The Letters we have teceived finee our laft from Cologue give an account, That the great Chapter of thar City proceeded on Monday laft to the Election of an Archbifhop; That of the 24 Canons that have Voices, 13 were for the Cardinal of Farftemberg, 9 for Prince Clement of Bavaria, one for the Prince of Neubourg, and one for the Count of Rechim; That the Cardinal pretending to be duly chofen, as having the Majority, was afterwards proclaimed Archbifhop of Cologne in the Quire of the Metropolitical Church; Againft which those that were for Prince Clement made a formal Protettation, alledging, That the Cardinal, as being Bifhop of Strasburg, could not, without the Popes Diffenfation; be chofen but by Poftulation, which required two thirds of the Electors to be for him, and that it was fufficient for the Election of any other to have 9, in cafe the Voices were divided between two; but if they were divided among feveral, it was neceffary that he that was poftulated fhould have double the number that any other had; So that Prince Clement having 9 Voices, and the Cardinal but 13, he was by vertue of his Holinefs Difpenfariori duly Elected. And that accordingly the next Day the Election of Prince Clement was likewile proclaimed by thofe of his Party; And a Publick Rejoycing was made by the Envoy of Bavtaria on that Occalion.
