CUSTOMS DUTIES IN SPAIN.

TRANSLATION, received from Sir John Walsham, of a Circular to the Administrators of Customs in Spain:—

*General Customs, Madrid,
July 29th, 1878.*

The following Royal Order has been communicated by the Minister of Finance to this Department, dated to-day.

Your Excellency, His Majesty the King (whom God preserve) has deigned to order that the extraordinary and transitory tax (surcharge) in the third column of the Tariff, shall not be applied to the produce of Great Britain when imported into the Peninsula and Balearic Islands.

By Royal Order I inform your Excellency of this, so that it may be put into execution.

I transmit you the above for your information and guidance.

Order of Council of 7 June, 1878, defining a part of the Port of London as a part thereof and landing-place within and at which animals brought from a port or place in France might be landed for quarantine.

Order of Council of 8 July, 1878, amending and continuing the aforesaid Order of 7 June, 1878.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, defining the part of the Port of Grimsby, in the parts of Lindsey, in the county of Lincoln, within which foreign cattle might be landed for slaughter: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.
