may be, the representatives of an archdeacon) who has resigned or otherwise avoided his archdeaconry on any day of the year other than the first of January, and the archdeacon who shall next thereafter be instituted to the same archdeaconry; and provided further that every such yearly payment as aforesaid shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the archdeacon who is (or whose representatives are) to receive it, has during the previous twelvementh complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing hereafter to your Majesty in Council any other matter or thing relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parlia-

ment.

7 HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirtyseven, sections six and eight have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the parish of Letcombe Regis in the county of Berks, and now

vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain indenture bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and made or expressed to be made between Edwin Newman of Yeovil in the county of Somerset Esquire of the first part, John Goodden of Compton House in the parish of Over Compton in the county of Dorset Esquire of the second part, Thomas Clutterbuck of Warkworth in the county of Northumberland Esquire, of the third part, Charles Smith of No. 127 High Holborn in the county of Middlesex Esquire, of the fourth part, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the fifth part certain land situate in the said parish of Letcombe Regis, and particularly described in the first schedule annexed to the said indenture comprising one rood and thirty-one perches, and numbered as part 144 on the plan delineated on the said indenture became with its appurtenances, and is now, vested in us.
"And whereas the said land is not subject to

any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but is now in our possession, but some portion thereof, on account of its character and situation is unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceed-

ings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said land or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly, that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such land or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorised and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of, and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said land so vested in us as aforesaid, with its appurtenances, all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and
