part or assist in the conduct of the trade or business of the cow-keeper, dairyman, purveyor of milk, or occupier of the milk-store, or milk-shop, as far as regards the production, distribution or storage of milk, until all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

11. It shall not be lawful for a person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milkstore or milk-shop, to use a milk-store or milkshop in his occupation, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose incompatible with the proper preservation of the cleanliness of the milk-store or milk-shop, and of the milk-vessels and milk therein, or in any manner likely to cause contamination of the milk therein.
