

for a short time, so as to be in personal communication with his Excellency, previous to proceeding to Natal and Transvaal, where I believe my presence desirable.

12. I trust very soon to be in a position to forward for your information, a summary of events since my arrival in South Africa, down to the close of this war.

13. With reference to paragraph 5 of this Despatch, I have further to report that U'Dimba, son of Umbala, has surrendered; Auta, half brother to Sandilli, a Gaika of considerable importance, died two days ago, he had been ailing for some time and had not joined in the rebellion.
