprietors thereof; and also in the event of the Proprietor being convicted of any felony or misdemeanour. And I hereby order and prescribe it to be an express condition of the granting of any Hackney or Stage Carriage Licence under this Order, that any such Licence shall be subject to revision and suspension for any period by the Secretary of State for the Home Department, if at any time any Proprietor shall be convicted of any offence against the provisions of this Order, or of any Act for the time being in force relating to Hackney or Stage Carriages, or of any felony or misdemeanour.

10. The Proprietor of any Licensed Carriage shall, within three days after a notice shall have been delivered to him, either personally or left at the address mentioned in his Licence, or on the expiration of the period for which his Licence shall have been granted, within three days from such

expiration, deliver up his Licence to the Inspector of Public Carriages at the Police Station of the District within which the place of his address, as described in the 15th Clause hereof, shall be situate, and within the said period shall bring the Carriage to such Police Station named, in order that the Plate may be unfixed, and he shall then and there deliver up the Plate to the Inspector of Public Carriages.

11. The Proprietor of any Licensed Carriage shall at any time, when required by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, produce and show the Licence which shall have been granted to him in respect of such Carriage.

12. The Proprietor of any Licensed Carriage shall not conceal the Plate nor shall he obliterate or deface any number or mark thereon.

13. The proprietor of any Licensed Carriage shall not knowingly permit the same to be used for any illegal purpose.

14. Any Licence erased or defaced shall be void and of none effect.

15. The Proprietor of any Licensed Carriage, who shall during the currency of the Licence change his abode or place of residence, shall, within seven days from such change, give notice thereof to the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, and until such notice the address mentioned in the Licence, and after such notice the address mentioned in the Notice, shall be deemed to be the address of the Proprietor of the Licensed Carriage for all purposes, whether of service of notices, or otherwise.

16. During the currency of any Licence, and until it shall have been returned to the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, the Proprietor of any Carriage shall, at all reasonable times, allow to all persons appointed by the Secretary of State, or by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, for the purpose of inspecting Horses or Carriages, free access to their premises where such Horses and Carriages are kept, for the purpose of such inspection, on the production of a special order of the said Commissioner for that purpose.

17. In case of the death of any Proprietor during the continuance of his Licence, the Licence shall be brought to the Office of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, who will by endorsement thereon transfer the Licence to the person entitled thereto by Will, or to the person entitled to administer to the deceased Proprietor, or to the widow or surviving husband, or eldest male child (being of age) of the deceased Proprietor.

N.B.—The above provisions apply both to Hackney Carriages and Metropolitan Stage Carriages, and the word Carriage when used above (unless where otherwise specified) applies equally to both of these classes. The following provisions apply to Hackney Carriages only.

18. Every person desirous of applying for a Licence in respect of any Hackney Carriage, under the said Act and this Order, shall make and sign his application in the Form C contained in the Schedule hereto.

19. At any time during the currency of the Licence, the Proprietor of the licenced Carriage may alter the Fares mentioned in the Form of Application, but fourteen days' notice shall, previously to any such alteration, be given to the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis.

And with respect to "Regulations relating to Hackney and Stage Carriages, I do by this my Order make the following Regulations:—

As to Hackney Carriages only.

1. The number of persons to be carried in any Hackney Carriage shall be the Number mentioned in the Licence granted in respect of such Carriage.

2. Previous to the granting of any Licence for any Hackney Carriage, the Proprietor thereof shall cause to be distinctly painted, and shall thereafter keep distinctly painted, on the outside, at the back of each Carriage, the Number of persons to be carried, and no greater number of persons shall be carried than authorized by the Licence.

3. Every child shall be reckoned as a person within the meaning of the foregoing Regulations.

4. The Table of Distances signed by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis in pursuance of the 6th section of statute 16 & 17 Vic., c. 33, sec. 17, and now in force, shall, until further order, be evidence for the purpose of any fare to be charged by distance within the meaning of the 9th section of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869.

5. The Proprietor of every licensed Hackney Carriage shall provide and affix to the top of the Carriage, in a socket or by a hinge, as the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis shall direct, a metal flag, on which shall be distinctly painted in black letters on a white ground, or white letters on a black ground, the Fares licensed to be charged both for distance and time.

6. The Fares to be charged shall be the Fares mentioned in the written application for a Licence until they shall have been altered and notice of such alteration shall have been given, as above mentioned, and after the expiration of such notice, then the Fares mentioned in the Notice and such alteration of Fares are to be repainted on the Flag.

7. It shall not be lawful for any licensed Hackney Carriage to ply for hire except on an authorized public standing; and while the Carriage shall be there plying for hire, the flag shall be raised on the hinge or fixed in the socket so as to be plainly exhibited on the top of the Carriage.

8. Immediately on the Carriage being hired, the flag shall be lowered on the hinge or taken from the socket, and shall not be again raised on the hinge or placed in the socket, or otherwise exhibited, until the Carriage shall be again plying for hire on an authorized public standing.

9. No Hackney Carriage shall be let to hire elsewhere than on an authorized public standing, nor shall any Fare be recoverable in respect of any hiring unless at the time of the hiring the Carriage hired shall have been plying on an authorized public standing, with the flag raised and exhibited in pursuance of the Regulation 7, as above prescribed.

10. When the Carriage shall have been hired by distance, and the Carriage shall be stopped at the request of the hirer during the journey, for any time or times amounting in the whole to fifteen minutes, the driver shall be entitled, at the end of the journey, to demand and receive a further

sum, in addition to the Fare to which he shall be entitled for the journey calculated by distance equal to one-fourth part of the Fare exhibited on the metal flag as the Fare per hour, and to an additional sum equal to one such fourth part for every further fifteen minutes completed for which the Carriage shall have been stopped at the request of the hirer during the journey.

11. When the Carriage shall have been hired by the hour, the driver shall be entitled to demand, for every fifteen minutes or any part of fifteen minutes not completed above one hour, one-fourth of the Fare per hour exhibited on the metal plate.

12. And for the better publication of the Fares which the driver may demand from the hirer of any Hackney Carriage, the Proprietor of every Hackney Carriage shall provide for the driver, and the driver shall deliver to every person hiring the same on entering the same, a Ticket of the following form, on which shall be printed the owner's Name and address, the Number of the Carriage, and the Rates of Fares by time and distance, which the driver, according to these Regulations is entitled to demand from the hirer of the Carriage.

13. Every Licensed Carriage and all its furniture and appointments, and the harness used for the horse or horses drawing the same, shall be always kept in perfect order and repair.

And for securing the safe custody and re-delivery of any property accidentally left in Hackney and Metropolitan Stage Carriages, and fixing the Charges to be paid in respect thereof, and with reference to the sale of such property, and as to giving it to the finder in the event of its not being claimed within a certain time, I make the following regulations:—

1. Immediately after the termination of any hiring, the driver of any Hackney Carriage, and immediately after the completion of any journey, the conductor of any Metropolitan Stage Carriage, shall carefully search the Carriage for any property which may have been accidentally left therein, and any such article found on such search, or at any other time, by, or delivered to, any driver or conductor, or which may be found at any time by any other person shall, if not sooner claimed by the owner thereof, within twenty-four hours after such finding, be deposited in the state in which it shall be found at a Police Station within the Metropolitan Police District, but nothing in this Regulation is to be deemed or taken to repeal the 11th Section of the Statute 16 & 17 Vic., cap. 33.

2. All property found in Hackney or Stage Carriages, and deposited with the Police as aforesaid, and all property brought to any Police Station by any driver or conductor, under the Statute 16 & 17 Vic., cap. 33, sec. 11, if not claimed, and proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis to belong to the claimant, for three months after the property is so brought to or deposited at the Police Station, will, at the discretion of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, be either delivered to the person who shall have deposited the found property, or be sold.

3. If the property found shall not be delivered to the depositor, but shall be sold as aforesaid, a sum of money shall be awarded by the said Commissioner and paid to the person who shall have deposited the found property, on the following scale:—

If the article deposited be of less value than £10, for gold and silver money, bank notes, jewellery and watches, a sum equal to three shillings in the pound on the value of the article.

For all other articles, two shillings and sixpence in the pound.

But in no case shall any less sum be awarded than one shilling.

If the article deposited be of £10 value or upwards, then in every case such a sum shall be paid as the said Commissioner may in his discretion specially award.

4. If the property which shall have been so deposited, shall be claimed before the expiration of the said period of three months, the same shall be re-delivered to the claimant, if he shall prove to

the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis that he has a right to the re-delivery thereof, on payment by the claimant of all expenses incurred, and of such a reasonable sum to the driver, conductor, or other depositor, as the Commissioner shall award.

And with reference to Metropolitan Stage Carriages, I make the following Regulations:—

1. No printed or written bill shall be affixed on any part of the outside of any licensed Metropolitan Stage Carriage, except to designate the destination of such Carriage; nor shall any printed or written bill be fastened or placed against the inside of the windows of any such carriage.

2. Every licensed Metropolitan Stage Carriage and all its furniture and appointments, and the harness of the horses drawing the same, shall always be kept in perfect order and repair.

And with regard to Licensing Drivers of Hackney Carriages, and the Drivers and Conductors of Stage Carriages, I do by this my Order, direct, and prescribe as follows:—

1. All Licences which a Secretary of State may grant to drivers of Hackney Carriages, and to the drivers and conductors Metropolitan Stage Carriages, shall be granted by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, who has been appointed by me for that purpose.

2. All Licences so granted to the drivers of Hackney Carriages, and to the drivers and conductors of Metropolitan Stage Carriages, shall be respectively in the forms marked E, F, G, in the Schedule to this Order, and all the provisions of the Acts relating to Hackney Carriages, and Metropolitan Stage Carriages, and Police Regulations now in force with respect to the application for the granting of and generally as to Licences granted under these Acts, or any of them, shall, save as the same are varied by this Order, or are inconsistent therewith, or with the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, apply to Licences granted under the said last-mentioned Act, and this my Order.

3. Licences granted under the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, and this my Order, shall be granted on and after the 1st day of January, 1870, and if not revoked or suspended, be in force for one year from the date thereof; and there shall be paid in respect thereof to the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District, or to such person as he shall appoint, before any Licence shall be granted, the sum of Three Shillings for every licence granted before the 1st day of February, 1870, and Five Shillings for every licence granted on and after that day, and I hereby prescribe the said sums of Three Shillings and Five Shillings to be the sums respectively payable for every Licence.

4. Any Licence granted under this Order to any driver or conductor shall be subject to revocation or suspension for any period of time by any Justice of the Peace in any of the events in which any Licence granted to any driver or conductor in pursuance of any Act of Parliament might, at the passing of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, be revoked or suspended; and also in the event of any breach of this Order or the provisions thereof, or the Regulations thereby made, or of the provisions of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869. And further, I do Order and hereby prescribe it to be an express condition of the granting of any Licence under this Order to any driver or conductor, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department shall have power to revoke, or for any period suspend any Licence granted under this Order, if at any time any driver or conductor shall be convicted of any offence against or breach of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, or this Order, or the provisions thereof, or of any Regulations thereby made, or of any offence upon conviction whereof before any Justice or Justices of the Peace the said Justice or Justices had power at the time of the passing of the said Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, to suspend or revoke any Licence held by any driver or conductor.

And lastly, I do hereby annex a penalty, not exceeding Forty Shillings, for the breach of this Order, or of any Provision thereof, or of any Regulation hereby directed, save only in those cases where a penalty may lawfully be imposed for any offence under the provisions of any other Act of Parliament now in force.
