THE Earl of Derby, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Consul at Galatz, the following translation of a Notice issued by the Captain of the Port, notifying the reopening of the Navigation of the Danube:—

(Translation.)

*The Captain of the Port, Galatz, Roumania.*

NOTICE.

IN conformity with an Order of the Minister for Foreign Affairs, No. 2476, received this day, the Captain of the Port informs persons interested in shipping that, in consequence of the cessation of hostilities and of the conclusion of peace, the navigation of the Danube is free, as under ordinary circumstances, at the same time he brings to the notice of shipowners, that as torpedoes have not been removed from certain localities, navigation will be at their own risk and peril.

The Minister has taken measures for the early removal of these torpedoes.

DESPATCHES and their Enclosures, of which the following are copies, have been received by the Secretary of State for War from the General Officer Commanding the Troops in South Africa:—

*King Williamstown,*

*February 13, 1878.*

SIR,

1. THE forces under my command have again been successful in the Transkei.

2. The battle of Quintana, fought on the 7th February—a full report of which I have now the honour to enclose—has proved the most disastrous to the enemy of any yet fought in South Africa. Colonel Eustace, late Resident with Krel, states that the Gcalekas acknowledge to severer losses at Quintana than at any previous action.

3. The bodies of nearly 200 of the enemy found in front of and about the position, and more than an equal number afterwards discovered in the neighbouring kloofs and ravines, speak clearly of their losses; while the wounded, who were carried out of the action, attest the severity of their punishment.

4. I have the honour to refer you to Enclosure A, from Colonel Glyn, Commanding in the Transkei, reporting as to the steps he took in the formation of the column which he placed under the command of Captain Upcher, 1-24 Regiment. I am of opinion that great credit is due to Colonel Glyn for the selection of the position it held, and his formation of the force.

5. With the concurrence of the Right Honourable Sir Bartle Frere, I had directed an entrenchment to be formed near Quintana Mountain. Its position had been selected, and the entrenchment commenced under the able superintendence of Captain Nixon, R.E.

6. It was known that Krel and Sandilli were close by, in force; but it was difficult to judge which of the positions, Quintana or Ibeka, the enemy would attack, though the dispositions made by Colonel Glyn were so good as equally to ensure success at either. The Artillery, under Captain Robinson, R.A. [vide D], were placed midway at Tutura, and he was able to assist at the termination of the action.

7. In the Enclosure B, you will find a full account of the action by Captain Upcher, who commanded, and I beg especially to call your attention to the manœuvre as described in paragraph 5, viz.: "Both these Officers had orders to fire and then retire, to bring the enemy within range of the camp. These orders were carried out most satisfactorily." The value of this manœuvre cannot be over-estimated; as the best mode of warfare with the Kaffirs is to allow them to appear to gain, at first, some advantage in the attack, merely to lure them on to their destruction.

9. It will be seen how skilfully the 9-pounder gun was worked under Sub-Inspector Cochran, Frontier Armed and Mounted Police; and the 7-pounder, in charge of the Cape Town Volunteer Artillery, ably directed by Sergeant Breda. This latter force relieved, only a week before the action, a portion of the same corps which had distinguished itself, under Lieutenant Stigant, at Umzinzana.

10. The Naval Brigade, under Lieutenant Hamilton, Royal Navy, (Her Majesty's ship

"Active"). with the 24lb. rockets, to quote the words of the despatch, "did great service."

11. I am gratified to see that every prominence was given to such of the Colonial forces as were in the action, and they well performed their duty—doing, in every instance, credit to the Colony.

12. I beg to call your attention to the enclosure C, detailing the movements of the cavalry, and a force commanded by Captain Grenfell, A.D.C., Acting Staff Officer in the Transkei, who appears to have successfully conducted the operations entrusted to him by Captain Upcher. The Frontier Light Horse, attached to this force, commanded by Lieutenant Carrington, 1-24th Regiment, proved most valuable, exactly at the moment when their services were required. They appear to have been led into action with that spirit and energy which is characteristic of that Officer. The Frontier Armed and Mounted Police, under Sub-Inspector Holden—especially a portion under Sub-Inspector Hatton—are reported by Captain Grenfell to have "held their position with determination."

13. The high state of drill and discipline, and the admirable instruction of the 1-24th Regiment, bids me endorse the sentiments of Captain Upcher regarding the excellence of their skirmishing, thereby inflicting great loss on the enemy.

14. The Transport, Commissariat, and Medical arrangements were such as could be desired. Dr. Hall showed readiness and ability in the discharge of his duties to the wounded.

15. The native levies proved their usefulness by the rapidity with which they followed up the flying enemy, causing them fearful loss. They were commanded by Veldtman, a Fingoe Chief, whose services have continually proved valuable in the war.

16. I conclude by calling your special attention to the services of Colonel Glyn, commanding in the Transkei.

17. To Captain Upcher my best thanks are due for the excellent way in which he handled his force, and the perfect success he obtained. He has been commanding a column for some time in the Transkei, both in the operations towards the Bashee River, and the subsequent action of Newmaka, and also near the Kei River; and I have received most favourable reports of his intelligence, zeal, and ability. Captain Upcher deserves your best consideration.

Captain Grenfell is mentioned as having "behaved with great gallantry" in command of the force placed under him. This is the second occasion on which he has distinguished himself by good service in this war.

Lieutenant Carrington has shown great zeal and energy, not only by his distinguished example to his men on this occasion, but by the good service he has rendered on three former occasions in raising forces for service at the Diamond Fields, in the Transvaal, and in the Cape Colony.

18. It is satisfactory to me to have to report upon the distinguished conduct of the troops generally, both Her Majesty's Troops and Naval Brigade, and the Colonial forces, under my command. Their readiness in action, willingness to accept privation, and the rapidity with which they took up the positions entrusted to their care, have called for my constant approbation.

From Colonel Glyn, Commanding Forces, Transkei, to Deputy Adjutant General, King Williamstown.

Sir,

Ibeka, February 12, 1878.

1. I HAVE much pleasure in reporting for His Excellency the General's information that another success has been gained by the troops under my command.

2. Having received information that a large force of the enemy, about 4,000 or 5,000 men, were advancing from the Quora River towards the Kobinaba River and Kei River, I reinforced the column at Quintana under Captain Upcher, with Carrington's Frontier Light Horse, and the Capetown Volunteer Artillery with 7-pounder gun.

3. These Corps had only joined me a few days previously, and I am glad to report that their services during the engagement were invaluable.

4. I also heard that another force was to attack the Ibeka for the purpose of obtaining ammunition and stores.

5. Thinking that this might be an invention to prevent further reinforcements being sent down,

6. I arranged a column, strength as per margin,\* commanded by Captain Robinson, R.A., and moved them to Tutura, a Mission Station half-way between this and the Quintana, to be in readiness to reinforce either post in case of an attack.

7. By this arrangement Captain Robinson was enabled to come up with Captain Upcher's column in time to be of some use.†

8. The column at Quintana was attacked on the morning of the 7th by the combined forces of Kreli and Sandilli, the Gcaleka and Gaika chiefs, numbering from 4,000 to 5,000 men.

9. From the Despatches herewith enclosed, marked A and B,‡ it appears to have been a very sharp engagement, in which every one behaved admirably.

10. Captain Upcher's disposal of his force was excellent, and the smartness with which he conducted the pursuit of the retreating enemy caused them great loss.

11. I attach the Medical Report of killed and wounded, and considering the number of the enemy engaged, the casualties on our side are very few.§

12. The wounded are all doing well.

13. Xoxo, with some of Mapassa's tribe, endeavoured to show his loyalty by joining in the action and doing good service.

14. The result of my operations on the Kei has been effectually to prevent the enemy from crossing in any force into the Colony, and to force them into Gcalekaland, where, provided they meet with no success, they must shortly be subdued by starvation.

From Captain Upcher, 1-24th Regiment, Commanding Column\* near Quintana, to Colonel Glyn, Commanding Transkei Field Force.

SIR, Quintana, February 8, 1878.

I HAVE the honour to inform you that yesterday it was reported to me by Captain Veldtman, at about 5.30 A.M., that the Kaffirs were advancing on the camp.

2. We were aware that a very large force of the enemy was concentrating in our front, and had made every preparation to meet them.

3. I immediately struck tents. The men (who had been previously told off to their places) manned the shelter trenches, which I had constructed on the lines laid down for the proposed fort. Captain Rainforth's company were sent out in skirmishing order, and lined a small hill on our right front. Carrington's Light Horse patrolled to the north to observe the enemy; both these officers had orders to fire and retire, to bring the enemy within range of the camp; these orders were carried out most satisfactorily.

4. The Kaffirs advanced at first in two divisions from south and west. The number that appeared in these directions was, in my opinion, fully 1,500 (one thousand five hundred) men.

5. At 1,200 yards, I directed Lieutenant Cochrane, Frontier Armed and Mounted Police Artillery, to fire with the 9-pounder gun, and soon afterwards the 7-pounder gun, well worked by the Cape Town Artillery Volunteers, and the Naval Brigade Rocket tube, under Lieutenant Hamilton, R.N., were brought into action.

6. In spite of the heavy fire from these guns the Kaffirs continued their advance with great determination on our front and left flank. When they arrived within about 900 yards of us they came under the fire of our rifles; on the left flank they came within about 400 yards, being constantly reinforced by Kaffirs coming over the hill in rear.

7. The Fingoes were placed under cover on our right and left flank. Veldtman on our left, Smith Poswa on our right flank, both having orders to pursue directly the enemy was broken.

8. After about twenty minutes' heavy firing, the enemy gave way on both sides. Captain Veldtman chased the Kaffirs on our left, following them up to the Kolora, not getting back here till after mid-day, having killed 54.

9. The Frontier Light Horse, under Commandant Carrington, dashed out, and, charging the enemy in front, broke them up and drove them into the Nyameni. This charge was most brilliantly executed.

10. Several of the enemy, still hovering about our left rear, were driven off by Sub-Inspectors Holden and Springer, and Frontier Armed Mounted Police, mounted and dismounted.

11. The Frontier Light Horse having returned to camp the men were about to commence breakfast, when a strong division of Kaffirs approached on our right flank.

12. Some Frontier Armed and Mounted Police, under Sub-Inspector Hatton, the Frontier Light Horse, and about 50 men of 1-24th Regiment, under Lieutenant Atkinson, were sent to intercept this party, under Captain Grenfell, whose report I attach.

13. A large body of Kaffirs was coming up a small wooded kloof on our right front. I left the camp under Sub-Inspector Holden and a sufficient force, and took out the Naval Brigade, and one Company of the 1-24th Regiment under Lieutenant Anstey, and Smith Poswa's Fingoes, and drove back the enemy with heavy loss, clearing the kloof in about one hour.

14. By 10.30 A.M. the enemy had retreated out of range, and were assembling in hundreds on the conical hill, on our right front. I ordered the pursuit to cease, and returned to camp.

15. I then sent out the 9-pounder gun, under Sub-Inspector Cochrane, Frontier Armed and Mounted Police Artillery, with the men previously left in camp, as escort. He took up a good position, and worked his gun well, shelling the hill occupied by the enemy, who fled in the direction of the Tala Bush.

16. I have much pleasure in testifying to the admirable conduct of all branches of the service under my command.

17. The 24th skirmished with great steadiness and rapidity, making the best use of cover while advancing under fire, to which fact I attribute the small loss on our side.

18. The Naval Brigade, under Lieutenant Hamilton, Royal Navy, both in working the rockets and driving the enemy out of the kloof, did great service.

19. The Frontier Armed and Mounted Police, commanded by Sub-Inspector Holden, and the Frontier Armed and Mounted Police Artillery, under Sub-Inspector Cochrane, behaved admirably: the 9-pounder was excellently laid by Sergeant Baker, Frontier Armed and Mounted Police Artillery.

20. The Cape Town Artillery Volunteers, with 7-pounder gun, under Sergeant Breda, behaved with great steadiness in action; the gun was well laid and capitally served by the men.

21. The Frontier Light Horse, under Commandant Carrington, behaved most brilliantly, charging right into the enemy, engaging them at close quarters, and effectually preventing them from re-forming. They were grandly led by their commandant.

22. My special thanks are due to Captain Grenfell, A.D.C., who behaved with great gallantry, and commanded the party sent against the right attacking force of the enemy.

23. I enclose a report from Captain Robinson, Royal Artillery, who made every effort to reach the scene of action, and dispersed a body of men on our right.

24. Surgeon Hall was most attentive, and rendered every assistance to the wounded.

25. Captain Veldtman, in pursuit, rendered great service, and Smith Poswa's Fingoes fought well.

26. The loss of the enemy has been severe, 186 bodies reported counted; but many having

fallen in the long grass and kloofs, I consider over 200 must have fallen.

Casualties on per return appended:—2 Fingoes killed; 1 European severely wounded (Carrington's Horse), 1 European slightly (Carrington's Horse); 7 Fingoes wounded.

SIR,

1. IN accordance with your request, I took command of the force sent to meet the Kaffirs, who attacked on the right of our position.

2. On arriving at the high ground above the kloof, I found Sub-Inspector Hatton and his men of F.A.M.P. hard pressed by a strong body of the enemy, but he and his men held their position with great determination, until reinforced by a troop of Frontier Light Horse under Captain Whalley; the enemy being at one time so close, that one man received an assegai through his clothes.

3. The Frontier Armed and Mounted Police and Frontier Light Horse then attacked the enemy and drove them back.

4. At this time Lieutenant Atkinson and his company was engaged with some Kaffirs, who were retreating along the ridge. I requested him to face his company about and support the police, which he did, charging past under a smart fire.

5. When the attack on the right was made, Commandant Carrington and his Light Horse were engaged with a large body of Kaffirs, who came out of the kloof on the left and tried to out-flank them. He charged with great gallantry close up to the Kaffirs and drove them back again, doing great execution. Here, I regret to say, he had two men wounded, one horse killed, and three wounded—one since shot—his own horse being wounded in the jaw.

6. Captain Rainforth now joined me with his Company, and we pursued the enemy down the ridge the 24th skirmishing in centre, the cavalry on each flank, and Fingoes on the edge of the kloof; in this kloof 60 of the enemy lie dead.

7. I left some Police and Fingoes at the head of the kloof, and proceeded along the neck of the ridge until reaching the end, where we observed the natives swarming up the conical hill in front; but being now out of rifle range, I sounded the retire, and leaving a strong body of Fingoes to watch the enemy and report, I returned to camp.

Mr. Mulroy, Fingoe leader, behaved very well, and was most useful, charging the Kaffirs with his Fingoes, and heading them in the pursuit.

Camp on Tala Ridge, Quintana,

SIR, February 9, 1878.

I HAVE the honour to report that, in accordance with Colonel Glyn's order, I marched a

detachment as per margin,\* to Tutura, on the evening of the 6th instant.

At 6.40 A.M., on the 7th, I received your message that your camp was attacked, and marched off without delay to reinforce, leaving 35 men with the wagons to follow up.

When we arrived within three miles of your camp it was evident that the attack had been beaten off, and that you were operating in the Nyamani Valley. I determined that assistance could be best rendered to you by taking the detachment down the Tala ridge. The advanced guard reporting that a body of the enemy were collecting behind a ridge, apparently with the intention of making an attack on your flank, I advanced Carrington's Horse and my two guns at a gallop to within range, and opened fire at 8.30 A.M. Two shells caused the enemy to retire, and two more sent them flying, leaving many blankets behind. The infantry then came up, and we followed for more than a mile, but with so small a force, I did not consider it prudent to proceed into the Tala bush.

The marching of the 24th Regiment and Puelleine's Rangers was excellent, 7 miles in an hour and a-half and not a straggler.

The Detachment of Carrington's Horse was always in the right place at the right time.

I am much indebted to Lieutenant Morshead, 24th Regiment, of Colonel Glyn's Staff, who rendered me great assistance.
