THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the part of the Port of Hull, in the East-Riding of the county of York, within which

foreign cattle may be landed for slaughter, as follows:—

All that space forming part of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull, lying within a line commencing at the south-western end of the street called Bath-place, and running northward to and along the west side of Cogan-street, as far as Edward's-place, thence eastward along the southern side of Edward's-place to Commercial-road, thence northward along the west side of Commercial-road to Myton-place, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Myton-place, and along the north side of Castle-street, to the point where Castle-street is joined by Railway-street, thence northward and eastward, along the western and northern side of the Quays of the Prince's Dock, to the eastern end of St. John-street, thence across St. John-street, northward and eastward, along the western and northern boundaries of the Quays of the Queen's Dock, to the water called Old Harbour, at a point twenty-five yards to the north of the centre of the entrance to the Queen's Dock Basin, thence in a southerly direction along the west side of the water called Old Harbour, to the point where the Old Harbour joins the River Humber, thence westward for a distance of two hundred and thirty yards, in the line of and along the southern side of the Ferry Boat Pier, and the East Pier to the western end of the East Pier, thence straight in a north-westerly direction to a point on the southern side of Wellington-street, eighty-seven yards to the west of the centre of the entrance lock of the Humber Dock, thence westward along the south side of Wellington-street, for a distance of three hundred and five yards, and further westward in a straight line, to the south-western end of the street called Bath-place aforesaid, which space is coloured green on the plan of Kingston-upon-Hull, deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull:

And do hereby prescribe as follows:—

1. Foreign cattle landed within the said landing-place may, under such regulations as the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs from time to time prescribe, be re-shipped therefrom and conveyed by vessel direct to the Port of Goole.

2. Provided that all cattle so re-shipped shall continue to be deemed foreign cattle.

Advertisement.

1. The Government of India, after communication with various Agricultural and Horticultural Societies in India, and with persons interested in the subject, has arrived at the conclusion that the only real obstacle to the development of an extensive trade in the fibre of Rheea, or China-grass, is the want of suitable machinery for separating the fibre and bark from the stem, and the fibre from the bark, the cost of effecting such separation by manual labour being great.

2. The demand for the fibre is now large, and no doubt might be extended with reduced prices, and there is a practically unlimited extent of country in India where the plant could be grown.

3. The requirements of the case appear to be some machinery or process capable of producing, with the aid of animal, water, or steam power, a ton of fibre of a quality which shall average in value not less than £50 per ton in the English market, at a total cost, all processes of manufacture and allowance for wear and tear included, of not more than £15 per ton. The said processes are to be understood to include all the operations performed, after the cutting and transport of the plant to the place of manufacture, to the completion of the manufacture of the fibre of the quality above described.
