**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty,

chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words following; that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Peter Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Peter Ashton-under-Lyne, of the parish of Saint Michael Ashton-under-Lyne, in the said county of Lancaster, and in the said diocese of Manchester, and of the new parish of Christ Church Ashton-under-Lyne, in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes and parish respectively.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Ashton-under-Lyne, of the said parish of Saint Michael, Ashton-under-Lyne, and of the said new parish of Christ Church, Ashton-under-Lyne, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of the Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the said new parish of Saint Peter Ashton-under-Lyne as aforesaid.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester as such Bishop and also as one of the alternate patrons (in right of his see) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Christ Church Ashton-under-Lyne, with the consent of the Right Honourable Benjamin Earl of Beaconsfield, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, the First Lord of your Majesty's Treasury, acting as such on behalf of your Majesty, as the other alternate patron (in right of the Crown) of the same vicarage, with the consent of the Reverend Thomas Eagar, Clerk in Holy Orders the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Saint Michael, Ashton-under-Lyne, as the patron (in right of his incumbency), of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Ashton-under-Lyne, and with the consent of the Right Honourable George Harry Earl of Stamford and Warrington as the patron of the said rectory of the parish of Saint Michael Ashton-under-Lyne aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of

Saint Peter Ashton-under-Lyne, of the said parish of Saint Michael Ashton-under-Lyne, and of the said new parish of Christ Church Ashton-under-Lyne, which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of the Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Peter, Ashton-under-Lyne as aforesaid and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity Ashton-under-Lyne.’

“We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Ashton-under-Lyne, being:—

“All those contiguous portions of the new parish of Saint Peter Ashton-under-Lyne, of the parish of Saint Michael Ashton-under-Lyne, and of the new parish of Christ Church Ashton-under-Lyne, all in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, which said portions of such cures are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church Ashton-under-Lyne, from the parish of Saint Michael Ashton-under-Lyne aforesaid, at the point where Katharine-street is intersected by Oldham-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Old-street and with Mill-lane and continuing thence still generally south-eastward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its south-eastern end at the north-eastern end of the Albion Mills and continuing thence still south-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of half a chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Huddersfield Canal and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge over the same canal at the north-western end of Lower Cavendish-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said bridge and along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts thereby passing under the line of the Ashton and Staly-bridge Branch of the Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway to a point at the south-eastern end of Alma Bridge which carries the same street over the River Tame upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Michael Ashton-under-Lyne from the new parish of Saint Mark Dukinfield in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester and extending thence first westward then north-westward and then south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twelve and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby following for the most part the southern bank of the River Tame aforesaid) to the junction of the said last-mentioned boundary with the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark Dukinfield from the new parish of Saint Peter Ashton-under-Lyne aforesaid and continuing thence still south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby continuing to follow the said bank of the same river) to a point at or near to the middle of the south-

eastern end of the aqueduct which carries the Peak Forest Canal over the said river and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said aqueduct for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to the point at Ashton Junction where it joins the Manchester and Ashton-under-Lyne Canal and the Huddersfield Canal aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named canal for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the centre of Portland-street foot-bridge over the same canal and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said foot-bridge and along the middle of Portland-street, for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to the junction of the last-named street with Katharine-street aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Margaret-street North and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Moss-lane and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the Oldham Ashton-under-Lyne and Guide Bridge Railway over the same lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named line of railway for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts thereby following the eastern loop of the same line of railway and crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter Ashton-under-Lyne from the new parish of Christ Church Ashton-under-Lyne aforesaid to the junction of the same line of railway with the Manchester and Huddersfield Branch of the London and North Western Railway and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named branch line of railway for a distance of one and a half chains or thereabouts to the middle of the footbridge over the same branch line of railway at the north-western end of Cavendish-street and extending thence southward along the middle of the said footbridge for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the north-western end of the last-named street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the same street for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to a point at the intersection of the same street by Katharine-street upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church Ashton-upon-Lyne from the parish of Saint Michael Ashton-under-Lyne as aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby following the middle of Katharine-street aforesaid) to the first described point at the intersection of the last-named street by Oldham-road as aforesaid, where the said imaginary line commenced."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty chapter sixty-three duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixteenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of your Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for dividing and for constituting into two rural deaneries the Rural Deanery of Alverstoke and Portsea Island in the diocese of Winchester which now by virtue of the lastly hereinbefore-mentioned Act is one rural deanery only and is scheduled accordingly as such pursuant to the same Act in the Registry of the said diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Edward Harold now Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester has proposed to us and has made it appear to us to be expedient that the said Rural Deanery of Alverstoke and Portsea Island should be divided and should be constituted into two rural deaneries each of which shall comprise and consist of the aggregate area of the several cures of which the names and status are respectively set forth in the first and second schedules to this scheme appended.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward Harold Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester (in testimony of which consent he has to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal) we humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the existing Rural Deanery of Alverstoke and Portsea Island shall be divided and shall be constituted into two rural deaneries of which the name of the one shall be 'The Rural Deanery of Alverstoke' and the name of the other shall be 'The Rural Deanery of Portsea Island' and that the Rural Deanery of Alverstoke shall comprise and consist of the several cures of which the names and the status are set forth in the said first schedule to this scheme appended and that the Rural Deanery of Portsea Island shall comprise and consist of the several cures of which the names and the status are set forth in the said second schedule to this scheme appended.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural dean of the said Rural Deanery of Alverstoke and the Rural Dean of the said Rural Deanery of Portsea Island shall be under and subject to the jurisdiction authority and control of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Winchester, within which Archdeaconry the existing

Rural Deanery of Alverstoke and Portsea Island is wholly situate and within which Archdeaconry therefore each of the said two proposed Rural Deaneries of Alverstoke and of Portsea Island will also be wholly situate, and that the clergy and other inhabitants of the said proposed Rural Deanery of Alverstoke and the clergy and other inhabitants of the said proposed Rural Deanery of Portsea Island respectively shall be under and subject to the jurisdiction authority and control of the rural dean of that one of the same two rural deaneries of which they are inhabitants as aforesaid and not to the jurisdiction authority or control of any other rural dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing hereafter to your Majesty in Council any other matter or thing relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation for effecting the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity situate at Felinfoel in the parish of Llanelly in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint Davids and also the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Dafen in the same parish.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to each of the said churches situate at Felinfoel and Dafen respectively as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Davids (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would, in our opinion be expedient, firstly that all that part of the said parish of Llanelly which is described in the first schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 1 should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of the Holy Trinity situate at Felinfoel as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Felinfoel,' and, secondly that all that other part of the same parish of Llanelly which is described in the second schedule hereunder written all which lastly-mentioned part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the other map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 2 should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Dafen as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Dafen.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of St. David's (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed both at the said church of the Holy Trinity situate at Felinfoel as aforesaid and also at the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Dafen as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices in each of the two churches aforesaid should be paid and belong to the ministers thereof for the time being respectively: Provided always that so long as the Reverend David Williams Canon of the Cathedral Church of Saint Davids the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Llanelly shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received at each of the two churches aforesaid shall be paid over by the respective ministers of the same churches to the said David Williams and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The FIRST SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity Felinfoel being:—

"All that part of the parish of Llanelly in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint Davids wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the east partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llangennech and partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llannon both in the county and diocese aforesaid on the north-east by the last-named parish or parochial chapelry on the north-west partly by the parish of Llanddarog and partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llangydeyrn both in the said county and diocese on the west by the last-named parish or parochial chapelry on the south-west by the parish of Pembrey in the said county and diocese and upon the remaining sides that is to say on the south and on the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point at or near to the houses called or known as Cwm-bach where the boundary which divides the said parish of Pembrey from the parish of Llanelly aforesaid crosses the middle of the turnpike-road leading from Kidwelly to Llanelly and called or known as the Old Kidwelly-road and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said turnpike-road for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to the point at or near to the houses called or known as Furnace where the same turnpike-road is crossed by the line of the Old Carmarthenshire Tramway and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said tramway for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts to the point where it crosses Dimpeth-lane and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its point of junction with the turnpike-road leading from Llanelly to Llannon and

extending thence south-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of fifty-five chains or thereabouts, thereby crossing the River Lledi to the point where Capel-road is joined by the road leading past the houses called or known as Bryngwyn-bach to Dafen and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said Capel-road for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road or lane leading past the groups of houses called or known respectively as Bryngwyn Mawr and Cilsaig and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-described road or lane for a distance of fifty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the Dafen River and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named river for a distance of one mile and a quarter or thereabouts to the boundary at the point where the same river is crossed by the road leading from the turnpike-road from Llanelly to Llannon aforesaid past the Graiglwyd Mission-room to Llangennech which boundary divides the said parish of Llanelly from the parish of Llangennech aforesaid.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Dafen being:—

"All that part of the said parish of Llanelly which is bounded on the north-east by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llangennech aforesaid on the east and on the south-east by the parish of Loughor in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Saint Davids aforesaid or in other words by the estuary of the River Loughor on the south by the southern boundary of the parish of Llanelly or in other words by the estuary of the River Loughor aforesaid on the south-west by the new parish of Saint Paul Llanelly within the original limits of the said parish of Llanelly and upon the remaining side that is to say on the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Paul Llanelly from the parish of Llanelly aforesaid at a point near to the house called or known as Marble Hall in the middle of the road leading from Trostre to Llanelly such point being directly over the Marble Hall Tunnel and near to the junction of the last-described road with Marble Hall-lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the turnpike-road leading from Llanelly to Swansea and called or known as Swansea-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned turnpike-road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction at Capel Issaf with Capel-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road or lane leading past the groups of houses called or known respectively as Bryngwyn Mawr and Cilsaig and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-described road or lane for a distance of fifty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the Dafen River and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named river for a distance of one mile and a quarter or thereabouts to the boundary at the point where the same river is crossed by the road leading from the turnpike-road from Llanelly to Llannon aforesaid past the Graiglwyd Mission Room to Llangennech which boundary divides the said parish of Llanelly from

the parish or parochial chapelry of Llangennech aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Davids.

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 13th day of February, 1879.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1878,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Ships' Cows and Goats Order.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the making thereof; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order.

3. This Order extends to Great Britain only.

4. Unless and until the Privy Council otherwise order, a cow or goat taken on board a

vessel in Great Britain for the purpose of supplying the passengers or crew with milk on a voyage shall not on being landed in Great Britain at the end of the voyage be deemed to be a foreign animal for the purposes of The Foreign Animals Order, provided the Commissioners of Customs are, before the same is landed, satisfied that it has been taken from Great Britain and has not been landed in a foreign country, and has not been in contact with any foreign animal.

Whereas it hath been represented unto Us that many destructive accidents happen in Mines from explosions and other causes, and that with a view to the prevention of such accidents, and the mitigation of their consequences, it is important to ascertain whether the scientific knowledge at present possessed of the phenomena relating to Mines and operations therein, can contribute any further precautions or appliances suitable for practical adoption:

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue for the purpose of inquiring and reporting, whether, with respect to the influence of fluctuations of atmospheric pressure upon the issue of Fire Damp from Coal; to the adoption and efficient application of trustworthy indicators of the presence of Fire Damp; and, generally, to modes of systematic observation of the Air in Mines; to improved methods of Ventilation and Illumination; to employment of Explosive Agents in the getting of Minerals, and to other particulars relating to Mines and Mining Operations, the resources of Science furnish any practicable expedients that are not now in use, and are calculated to prevent the occurrence of Accidents, or limit their disastrous consequences.

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your ability and discretion, have nominated, constituted, and appointed, and do by these presents nominate, constitute, and appoint you the said Warington Wilkinson Smyth, Sir George Elliot, Frederick Augustus Abel, John Tyndall, Thomas Burt, Robert Bellamy Clifton, William Thomas Lewis, and Lindsay Wood, to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said Inquiry.

And for the better enabling you, Our said Commissioners, to make the said inquiries, We do by

these presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to call before you or any three or more of you, such persons as you may judge necessary, by whom you may be the better informed of the matters herein submitted for your consideration, and every matter connected therewith, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And also to call for and examine all such books, documents, papers, or records, as you shall judge likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject of this Our Commission, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do further by these presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places in Our United Kingdom as you may deem expedient for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any Inquiry which you may hold.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you or any three or more of you, do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, upon the matters referred to you as aforesaid, and that you may have power to certify unto Us from time to time your several proceedings in respect of the matters aforesaid, if it may seem expedient for you so to do.

And We do further will and command, and by these presents ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, shall and may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And for your assistance in the execution of these presents, We do hereby authorize and empower you to appoint a Secretary to this Our Commission, to attend you, whose services and assistance We require you to use from time to time as occasion may require.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Acting Consul at Trieste, enclosing a copy of a Maritime Circular issued by the Austro-Hungarian Government in consequence of the appearance of plague in Russia. A translation of the Circular is appended :—

CIRCULAR No. 974 of the I.R. Maritime Government to all the I.R. Port and Maritime Sanitary Officials and to all the I.R. Consular Officers in Russia.

In accordance with the provisions of the Decree of the I.R. Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce (Code of Laws, cap. VI, Sec. No. 17, of the 2nd January last past) prohibiting the importation and conveyance in transit of various kinds of merchandize coming from Russia, on account of the epidemic prevailing in the Province of Astrachan, and in order to prevent the introduction of contagious diseases, it is ordered, in concert with the R. Hungarian Government :

1. The introduction from Russia by sea, even for conveyance in transit, of any of the following articles into Austro-Hungarian Ports is prohibited, viz. :

Used bed and body linen, used clothes, rags, and refuse of every description, paper shavings, articles of leather and fur, skins and hides, leather, sheep and goat skins, dressed or undressed, bladders, animal entrails, fresh, dry, or salt (d catgut), felt, hair, and wool (including the so-called Zackelwolle), brushes, feathers, caviar, fish, and sarepta balsam.

2. The provisions contained in the preceding paragraph do not refer to the linen, clothes, and other personal effects carried by travellers for their own use. The time when and the mode in which these articles are to be subjected to a disinfecting process are reserved for special provision.

3. The importation and transit of wool coming from Russia are permitted only after previous disinfection. If the wool has been subjected to a cleansing process during manufacture, the disinfecting of the packing materials shall suffice. The disinfection of wool, which has not been so subjected, shall be effected by means of sulphurous acid.

4. The expense of disinfection shall be borne by the parties.

The goods mentioned above (§ 1), shall for the present, in conformity with § 97 of the Maritime Sanitary Regulations, be removed to the Maritime Quarantine Ground, and be there, in closed rooms, isolated from other goods.

The merchandise, the importation of which is not prohibited by the above regulations, shall be admitted without hindrance to free pratique. Before subjecting to disinfection wool which has not previously been submitted to the cleansing process during manufacture, the outside covering must be removed. Those spaces of vessels in which the goods and articles mentioned in § 1, and also uncleansed wool, have been stowed, must, after the said goods have been discharged, be disinfected, cleaned, and ventilated under the superintendence of a special port and sanitary official; and only after this has been effected can the vessel be admitted to free pratique.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt, reporting that, in consequence of the appearance of plague in Russia, vessels arriving from the Black Sea and Sea of Azov with clean bills of health will be subjected to three days' quarantine of observation and medical inspection in Egypt, and that such vessels with foul bills of health will be repelled, as there is no lazaretto on the Mediterranean coast of Egypt; and that, on account of typhus in Roumelia, vessels arriving from Turkish ports between Gallipoli and the Greek frontier, including the adjacent islands, must undergo medical inspection, and susceptible goods brought by them must undergo disinfection, in Egypt.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Vienna enclosing translations of Orders issued by the Austrian Government respecting the precautions to be taken in order to prevent the introduction of disease from Russia. The Orders are as follows :—

ORDER of the Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce, dated February 1st, 1879, respecting the prohibition of import and transit of articles of various kinds from Russia, occasioned by the epidemic raging in the Government of Astrachan.

For the prevention of the introduction of contagious diseases from Russia, it is ordered, in conjunction with the Royal Hungarian Government :—

1. The importation and transit of the following articles from Russia over the frontiers of the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy is prohibited : worn body-linen and bed-linen, worn clothes, rags of all kinds, waste paper, peltry, furs, skins, hides, half-dressed and soft-dressed goat's and sheep's leather, bladders, intestines either fresh or dried, salted intestines (catgut), felt, hair (including the so-called "zackelwolle,") bristles, feathers, caviar, fish, and sarepta balsam.

2. The prohibition contained in paragraph 1 does not apply to linen, clothes, and other baggage which travellers carry with them for their use. In what circumstances and in what manner such articles are to be submitted to disinfection remains the subject of especial dispositions.

3. The importation and transit of wool from Russia is only permitted after previous disinfection : in the case of wool which has undergone factory-washing the disinfection of the package will suffice.

The disinfection of wool which has not undergone factory-washing will take place in closed rooms by means of sulphurous acid.

4. The prohibition of import and transit of bed-feathers, remitted by order of the Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce, of June 7th, 1878, is so far altered, that the importation and transit of bed-feathers from the German Empire is again permitted.

5. The costs of disinfection are to be borne by the parties.

The present Order comes into force on the day of its promulgation.

ORDER of the Ministry of the Interior, dated February 2nd, 1879, respecting the conditions upon which travellers from Russia and their effects will be permitted to cross the frontiers of the Monarchy.

Travellers coming from Russia will only be permitted to cross the frontiers of the Monarchy if their passports bear a declaration from the Imperial Russian authorities that the persons in question have not, within twenty days before the date of this declaration, resided in the Government of Astrachan, or in other Russian Governments in which there prevails the epidemic which has broken out in several villages of the first-named Government : and provided that, with reference to the period elapsed since the official

declaration, the consideration does not exist that the traveller may nevertheless in the interval have stayed in one of those Governments. In the case of travellers who arrive by ship from Russian ports, the period spent at sea is to be considered as equivalent to a period spent upon unsuspected territory. The effects of travellers coming from suspected Governments are to undergo a disinfection at their entry within the frontiers of the Monarchy.

This Order comes into operation eight days after its promulgation.

**GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board:—****Amendment of Consolidated and other Orders.**

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Separate Parishes named in the Schedule to this Order;—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain General and other Orders, addressed by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and the Local Government Board, respectively, to the Guardians of the Poor of each of the Unions and Separate Parishes named in the Schedule to this Order, provision is made for the appointment by such Guardians, from time to time, of persons to hold certain offices, and amongst them the following; namely,—

Master of the Workhouse,  
Matron of the Workhouse,  
Schoolmaster of the Workhouse,  
Schoolmistress of the Workhouse,  
Relieving Officer;

and the said Orders contain the following regulations, or regulations to the like effect, with respect to the continuance in office of such Officers:

“Every Officer appointed to or holding any office under this Order other than a Medical Officer, shall continue to hold the same until he die, or resign, or be removed by the Commissioners, or be proved to be insane, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners.”

“If any Master and Matron hereafter appointed be husband and wife, and one of them should be dismissed by Order of the Commissioners, or should otherwise vacate his or her office, or should die, the other or survivor shall, at the expiration of the then current quarter, cease to hold his or her office of Master or Matron, as the case may be.”

And whereas it is expedient that the regulations above recited should be altered as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:

ARTICLE I.—Instead of the regulations above recited, the following regulations numbered (1) and (2) respectively shall apply to the Officers therein mentioned:

- (1). Every Master, Matron, Schoolmaster, and Schoolmistress of a Workhouse, and every Relieving Officer, appointed after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, shall continue to hold office until he or she die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to the consent of the Local Government Board, or by the Local Government Board, or be proved to be insane by evidence which that Board shall deem sufficient.

Provided that the Guardians may, with the like consent, determine the appointment of any

such Officer at any time before, or at, the expiration of the first year of his or her service, by giving to the Officer three months previous notice in writing, signed by their Clerk, of such their intention.

(2.) In every case where both the Master and Matron are appointed after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and whether they be husband and wife or not, the termination of the office of either of them by death, resignation, insanity, or dismissal as aforesaid shall render the office of the other vacant at the expiration of the then current quarter.

And whereas the above-mentioned Orders contain the following regulation, or a regulation to the like effect, with respect to the division of the said Unions and Separate Parishes into Districts for general and medical relief and the assignment of Relieving Officers and Medical Officers to such Districts :

"The Guardians may from time to time divide the Union into Districts for general and medical relief, with the consent of the Commissioners ; and on any change in the division of the Union into Districts for general and medical relief, or in the assignment of Relieving Officers and Medical Officers to such Districts, the Clerk shall report every such change to the Commissioners for their approbation."

And whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and the tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the said lastly-recited regulation has, as regards certain of the Unions and Separate Parishes named in the Schedule to this Order, been altered in relation to changes in the Districts for medical relief, and as regards the other Unions and Parishes therein named, such alteration has been made applicable or a corresponding alteration has been embodied in other Orders issued to such Unions and Separate Parishes, and it is expedient that such lastly-recited regulation should be altered as hereinafter mentioned, with respect to changes in the Districts for general relief, and the assignment of Relieving Officers to such Districts :

Now therefore, we hereby further Order as follows :

**ARTICLE II.**—Where a change in the extent of the District of a Relieving Officer appointed after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, or where the transfer of any such Relieving Officer from one District to another in the same Union or separate Parish, shall be deemed necessary for the more convenient or efficient administration of relief, or otherwise, and he shall decline to acquiesce in such change or transfer, the Guardians may, with the consent of the Local Government Board, and after six months notice in writing signed by the Clerk and given to such Officer, determine his office.

And whereas by the above-mentioned Orders, and by other Orders of the Poor Law Board and the Local Government Board, the duties of Medical Officers, either for Districts or for Workhouses, are prescribed, and it is expedient to make further provision in that behalf :

Now therefore, we hereby further Order as follows :

**ARTICLE III.** Every Medical Officer appointed by the Guardians after the twenty-eighth day of

February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, whether for a District or a Workhouse, shall immediately upon the occurrence of any case of contagious, infectious, or epidemic disease of a dangerous character amongst the pauper patients under his care, give notice thereof to the Clerk of the Sanitary Authority of the Urban or Rural Sanitary District, as the case may be, within which he acts as Medical Officer, or to the Medical Officer of Health of such Authority.

He shall also furnish from time to time to the Medical Officer of Health of such Sanitary Authority such information with respect to the cases of sickness and the deaths amongst the pauper patients under his care as the Local Government Board may direct, and whenever the Local Government Board shall make regulations for all or any of the purposes specified in Section 134 of The Public Health Act, 1875, he shall observe such regulations as far as the same relate to or concern his office.

And whereas by the Orders firstly before referred to provision was made for payment to District Medical Officers of special remuneration for certain operations, subject to a proviso, for which another proviso was substituted by Article II. of a General Order of the Local Government Board dated the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five ; and it is expedient that the last-named Order should be altered as hereinafter mentioned.

Now therefore, we hereby further Order as follows :

**ARTICLE IV.**—Article II. of the said Order dated the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, shall, on the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, be rescinded, and in lieu thereof the following regulation shall take effect :

After the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, no District Medical Officer shall, except in cases of sudden accident immediately threatening life, be entitled to receive the remuneration prescribed by the firstly before-recited Orders for any amputation unless, before performing it, he shall have obtained, at his own cost, the advice of some person who shall be registered under the Medical Act of 1858, and shall be qualified by Law to practise in England and Wales, either medicine or surgery, or both ; and unless he shall produce to the Guardians a certificate from such person stating that, in his opinion, it was right and proper that such amputation should be then performed.

**ARTICLE V.** In this Order—

The word "Union" includes any Union of Parishes incorporated or united for the relief or maintenance of the Poor under any Act of Parliament ;

The term "Separate Parish" means a Parish or Place which is under a separate Board of Guardians ;

The word "Guardians" includes any Governors, Directors, Acting Guardians, Vestrymen, or other Officers appointed or entitled to act in the distribution or ordering of relief to the Poor from the Poor Rates under any Act of Parliament.
