REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations

shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, enclosing a translation of a Decree of the Spanish authorities relative to vessels which undergo quarantine in Spanish ports.

An extract from the translation is subjoined:—

(Translation).

SIR,—With reference to your proposal of this date, and considering that many captains of foreign ships, taking advantage of the convenient geographical situation of our lazarets at San Simon, Tambo, Mahon, and Santander, prefer passing their quarantine in one of them instead of passing it in the countries to which they are bound, and so by their contributions to the support of the above-mentioned establishments are of considerable importance to the Treasury.

The President of the Executive of the Republic has decided:

1. That vessels putting into the lazarets with the sole object of purging their quarantine, shall be considered as doing so under "relâche forcée," and shall as such come under the Customs' Regulations and Decree of May 30 of last year, provided that their documents are in perfect order for admission into the foreign country to which they are bound, and that they measure at least 80 metric tons if laden with tobacco, textile goods, or any colonial produce enumerated in Art. 4 of the above-mentioned Decree of the 30th May, but that in case all and each of these conditions are not fulfilled they shall remain subject to the general laws.

By order of the President I communicate this to you for your information and guidance.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 60.)—CHANNEL ISLANDS—JERSEY.

Fixed Light on La Corbière Rock.

The Committee of Piers and Harbours of the States of Jersey have given notice, that from the 1st day of June, 1874, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on La Corbière Rock, at the south-west point of Jersey.

From seaward, between the bearings of S. by E., through East to N. by W., the light is a *fixed* white light. Inshore of the eastern limits of the white light two sectors of *red* light will be exhibited: one to the north-eastward for marking the shoal ground of the Rigdon Bank and thence to the land; the other to the south-eastward for marking Les Vrachères and the adjacent dangers between it and the shore. The light is elevated 119 feet above the level of high water spring tides, and in clear weather the white light should be seen from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric (or by lenses), of the second order.

The lighthouse is 62 feet high, and is situated on La Corbière Rock. Position, lat. 49° 10' 40" N., long. 2° 14' 50" W.

During fogs a bell will be sounded *three times* in quick succession at intervals of *thirty seconds*.

NOTE.—Mariners must exercise caution when navigating within the limits of the red light.
