

thence first south-eastward to, and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Clarence-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to the junction of the same street with the street called or known as Swinton-grove otherwise Swinton-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to a point at the junction of the same street with the road called or known as Plymouth-grove upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Saviour Chorlton-upon-Medlock from the new parish of Saint Stephen Chorlton-upon-Medlock within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty-six chains and a quarter or thereabouts thereby following in part the course of the road called or known as 'Plymouth-grove' aforesaid and in part the course of 'Albert-road' to the point at the junction of the last-named road with Grindlow-street and with a certain ancient footway leading from Grindlow-street aforesaid to High-street Chorlton-upon-Medlock at which point the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Saviour Chorlton-upon-Medlock from the new parish of Saint John Longsight aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of ten chains and a quarter or thereabouts thereby following the course of the said 'ancient footway' to the point where the same footway joins the last-named street and the street or road called or known as 'Richmond-grove' and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street or road for a distance of three chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point opposite to a boundary plate inscribed 'M. V. P. St. C. D. 1878 No. 2' and placed on the southern side of the same street or road at the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and garden called or known as 'Sunny-Bank' and extending thence that is from the last-described point in the middle of Richmond-grove aforesaid southward to the last-mentioned boundary plate and along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to a point at the southern end of the same wall or fence upon the boundary which divides the township of Chorlton-upon-Medlock from the township of Rusholme and extending thence eastward along the said township boundary for a distance of four chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction at the north-western end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and garden called or known as 'Daisy Mount' with the boundary dividing the said township of Rusholme from a certain detached portion of the township of Moss Side and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the last-mentioned township boundary for a distance of sixteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the northern end of Victoria-road such point being a little to the north of the Roman Catholic Convent called or known as 'The Convent of the Good Shepherd' and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fifteen chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same road with Dickenson-road which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint John Longsight from the new parish of

Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme aforesaid and extending thence first south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary thereby following the course of the last-named road for a distance of four chains and three-quarters or thereabouts and then north-westward along the same boundary thereby following the course of 'Anson-road' for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-named road is joined by Kent-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-four chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Park-road and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Dagenham-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Elm-street and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Rusholme-place and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of five chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point at the junction of the same road with Wilmslow-road aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme from the new parish of the Holy Trinity at Rusholme aforesaid and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary thereby following the course of the last-named road for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to the first described point where the same road is joined by the road called or known as Moss-lane East as aforesaid and where the said last-mentioned boundary is joined by the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint James Birch-in-Rusholme from the new parish of Christ Church, Moss Side aforesaid, at which point the said imaginary line-commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the three cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council : now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.
