*Sambro Island Fog Signal:*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that a steam fog whistle has been established on the southern part of Sambro Island, in place of the guns formerly used, near the entrance to Halifax Harbour.

The whistle is elevated 90 feet above high water, and in thick or foggy weather, and snow storms, is sounded as follows:—

A blast of *ten seconds* duration in each minute, with an interval of *fifty seconds* between each blast.

The fog whistle was put into operation on the 16th day of October, 1876, and since that date the guns formerly fired during thick and foggy weather have been discontinued..
