T has been announced by the Italian Government that goods consigned to Italy from countries in Europe, or bordering on the Mediter-ranean and Black Seas, must, from the 1st of August next, be provided with certificates of origin in order to prove that they are the produce or manufacture of countries entitled to the benefit of the Italian Conventional Tariff.

Persons about to consign goods to Italy are recommended to communicate with the Italian Consular Officer at the place from whence the goods are despatched or shipped, in order to ascertain the formalities to be observed.
