TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

#### By Her Majesty's Command,

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The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levce, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intima-tion from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations passing of the said Act by the Legislature of

should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

HEREAS by section 18 of "The Extradi-

any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession; Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either-

- Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such Foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer :
- Or direct that such law or ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by an Act enacted by the Legislature of Victoria, the short title of which is, "The Extradition Act of Victoria, 1877," it is provided that "all powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive Criminals in the United Kingdom under 'The Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873,' are thereby vested in and may

in the Colony be exercised and done by any Police Magistrate in relation to the Surrender of Fugitive Criminals under the said Acts :"

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the said Act shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that the said Act shall have effect within the Colony as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870," but that the said Act shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the Colony.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of "The Extradition Act, 1870," and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Conncil, direct that the said Act shall have effect in the Colony of Victoria, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870."

And the Right Honourable Sir M. E. Hicks-Beach, Bart, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretarics of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Session of Parliament holden in W the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An "Act for amending the Law relating to the Extradition of Criminals," and also by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the thirty-sixth and thirty-seventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the Extradition Act, 1870," it was amongst other things enacted, that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by. Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to sach conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient :

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight, hundred and seventy-six, between Her Majesty and the President of the French Republic, for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following :--

HER Majesty the Qucen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the President of the French Republic, having recogcnized the insufficiency of the provisions of the Treaty concluded on the 13th of February, 1843, between Great Britain and France for the reciprocal extradition of criminals, have resolved, by common accord, to replace it by another and more complete Treaty, and have named as their respective Plenipotentiarics for this purpose, that is to say :-

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honourable Richard Bickerton Pemell Lord Lyons, a Peer of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, one of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and Her said Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Government of the French Republic, &c., &c., &c.;

And the President of the French Republic, M. le Duc Decazes, Member of the Chamber of Deputies, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Grand Officer of the National Order of the Legion of Honour, &c., &c., &c. ;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers (found in good and

#### ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who are being proceeded against or who have been convicted of a crime committed in the territory of the one Party, and who shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

#### ARTICLE II.

Native-born or naturalized subjects of either country are excepted from extradition. In the case, however, of a person who, since the commission of the crime or offence of which he is accused, or for which he has been convicted, has become naturalized in the country whence the surrender is sought, such naturalization shall not prevent the pursuit, arrest and extradition of such person, in conformity with the stipulations of the present Treaty.

#### ARTICLE III.

The crimes for which the extradition is to be granted are the following :

1. Counterfeiting or altering money, and uttering counterfeit or altered money.

2. Forgery, counterfeiting or altering and uttering what is forged, counterfeited or altered.

3. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide and poisoning) or attempt to murder. 4. Manslaughter.

5. Abortion. 6. Rupe.

7. Indecent assault, acts of indecency even without violence upon the person of a girl under 12 years of age.

8. Child-stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.

9. Abduction.

10. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.

11. Bigamy.

12. Wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.

13. Assaulting a Magistrate, or peace or public officer.

14. Threats by letter or otherwise with intent to extort.

15. Perjury or subornation of perjury.

16. Arson.

17. Burglary or house-breaking, robbery with violence.

18. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member, or public officer of any Company made criminal by any Act for the time being in force.

, 19. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences, including receiving any chattel, money, valuable security, or other pro-perty, knowing the same to have been unlawfully obtained.

#### ARTICLE I.

Les Hautes Parties Contractantes s'engagent à. se livrer réciproquement les individus poursuivis ou condamnés pour un crime commis sur le territoire de l'autre dans les circonstances et sous les. conditions prévues par le présent Traité.

#### . ARTICLE II.

Les nationaux respectifs, soit d'origine, soit par l'effet de la naturalisation, sont exceptés de l'extradition ; toutefois, s'il s'agit d'une personne qui,. depuis le crime ou le délit dont elle est accusée ou pour lequel elle a été condamnée, aurait obtenu la naturalisation dans le pays requis, cette circonstance n'empêchera pas la recherche, l'arrestation. et l'extradition de cette personne, conformément aux stipulations du présent Traité.

#### ARTICLE III.

Les crimes et délits pour lesquels il y aura lieur à extradition sont les suivants :-

1. Contrelaçon ou altération de monnaies contrefaites ou alterées.

2. Faux ou usage de pièces fausses; contrefaçon des sceaux de l'Etat, poinçons, timbres etmarques publics, ou usage des dits sceaux, poinçons, timbres et marques publics contrefaits.

3. Meurtre (assassinat, parricide, infanticide, empoisonnement), ou tentative de meurtre.

4. Coups et blessures volontaires ayant occasionné la mort, sans intention de la donner ; homicide par imprudence, négligence, maladresse, inobservation des règlements.

5. Avortement. 6. Viol.

7. Attentat à la pudeur avec violence ; attentat à la pudeur même sans violence sur la personned'une fille âgée de moins de 12 ans.

8. Vol, abandon, exposition ou séquestration. illégale d'un enfant.

9. Enlèvement d'un mineur au-dessous de 14ans, ou d'une fille au dessous de 16 ans.

10. Séquestration ou détention illégale.

11. Bigamie.

12. Actes de violence ou sévices ayant causé des blessures graves.

13. Violences contre les magistrats et officiers publics dans l'exercice de leurs fonctions.

14. Menaces écrites ou verbales faites en vued'extorquer de l'argent ou des valeurs.

15. Faux témoignage, subornation de témoins. d'experts ou d'interprêtes.

16. Incendie volontaire.

17. Vols avec violence, effraction, escalade our au moyen de fausses clefs.

18. Abus de confiance ou détournement par unbanquier, commissionnaire, administrateur, tuteur, curateur, liquidateur, syndic, officier ministériel, directeur, membre ou employé d'une société, ou par toute autre personne.

19. Escroquerie: ou recel frauduleux d'argent, valeurs ou objets mobiliers provenant d'une escroquerie. Publications faites de mauvaise foi, comptes rendus écrits ou imprimés mensongers faits dans le but de tromper les actionnaires d'unesociété, de provequer des souscriptions ou de déterminer des tiers à prêter de l'argent à la. société.

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20. Embezzlement or larceny, including receiving any chattel, money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been embezzled or stolen.

21. Crimes against Bankruptcy Law.

22. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger persons in a railway train.

23. Malicious injury to property, if the offence is indictable.

24. Crimes committed at sea :-

(a) Any act of depredation or violence by the crew of a British or French vessel, against another British or French vessel, or by the crew of a foreign vessel not provided with a regular commission, against British or French vessels, their crews or their cargoes.

(b) The fact by any person being or not one of the crew of a vessel of giving her over to pirates.

(c) The fact by any person being or not one of the crew of a vessel of taking possession of such vessel by fraud or violence.

(d) Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.

(e) Revolt or conspiracy to revolt by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.

. 25. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute an offence against the laws of both countries.

The extradition is also to take place for participation, either as principals or accessories, in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation. be punishable by the laws of both the Contracting Parties.

#### ARTICLE IV.

The present Treaty shall apply to crimes and offences committed prior to the signature of the Treaty; but a person surrendered shall not be tried for any crime or offence committed in the other country before the extradition, other than the crime for which his surrender has been granted.

#### ARTICLE V.

No accused or convicted person shall be surrendered, if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded shall be deemed by the Party upon which it is made to be a political offence, or to be an act connected with (connexe a) such an offence, or if he prove to the satisfaction of the police magistrate or of the Court before which he is brought on habeas corpus, or of the Secretary of State, that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or to punish him for an offence of a political character.

#### ARTICLE VI.

On the part of the French Government, the extradition shall take place in the following manner in France :—

The Ambassador or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty in France shall send to the Minister for Foreign Affairs, in support of each demand for extradition, an authenticated and duly legalized copy either of a certificate of conviction, or of a warrant of arrest against a person accused, clearly setting forth the nature of the crime or offence on account of which the fugitive is being 20. (a) Tout acte de déprédation ou de violence commis par l'équipage d'un navire Britannique ou Français contre un autre navire Britannique ou Français, ou par l'équipage d'un navire étranger non pourvu de commission régulière, contre des navires Britanniques ou Français, leurs équipages ou leurs chargements.

(b) Le fait par tout individu, faisant ou non . partie de l'équipage d'un bâtiment de mer, de le livrer aux pirates.

(c) Le fait par tout individu, faisant partie ou non de l'équipage d'un navire ou bâtiment de mer, de s'emparer du dit bâtiment par fraude ou violence.

(d) Destruction, submersion, échouement ou perte d'un navire, dans une intention coupable.

(e) Révolte par deux ou plusieurs personnes, à . bord d'un navire en mer, contre l'autorité du capitaine ou du patron.

25. Traite des esclaves, telle qu'elle est définie et punie par les lois des deux pays.

Sont comprises dans les qualifications des actes donnant lieu à extradition, la complicité des faits ci-dessus mentionnés, lorsqu'elles sont punies par la législation des deux pays.

#### ARTICLE IV.

Le présent Traité s'applique aux crimes et délits antérieurs à sa signature; mais la personne qui aura été livrée ne sera poursuivie pour aucun délit commis dáns l'autre pays avant l'extradition, autre que celui pour lequel sa remise a été accordée.

#### ARTICLE V.

Aucune personne accusée ou condamnée ne sera livrée si le délit pour lequel l'extradition est demandée est considéré par la partie requise. comme un délit politique ou un fait connexe à un semblable délit, ou si la personne prouve, à la satisfaction du magistrat de police ou de la cour devant laquelle elle est amenée par l'habeas corpus, ou du Secrétaire d'Etat, que la demande d'extradition a été faité en réalité dans le but de la poursuivre ou de la punir pour un délit d'un caractère politique.

#### ARTICLE VI.

L'Ambassadeur ou autre Agent Diplomatique de Sa Majesté Britannique en France enverra au Ministre des Affaires Etrangères, à l'appui de chaque demande d'extradition, l'expédition authentique et dûment légalisée, soit d'un certificat de condamnation, soit d'un mandat d'arrêt contre une personne inculpée ou accusée, faisant clairement connaître la nature du crime ou du délit à raison proceeded against. The judicial document thus produced shall be accompanied by a description of the person claimed, and by any other information which may serve to identify him.

These documents shall be communicated by the Minister for Foreign Affairs to the Keeper of the Seals, Minister of Justice, who, after examining the claim for surrender, and the documents in support thereof, shall report thereon immediately to the President of the Republic; and, if there is reason for it, a Decree of the President will grant the extradition of the person claimed, and will order him to be arrested and delivered to the British authorities.

In consequence of this Decree, the Minister of the Interior shall give orders that search be made for the fugitive criminal, and in case of his arrest, that he be conducted to the French frontier, to be delivered to the person authorized by Her Britannic Majesty's Government to receive him.

Should it so happen that the documents furnished by the British Government, with the view of establishing the identity of the (ugitive criminal, and that the particulars collected by the agents of the French Police with the same view, be considered insufficient, notice shall be immediately given to the Ambassador or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty in France, and the fugitive person, if he has been arrested, shall remain in custody until the British Government has been able to furnish further evidence in order to establish his identity or to throw light on other difficulties in the examination.

#### ARTICLE VII.

In the dominions of Her Britannic Majesty, other than the Colonies or Foreign Possessions of Her Majesty, the manner of proceeding shall be as follows :--

(A) In the case of a person accused-The requisition for the surrender shall be made to Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs by the Ambassador or other Diplomatic Agent of the President of the French Republic, accompanied by a warrant of arrest or other equivalent judicial document, issued by a Judge or Magistrate duly authorized to take cognizance of the acts charged against the accused in France, together with duly authenticate4 depositions or statements taken on oath before such Judge or Magistrate, clearly setting forth the said acts, and containing a description of the person claimed, and any particulars which may serve to identify him. The said Secretary of State shall transmit such documents to Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, who shall then, by order under his hand and seal, signify to some Police Magistrate in London that such requisition has been made, and require him, if there be due cause, to issue his warrant for the apprehension of the fugitive.

On the receipt of such order from the Secretary of State, and on the production of such evidence as would, in the opinion of the Magistrate, justify the issue of the warrant if the crime had been committed in the United Kingdom, he shall issue his warrant accordingly.

When the fugitive shall have been apprehended, he shall be brought before the Police Magistrate who issued the warrant, or some other Police Magistrate in London. If the evidence to be then produced shall be such as to justify, according to the law of England, the committal for trial of the prisoner, if the crime of which he is accused

En conséquence de ce Décret, le Ministre de l'Intérieur donnera des ordres pour que l'individu poursuivi soit recherché et, en cas d'arrestation, conduit jusqu'à la frontière de France pour être livré à la personne chargée de le recevoir de la part du, Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique.

S'il arrivait que les documents produits par le Gouvernement Britannique pour constater l'identité, et les renseignements recueillis par les Agents de la Police Française pour le même objet, fussent reconnus insuffisants, avis en serait donné immédiatement à l'Ambassadeur ou autre Agent Diplomatique de Sa Majesté Britannique en France, et l'individu poursuivi, s'il a été arrêté, continuerait à être détenu en attendant que le Gouvernement Britannique ait pu produire de nouveaux éléments de preuve pour constater l'identité ou éclaircir d'autres difficultés d'examen.

#### ARTICLE VII.

Dans les Etats de Sa Majesté Britannique autres que les Colonies ou possessions étrangères il sera procédé ainsi qu'il suit :---

(A) S'il s'agit d'une personne accusée :-La demande sera adressée au Premier Secrétaire d'Etat de Sa Majesté Britannique pour les Affaires Etrangères, par l'Ambassadeur ou autre Agent Diplomatique du Président de la Republique Française. A cette demande seront joints un mandat d'arrêt ou autre document judiciaire équivalent, délivré par un Juge ou Magistrat dûment autorisé à prendre connaissance des actes imputés à l'inculpé en France, ainsi que les dépositions authentiques ou les déclarations faites sous serment devant ce Juge ou Magistrat, énonçant clairement les dits actes et contenant, outre le signalement de la personne réclamée, toutes les particularités qui pourraient servir à établir son identité. Le dit Secrétaire d'Etat transmettra ces documents au Premier Secrétaire d'Etat de Sa Majesté Britannique pour le Département des Affaires Intérieures, qui, par un ordre de sa main et muni de son sceau, signifiera à un Magistrat de Police de Londres que la demande d'extradition a été faite, et le requerra, s'il y a lieu, de délivrer un mandat pour l'arrestation du fugitif.

A la réception de cet ordre et sur la production de telle preuve qui, dans son opinion, justifierait l'émission du mandat, si le fait avait été commis dans le Royaume Uni, le Magistrat délivrera le mandat requis.

Lorsque le fugitif aura été arrêté, on l'amenera dévant le Magistrat de Police de qui sera émané le mandat, ou devant un autre Magistrat de Police de Londres. Si la preuve produite est de nature à justifier, selon la loi Anglaise, la mise en jugement du prisonnier dans le cas ou le fait dont il est accusé aurait été commis en Angleterre, le had been committed in England, the Police Magistrate shall commit him to prison to await the warrant of the Secretary of State for his surrender; sending immediately to the Secretary of State a certificate of the committal and a report upon the case:

After the expiration of a period from the committal of the prisoner which shall never be less than fifteen days, the Secretary of State shall, by order under his hand and seal, order the fugitive criminal to be surrendered to such person as may be duly authorized to receive him on the part of President of the French Republic.

(B) In the case of a person convicted—The course of proceeding shall be the same as in the case of a person accused, except that the warrant to be transmitted by the Ambassador or other Diplomatic Agent in support of his requisition shall clearly set forth the crime of which the person claimed has been convicted, and state the fact, place, and date of his conviction. The evidence to be produced before the Police Magistrate shall be such as would, according to the law of England, prove that the prisoner was convicted of the crime charged.

(C) Persons convicted by judgment in default or arrêt de contumace, shall be in the matter of extradition considered as persons accused, and, as such, be surrendered.

(D) After the Police Magistrate shall have committed the accused or convicted person to prison to await the order of a Secretary of State for his surrender, such person shall have the right to apply for a writ of *habeas corpus*; if he should so apply, his surrender must be deferred until after the decision of the Court upon the return to the writ, and even then can only take place if the decision is adverse to the applicant. In the latter case the Court may at once order his delivery to the person authorized to receive him, without the order of a Secretary of State for his surrender, or commit him to prison to await such order.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

Warrants, depositions, or statements on oath, issued or taken in the dominions of either of the two High Contracting Parties, and copies thereof, and certificates of or judicial documents stating the facts of conviction, shall be received in evidence in proceedings in the dominions of the other if purporting to be signed or certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the country where they were issued or taken provided such warrants, depositions, statements, copies, certificates, and judicial documents are authenticated by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or some of the Minister of State.

#### ARTICLE IX.

A fugitive criminal may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the person issuing the warrant justify the issue of a warrant, if the crime had been committed or the prisoner convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the Magistrate exercises jurisdiction : provided, however, that, in the United Kingdom, the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a Police

(B) S'il s'agit d'une personne condamnée :--La marche de la procédure sera la même que dans le cas d'une personne accusée, sauf que le mandat à transmettre par l'Ambassadeur ou autre Agent Diplomatique Français, à l'appui de la demande d'extradition, énoncera clairement le fait pour lequel la personne réclamée aura été condamnée et mentionnera le lieu et la date du jugement. La preuve à produire devant le Magistrat de police sera telle que, d'après la loi Anglaise, elle établirait que le prisonnier a été condamné pour l'infraction dont on l'accuse.

(C) Les condamnés par jugement par défaut ou arrêt de contumace sont, au point de vue de la demande d'extradition, réputés accusés, et livrés comme tels.

(D) Après que le Magistrat de police aura envoyé en prison la personne accusée ou condamnée pour attendre l'ordre d'extradition du Secrétaire d'Etat, cette personne aura le droit deréclamer une ordonnancé d'habeas corpus; l'extradition devra alors être différée jusqu'après la decision de la Cour sur le renvoi de l'ordonnance, et elle ne pourra avoir lieu que si la décision est contraire au demandeur. Dans ce dernier cas; la Cour pourra immédiatement ordonner la remise de celui-ci à la personne autorisée à le recevoir, sans qu'il soit besoin d'attendre l'ordre d'extradition du Secrétaire d'Etat ou bien l'envoyer en prison pour attendre cet ordre.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

Les mandats, les dépositions, les déclarations sous serment, délivrés ou recueillis dans les Etats de l'une des Hautes Parties Contractantes, les copies de ces pièces, ainsi que les certificats ou les documents judiciaires établissant le fait de la condamnation, seront reçus comme preuves dans la procédure des Etats de l'autre partie, s'ils sont revêtus de la signature ou accompagnés de l'attestation d'un juge, d'un magistrat ou d'un fonctionnaire du pays où ils ont été délivrés ou recueillis, pourvu que ces mandats, dépositions, déclarations, copies, certificats et documents judiciaires soient rendus authentiques par le serment d'un témoin ou par le sceau officiel du Ministre de la Justice ou d'un autre Ministre d'Etat.

#### ARTICLE IX.

Le fugitif pourra être arrêté sur mandat délivré par tout Magistrat de police, juge de paix ou autre autorité compétente dans chaque pays, à la suite d'un avis, d'une plainte, d'une preuve ou de tout autre acte de procédure qui, dans l'opinion de celui qui aura délivré le mandat, justificrait ce mandat, si le crime avait été commis ou la personne condamnée dans la partie des Etats des deux Contractants, où ce Magistrat exerce sa juridiction ; pourvu cependant, s'il s'agit du Royaume Uni, que l'accusé soit, dans un pareil cas, envoyé aussi promptement que possible devant un Magistrat de police de Londres. Il sera relâché, tant dans le Magistrate in London. He shall be discharged, as well in the United Kingdom as in France, if within fourteen days a requisition shall not have been made for his surrender by the Diplomatic Agent of his country in the manner directed by Articles H and TV of this Treaty.

The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes specified in this Treaty committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

#### ARTICLE X.

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If the fugitive criminal who has been committed to prison, be not surrendered and conveyed away within two months after such committel, or within two months after the decision of the Court upon the return to a writ of *labeas corpus* in the United Kingdom, he shall be discharged from custody, unless sufficient cause be shown to the contrary.

#### ARTICLE XI.

The claim for extradicion shall not be complied with if the individual claimed has been already tried for the same offence in the country whence the extradition is demanded, or if, since the commission of the acts charged, the accusation or the conviction, exemption from prosecution, or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of that country.

#### ARTICLE XII.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, on account of other crimes committed upon their respective territories, his surrender shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date; unless any other arrangement should be made between the Governments which have claimed him, either on account of the gravity of the crimes committed, or for any other reasons.

#### ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed should be nuder, prosecution, or condemned for a crime or offence committed in the country where he may have taken refuge, his surrender may he deferred until he shall have been set at liberty in due course of law.

In case he should be proceeded against or detained in such country on account of obligations contracted towards private individuals, his surrender shall nevertheless take place.

#### ARTICLE XIV.

Every article found in the possession of the individual claimed at the time of his arrest, shall, if the competent authority so decide; be seized, in order to be delivered up with his person at the time when the surrender shall be made. Such delivery shall not be limited to the property or articles obtained by stealing or by fraudulent bankruptcy, but shall extend to every thing that may serve as proof of the crime, and shall take place even when the surrender, after having been ordered, shall be prevented from taking place by reason of the escape or death of the individual claimed.

The rights of third parties with regard to the said property or articles are nevertheless reserved.

Royaume Uni qu'en France, si, dans les quatorze jours, une demande d'extradition n'a pas été faite par l'Agent Diplomatique de son pays, suivant le mode indiqué par les Articles II et IV de ce Traité.

La même règle s'appliquera aux cas de personnes accusées ou condamnées du chef de l'un des faits spécifiés dans ce Traité et commis en pleine mer, à bord d'un navire de l'un des deux pays et qui viendrait dans un port de l'autre.

#### ARTICLE X.

Si le fugitif qui a été arrêté n'a pas été livré et emmené dans les deux mois après son arrestation, ou dans les deux mois après la décision de la Cour sur le renvoi d'une ardonnance d'habeas conpus dans le Royaume Uni, il sera mis en liberté, à moins qu'il n'y ait d'autre motif, de le retenir en prison.

#### ARTICLE XI.

Il ne sera pas donné suïte à la demande d'extradition, si l'individu réclamé a été jugé pour le même frait dans le pays requis, ou si, depuis les faits imputés, les poursuites ou la condamnation; la prescription de l'action ou de la peine est acquise d'après les lois de comème pays.

#### ARTICLE XII.

Si Tindividu méchané par l'une des Hautes Parties Contractantes, en exécution du présent Traité, est aussi réclamé par une ou plusieurs autres Puissances, du chef d'autres infractions commises sur leurs territoires respectifs, son extradition sera accordée à l'Etat dont la demande est la plus ancienne en date ; à moins qu'il n'existe entre les Gouvernements qui l'ont réclamé, un arrangement qui déciderait de la préférence, soit à raison de la gravité des crimes commis, soit pour tout autre motif.

#### ARTICLE XIII.

Si l'individu réclamé est poursuivi ou condamné pour un crime ou un délit commis dans le pays où il s'est réfugié, son extradition pourra être différée jusqu'à ce qu'il ait été mis en liberté conformement à la loi.

Dans le cas où il serait poursuivi ou détenue dans le même pays, à raison d'obligations par lui contractées envers des particuliers, son extradition n'en aura pas moins lieu.

#### ARTICLE XIV.

Tout objet trouvé en la possession de l'individu réclamé au moment de son arrestation sera, si l'autorité compétente en a ainsi ordonné, saisi pour être livré avec sa personne lorsque l'extradition aura lieu. Cette remise ne sera pas limitée aux objets acquis par vol ou banqueroute frauduleuse ; elle s'étendra à toute chose qui pourrait servir de pièce de conviction et s'effectuera même si l'extradition, après avoir été accordée, ne peut s'accomplir par suite de l'évasion ou de la mort de l'individu réclamé.

Sont toutefois réservés les droits des tiers sur les objets sus-mentionnés.

#### ARTICLE XV:

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may have consented to surrender in pursuance of the present Treaty.

### ARTICLE XVI.

In the Colonies and foreign Possessions of the two High Contracting Parties the manner of proceeding shall be as follows :---

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in a Colony or foreign Possession of either Party, shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or Possession by the chief Consular Officer of the other in such Colony or Possession; or, if the fugitive has escaped from a Colony or foreign Possession of the Party on whose behalf the requisition is made, by the Governor or chief authority of such colony or Possession.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the respective Governors or chief authorities, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to their Government.

The foregoing stipulations shall not in any way affect the arrangements established in the East Indian Possessions of the two countries by the IXth Article of the Treaty of the 7th March, 1815.

#### ARTICLE XVII.

The present Treaty shall be ratified and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Paris as soon as possible.

It shall come into operation ten days after its publication, in conformity with the laws of the respective countries.

Either Party may at any time terminate the Treaty on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.

Done at Paris, this fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

#### ARTICLE XV.

Chacune des Hautes Parties Contractantes supportera les frais occasionnés par l'arrestation sur son territoire, la détention et le transport à la frontière des personnes qu'elle aura consenti à extrader, en exécution du présent Traité.

#### ARTICLE XVI.

Dans les Colonies et autres Possessions étrangères des deux Hautes Parties Contractantes, il sera procédé de la manière suivante :--

La demande d'extradition du malfaiteur qui s'est réfugié dans une Colonie ou Possession étrangère de l'une des Parties, sera faite au Gouverneur ou fonctionnaire principal de cette Colonie ou Possession par le principal Agent Consulaire de l'autre dans cette Colonie ou Possession ; ou si le fugitif s'est échappé d'une Colonie ou Possession étrangère de la Partie au nom de laquelle l'extradition est demandée, par le Gouverneur ou le fonctionnaire principal de cette Colonie ou Possession.

Ces demandes seront faites ou accueillies, en suivant toujours aussi exactement que possible les stipulations de ce Traité par les Gouverneurs ou premiers fonctionnaires, qui, cependant, auront la faculté ou d'accorder l'extradicion ou d'en référer à leur Gouvernement.

Les stipulations qui précèdent ne modifient en rien les arrangements établis dans les possessions des Indes Orientales des deux États par l'Article IX du Traité du 7 Mars, 1815.

#### ARTICLE XVII.

. Le présent Traité sera ratifié, et les ratifications seront échangées, à Paris, aussitôt que faire se pourra.

. Il entrera en vigueur dix jours après sa publication dans les formes prescrites par la législation, des pays respectifs.

Chacune des Parties Contractantes pourra, en tout temps, mettre fin au Traité, en donnant à l'autre, six mois à l'avance, avis de son intention.

En foi de quoi, les Plénipotentiaires respectifs ont signé ce même Traité et y ont apposé le sceau de leurs armes.

WHEREAS by the three hundred and thirtythird section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that subject to the provisions contained in the fifth part of that Act it shall be lawful for every Pilotage Authority, by Bye-law made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council, to determine the qualifications and make regulations as to the approval, licensing, and government of Pilots, and to fix, alter, and reduce Pilotage Rates:

And whereas by the twenty-third section of the Harbour of Carlingford Lough Improvement Order, set out in the schedule to the Pier and Harbour Orders Confirmation Act, 1864, it is provided that the Harbour of Carlingford Lough Improvement Commissioners shall be a Pilotage Authority within the meaning of the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and the Acts amending the same, and shall have all the powers conferred by those Acts on Pilotage Authorities :

And whereas the said Commissioners have represented that the present Rates of Bar Pilotage, namely,-

For vessels boarded at any distance outside the Bar of Carlingford not exceeding five miles, Haulbowline Lighthouse bearing N.E. to

N.W. to Warrenpoint Roads,

For every vessel from a foreign port 2s. Od. per foot of draft.

For every Cross Channel Trader or Coaster 10d. per foot of draft.

For vessels boarded inside the Bar to Warrenpoint Roads, -

For every vessel from a Foreign Port, 1s. 4d. per foot of draft.

For every Cross Channel Trader or Couster, 6d. per foot of draft.

Outwards.

One third of the above rates ; -are inadequate, and have, in exercise of the powers in them vested by the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and the aforesaid Order, made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty certain Bye-laws, a copy of which is set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, providing for the better government of the Pilots within their district and under their jurisdiction, and fixing the remuneration to be hereafter paid to such Pilots, in lieu of the existing Pilotage Rates payable within such district and under such jurisdiction :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said proposed Bye-laws are proper and reasonable :

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify Her consent to the said Bye-laws, as Bye-laws of the said Pilotage Authority with respect to the Pilotage of their district, and to approve of the substitution, on and after the date of this Order, of the Pilotage Rates named in the said schedule annexed hereto for the rates heretofore in force.

#### SCHEDULE.

BYE-LAWS FOR THE LICENSING AND MANAGEMENT OF PILOTS.

1. The Joint Pilotage Committee will, from time to time, determine the number of Pilots No. 24583. B

necessary for the efficient performance of the service, and when any vacancy occurs in the number so determined on, or when a greater number of Pilots are required, the Harbour Master shall affix a public notice at the Harbour Office, Greenore, specifying the number of Pilots required, and the date on which their applications and testimonials are to be deposited at the said Harbour Office.

2. Every person presenting himself for examination as Pilot for the Bar of Carlingford must produce satisfactory evidence to the Pilot Committee—

- a. That he is between the age of 22 and 35 years, and has been three years in actual service at sea (two of suid years must have been in square-rigged vessels), and also that he has been at least three years in the habit of occasionally accompanying Pilots in actual service in their boats, or on board vessels in charge of a Licensed Pilot.
- **b.** He must be able to prove satisfactorily that he is either the owner or part owner of a good and efficient boat, thoroughly equipped, ready at all times to board vessels in the offing.
- c. He must have satisfactory character of recent date, from either the Masters he sailed with, or from some known respectable person on shore, that he is a thoroughly sober steady man.
- d. He must be able to answer any questions that may be put to him by the Examiners, as to his knowledge of the Lough and its approaches, the navigation thereof, and the working and management of square-rigged vessels.

3. For the purpose of enforcing attention to the following regulations, the duly commissioned Har-, bour Master of the Carlingford Lough Commissioners shall in future be the Superintendent of the Bar Pilots.

4. A Pilot when on board of any vessel other than a coaster is not permitted to take the heim, which shall be in charge of one of the crew, to whom he shall give his orders.

5. Pilots are not permitted to anchor vessels in their charge, either in the Cut on the Bar, or between the Frazer Buoy to the south and the Watson Buoy to the north; if through circumstances of great emergency they are obliged to anchor inside these limits, they must shift the vessel after the next slack water.

Penalty for non-observance of this order a sum not exceeding five pounds.

6. When a Pilot takes charge of any vessel either coming from or going to sea, he is not to quit her, either by day or night, till the service be complete, without permission in writing from the Master, or, in his absence, from the Mate of such vessel.

Penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

7. It is the duly of Pilots to prevent any breach of the Revenue Laws. No article subject to duty is allowed to be brought away from any vessel whatever. either to a Pilot or other boat, and in case of any such landing, or attempt to land taking place before the vessel is boarded by the proper Revenue Officer, and while in charge of a Pilot, the Superintendent shall at once suspend the Pilot till the next meeting of the Pilot Committee, when he will be brought up for trial.

8. Pilots are not permitted to quarrel on board a vessel, but must make their complaint to the Superintendent if they consider themselves aggreeved

Penalty not exceeding ten shillings,

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'9. The Superintendent has orders to suspend any Pilot known to be addicted to intoxication on shore, or who is under the influence of drink when in charge of a vessel, till the next meeting of the Committee, when, if the fact be proved, the person offending shall be dimissed or otherwise punished.

10. Every Pilot is to pay particular attention to personal cleanliness, and the Superintendent is to report and fine any Pilot boarding a vessel who does not pay attention to this rule.

11. It is the duty of Pilots when boarding vessels to exhibit the licence granted by the Pilot Committee to the Master of the vessel, and also the list of rates authorized to be levied; any breach of this rule, or attempt to impose on strangers, by false representations, or charges for services rendered, will be severely punished by the Commitee.

#### RATES OF BAB PILOTAGE.

For vessels boarded at any distance from the Bar of Carlingford, not exceeding a radius of five miles from Haulbowline Lighthouse, round seaward from the coast of County Down to the coast of the County Louth, to Warrenpoint Roads :

For every vessel from a foreign port, 3s. 6d. -per foot draft of water.

For every cross channel trader or coaster, 1s. 6d. per foot draft of water.

When vessels are boarded outside the above five mile limit, the Pilot shall inform the Captain that if he employs him outside the said limit he is entitled to £1 as distance money, but that it is optional to the Master whether he so engages him outside the said limit or not. Any Pilot who does not acquaint the Captain with this rule before taking charge of the vessel, shall be reported to the Committee by the Superintendent; and punished accordingly.

From inside the Bar to Warrenpoint Roads.

For every vessel from a Foreign Port 2s. 0d. \_ per foot drait of water.

For every Cross Channel Trader or Coaster 1s. Od. per foot draft of water.

# Outwards.

For every vessel trading Foreign 2s. Od. per foot draft of water.

For every Cross Channel Trader or Coaster, 9d. per foot draft of water.

When any Pilot is detained on board an outward bound vessel, waiting to go to sea, he shall be paid at the rate of 3. 6*d*. per day for each day he is so detained. The day of going on board and the day of going to sea not to be counted.

**HEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy ; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninetyseven ; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth. years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five ; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two ; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-

eight, in the words following ; that is to say :-"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty eighty-two have prepared, and now chapter humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter situate in the parochial chapelry of Hargrave within the limits of the parish of Tarvin in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Tarvin and of the parish of Waverton in the said county of Chester and in the said diocese of Chester which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective parishes.

"" And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parishof Tarvin and of the said parish of Waverton should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter situate in the parochial chapelry of Hargrave as aforesaid.

""And whereas the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester is the patron, in right of his See both of the vicarage of the said parish of Tarvin and of the vicarage of the said parish of Waverton.

"And whereas the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester, the Most Noble Hugh Lupus Duke of Westminster Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, the Very Reverend John Saul Howson, Doctor in Divinity Dean of the Cathedral Church of Chester and Philip Stapleton Humberston of Glan-y-Wern Denbigh, Esquire the trustees of the charity called or known as the Hargrave Charity, are, as such trustees the patrons of the said church of Saint Peter situate in the parochial chapelry of Hargrave as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester of the said Hugh Lupus Duke of Westminster of the said John Saul Howson and of the said Philip. Stapleton Humberston (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed. and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Tarwin and of the said parish of Waverton which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on. the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united. and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Peter situate in the parochial chapelry of Hargrave as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated. Chapelry of Saint Peter Hargrave.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

#### "The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference:

"The Consolidated Chapeling of Sainty Peter Hargrave being :----

"All that portion of the parish of Tarvin in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the township of Foulk Stapleford otherwise called or known as the parochial chapeley of Hargrave.

"And also all that contiguous perion of the parish of Waverton in the county and dioceses aforesaid which is comprised within and is coextensive with the limits of the township of Huxley."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Har Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Hersaid Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation; and to order and direct that the same and every part-thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts ; and Har Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her. Majesty, chapter forty-one, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty, in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight; in the words and figures following; that is to say ::

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of your Majesty chapter forty-one, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for setting out and constituting a district for spiritual purposes and annexing such district to the consecrated church of Saint Chrysostom situate at Victoria Park within the limits of the new parish of Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme within the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Marchester:

"Whereas it'appears to us to be expedient that a district for spiritual purposes should be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of Saint Chrysostom situate at Victoria Park as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme we humbly recommend and propose that all that portion of the said new parish of Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme, and also all those contiguous portions of the new parish of Saint John Longsight, and of the new parish of Saint Saviour Chorltonupon-Medlock (both within the original limits

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of the parish of Manchester aforesaid) all which said portions are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your. Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be severed and disannexed from such new parishes respectively and shall be set out and constituted a district for spiritual purposes for and be annexed to the said church of Saint Chrysostom situate at Victoria Park as aforesaid, and that the said district shall be named 'The District of Saint' Chrysoston; Victoria Park, Manchester,'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing, herein, contained shall, prevent us from recommending and proposing, any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in, accordance with the provisions of the hereinnamed Acts, or of either of them.or of any other. Act of Parliament.

### "The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing; Scheme has reference:

"The District of Saint Chrysestom Victoria Park, Manchester, being :----

"All that portion of the new parish of Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme within the original limits of the parish of Manchester in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, and also all those contiguous, portions of the new parish of Saint John Longsight and of the new parish of Saint Saviour Chorlton upon-Medlock, both within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid which said portions of such new parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point where Wilmslow-road is joined by the road called or known as 'Moss-lane East' and where the boundary dividing the new parish of the Holy Trinity at Rusholme within the original limits of the said parish of Manchester from the new parish of Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme aforesaid meets the boundary dividing the last-named new parish from the new parish of Christ Church, Moss Side also within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of six chains and a half or thereabouts thereby following, the course of Wilmslow-road aforesaid to the junction of the same boundary with the boundary which divides the last-named new parish from the new parish of Saint Saviour Cherlton-upon-Medlock aforesaid and continuing thence still northward along the last-described boundary for a distance of eleven chains and a half or thereabouts thereby following in part the course of the said Wilmslow-road and in part the course of Oxford Street or Road to the point where such last-named street or road is. joined by the road called or known as Stanleygrove and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eleven chains and a quarter or thereabouts (thereby passing along the northern branch of such road) to a boundary plate inscribed 'M. V. P. St. C. D. 1878 No. 1, and placed at the southwestern end of the fence which divides the house and grounds called or known as Stanley House from the house and grounds called or known as 'Stanley Villa' such boundary plate being on the northern side of the gate forming the entrance to the house called or known as 'Stanley House' aforesaid and continuing thence still north-eastward along the said fence for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its north-eastern end at the south-western end of Lorne-street and extending

thence first south-eastward to, and then northeastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Clarence-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to the junction of the same street with the street called or known as Swinton-grove otherwise Swinton-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to a point at the junction of the same street with the road called or known as Plymouth-grove upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Saviour Chorltonupon-Medlock from the new parish of Saint Choriton-upon-Medlock within · Stephen the original limits of the parish of Manchester afore-said and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty-six chains and a quarter or thereabouts thereby following in part the course of the road called or known as 'Plymouth-grove' aforesaid and in part the course of 'Albert-road' to the point at the junction of the last-named road with Grindlowstreet and with a certain ancient footway leading from Grindlow-street aforesaid to High-street Chorlton-upon-Medlock at which point the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Saviour Chorlton-upon-Medlock from the new parish of Saint John Longsight aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of ten chains and a quarter or thereabouts thereby following the course of the said 'ancient footway' to the point where the same footway joins the last-named street and the street or road called or known as 'Richmondgrove' and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street or road for a distance of three chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point opposite to a boundary plate inscribed 'M. V. P. St. C. D. 1878 No. 2' and placed on the southern side of the same street or road at the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and garden called or known as 'Sunny Bank' and extending thence that is from the last-described point in the middle of Richmond-grove aforesaid southward to the last-mentioned boundary plate and along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to a point at the southern end of the same wall or fence upon the boundary which divides the township of Chorlton-upon-Medlock from the township of Rusholme and extending thence eastward along the said town-ship boundary for a distance of four chains and three - quarters or thereabouts to its junction at the north-western end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and garden called or known as 'Daisy Mount' with the boundary dividing the said township of Rusholme from a certain detached portion of the township of Moss Side and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the last-mentioned township boundary for a distance of sixteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the northern end of Victoria-road such point being a little to the north of the Roman Catholic Convent called or known as ' The Convent of the Good Shepherd' and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fifteen chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same road with Dickensonroad which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint John Longsight from the new parish of

Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme aforesaid and! extending thence first south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary thereby following the course of the last-named road for a distance of four chains and three-quarters or thereabouts and then north-westward along the same boundary, thereby following the course of 'Anson-road' for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to thepoint where the last-named road is joined by: Kent-road and extending thence south-westward. along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-four chains and three-quarters or; thereabouts to its junction with Park-road and extending thence northward along the middle.of the last-named road for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Dagenham-road and extending thence southwestward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Elm-street and<sup>7</sup> extending thence northward along the middle ofthe last-named street for a distance of ten chains. and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Rusholme-place and extending thence south-westward along the middle. of the last-named road for a distance of five chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point at. at the junction of the same road with Wilmslowroad aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Birch-in Rusholme from the new parish of the Holy Trinity at Rusholme aforesaid and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary thereby following the course of the last-named road for a distance of one chain or thereabouts tothe first described point where the same road is joined by the road called or known as Moss-lane East as aforesaid and where the said last-mentioned boundary is joined by the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme from the new parish of Christ Church, Moss Sideaforesaid, at which point the said imaginary linecommenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the three cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council : now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said. Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every, part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall, have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct. that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late.

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Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventyseven, and of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say :--

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of your Majesty chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for dividing the Archdeaconry of Cornwall (now being within and conterminous with the diocese of Truro) into two portions, and for constituting each of such portions a separate archdeaconry and for assigning a district thereto.

"Whereas the area of the said present Archdeaconry of Cornwall is of great extent and comprises and consists in chief part of the county of Cornwall and (as aforesaid) of the whole of the said diocese of Truro.

"And whereas within the same area twelve rural deancries are wholly included being the rural deancries of Saint Austell, Bodmin, Carnmarth, East, Kerrier, Penwith, Powder, Pyder, Stratton, Trigg Major, Trigg Minor, and West, as appears by the statutory schedule of rural deaneries which in pursuance of the lastly hereinbefore mentioned Act was in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four prepared for the diocese of Exeter of which diocese the said diocese of Truro then formed part as appears also by an Order of your Majesty in Council dated the fifth day of August in the one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five and published in the London Gazette on the tenth day of the same month whereby certain new arrangements with respect (amongst other things) to the said present Archdeaconry of Cornwall and its rural deaneries or some them were effected.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward White, Bishop of the said diocese of Truro has represented to us that it is in his opinion desirable that the said Archdeaconry of Cornwall should be divided and that such division should be made by creating the new archdeaconry hereinafter recommended and proposed to be created and by assigning thereto the district hereinafter recommended and proposed to be assigned thereto.

"And whereas we have considered the matter so represented to us by the said Bishop and it appears to us to be expedient that the said Archdeaconry of Cornwall should be divided and that the division to be made thereof should be that which as aforesaid is recommended by the said Bishop and which is also hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have obtained from the Venerable William John Phillpotts Clerk in Holy Orders the present Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Cornwall a return whereby it appears that during or in respect of the seven years ended the thirty-first day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven the average income which the said present Archdeacon of Cornwall derived from fees and emoluments arising within or in respect of the area hereinafter proposed to be assigned as a district to the new

archdeaconry the creation of which is recommended as aforesaid and is hereinafter recommended and proposed was twenty-eight pounds per annum or thereabouts.

"And whereas by virtue of the Acts hereinbefore mentioned or some or one of them it is competent to us to endow any archideaconry by augmentation out of the common fund created by the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act provided that the said augmentation shall not be such as to raise the average annual income of any archdeaconry to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward White Bishop of the said diocese of Truro (in testimony of which consent he has set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said present Archdeaconry of Cornwall shall be divided into and shall become two separate archdeaconries and that as from the day aforesaid one of the said two separate archdeaconries shall comprise and consist of and by virtue of the same Order shall have assigned to it as a district all that part of the area of the said present Archdeaconry of Cornwall which contains and is co-extensive with the aggregate areas of all the rural deaneries named in the first schedule to this scheme annexed and that as from the day aforesaid the other of the said two separate archdeaconries shall comprise and consist of and by virtue as well of the said Order as of existing law or custom shall have and be deemed to have assigned to it as a district all the residue of the area of the said present Archideaconry of Cornwall that is to say all that part of the same area which is not included within the rural deaneries or any of them named in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed and which residue contains and is co-extensive with the aggregate areas of all the rural deaneries named in the second schedule to this scheme annexed.

"And we further. recommend and propose that the new archdeaconry to be created as hereinbefore recommended and proposed (and of which the district or area is set out as aforesaid in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed) shall be called the Archdeaconry of Bodmin and the archdeacon thereof the Archdeacon of Bodmin and that the other of the said two archdeaconries being in respect of the district or area the residue and remainder of the said present Archdeaconry of Cornwall as aforesaid shall continue as heretofore to be called the Archdeaconry of Cornwall and the archdeacon thereof the Archdeacon of Cornwall.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural deans and all other the clergy and inhabitants of either of the said two archdeaconries shall be exempted and released from the jurisdiction authority and control of the archdeacon for the time being of the other of the said two archdeaconries and shall be under and subject to the jurisdiction authority and control of the archdeacon for the time being of their own archdeaconry only.

"And we further recommend and propose that there shall be paid yearly and every year on the first day of January out of the said common fund to the archdeacon for the time being of the said Archdeaconry of Bodmin a sum of one hundred and seventy-two pounds in respect of the twelve calendar months ended on that day Provided always that the first payment to be made by us as aforesaid to the Archdeacon of the said Arch-deaconry of Bodmin shall be proportional in amount to the period which shall have elapsed between the date of the institution of the archdeacon receiving the same payment and the first day of January next following the date of such institution and Provided also that every such yearly payment as aforesaid shall be apportionable between an archdeacon (or as the case may be the the representatives of an archdeacon) who has resigned or otherwise avoided his archdeaconry on any day of the year other than the first day of January and the archdeacon who shall next thereafter be instituted to the same archdeaconry and Provided further that every such yearly payment as aforesaid shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the arclideacon who is (or whose representatives are), to receive it has during the previous twelve months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

And we further recommend and proposed that nothing, herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing hereafter to your Majesty in Council any other matter on thing relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament,

"And with the like consent of the said Robert Bisliop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified as aforesaid), we; the said Eccle-siastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being : Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part. of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

Asaph, which said benefice of Rhyl was sometime part of the parish of Rhuddlan, in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Rhyl is now vested in the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the said parish of Rhuddlan.

"And whereas a sum of one hundred pounds sterling has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England in augmentation of the endowment of the said benefice of Rhyl, and we have in respect of the said capital. sum, agreed and undertaken to pay to the vicar or incumbent of the said benefice of Rhyl (being duly licensed thereto) the yearly sum of three pounds six shillings and eight pence, so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of one hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that a transfer of the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Rhyl, from the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of the parish of Rhuddlan (in whom the same is now vested as aforesnid), to the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Saint Asaph shall be effected by the agency of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England.
