### *By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATION.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to his Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be opened for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

### *By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the

existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the name be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to Her Royal Highness.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of an Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty's reign chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for assigning certain lands and hereditaments as the permanent endowment of the See of Chester.

"Whereas the Right Reverend William Bishop of Chester succeeded to the said See upon the first avoidance thereof which happened after the passing of the hereinbefore mentioned Act and all the lands hereditaments and emoluments belonging to the said See of Chester (except all rights of patronage or presentation, and the residence of the Bishop) became thereupon vested absolutely in us for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereto annexed which are now vested in us are in the judgment of our Estates Committee convenient to be held as the endowment for the said See, and are approved by the said Bishop as suitable for that purpose and will secure to the holder of the said See as nearly as may be after deducting costs of management a net annual income of four thousand five hundred pounds and no more being the amount

named for the Bishop of the said See by the Order of your Majesty in Council of the twenty-fifth day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one which Order is now in force.

"Now therefore with the consent and approbation of the said William Bishop of Chester testified by his having signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal we humbly recommend and propose that upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly published Order the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereto annexed with their appurtenances and all our right title and interest therein together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax (if any) charged upon the same premises which has been redeemed shall be assigned as the endowment of the said Bishopric of Chester and shall subject always and nevertheless to the liabilities and charges to which the said lands and hereditaments are now specifically liable become and be absolutely vested in the said Bishop and his successors in as full and ample manner as if the same had formed part of the ancient possessions of the said See but saving and reserving thereout to us and our successors all and singular the mines quarries and beds of coal stone clay sand metalliferous substances and minerals of all descriptions under the said lands and the rights of working such minerals as next hereinafter set forth.

"And we further recommend and propose that we and our successors and our and their lessees tenants and assigns shall at all times hereafter have full and exclusive authority to enter upon all or any part of the lands and hereditaments specified in the schedule to this scheme and shall be entitled to take use and occupy from time to time and for such time and in such manner as we or they shall think fit, so much of the same lands and hereditaments as we or they shall deem necessary proper or convenient for the purpose of working all and singular the mines and quarries, if any, in or under the said lands and hereditaments or of sinking and working new mines and quarries in or under the said lands and hereditaments or of working winning getting up and carrying away the beds of coal stone clay sand metalliferous substances and minerals of all descriptions in or under the said lands and hereditaments or for the purpose of working winning getting up or of carrying away the beds of coal stone clay sand metalliferous substances and minerals of all descriptions in or under any other lands and hereditaments whatsoever whether belonging or to belong to ourselves or to any other body corporate or person whomsoever according to the course and practice at present or hereafter to be used or adopted in the county of York or according to the most improved mode which may from time to time be used or invented making full compensation for any injury thereby occasioned and that we and our successors and our and their lessees tenants and assigns, and persons acting under our or their authority shall be entitled to make grant and use for the purpose of working winning getting up or of carrying away the beds of coal stone clay and metalliferous substances and minerals of all descriptions in or under the lands and hereditaments comprised in the said schedule and in or under any other lands and hereditaments whatsoever whether belonging or to belong to ourselves or to any other body corporate or person whomsoever any way or ways upon across under or through the lands and hereditaments comprised in the same schedule, making full compensation

for any injury thereby occasioned provided always and we hereby further recommend and propose that the said William Bishop of Chester and his successors shall have full power and liberty of taking and using so much of the clay sand gravel limestone and freestone in or under the said lands as he shall require for erecting making and repairing farmhouses and buildings roads and ways on the same lands or for fencing draining and manuring the same lands or for any other purpose of agriculture and husbandry such clay sand gravel limestone and freestone to be expended by the said William Bishop of Chester and his successors on the said lands and hereditaments.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said Bishop shall become entitled to the rents profits and proceeds of the lands and hereditaments hereby proposed to be assigned as the endowment of the said See as from the twenty-ninth day of September one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the said hereinbefore mentioned Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

### " SCHEDULE.

NOTE.—The Lands here described are all in the township of Raskelfe in the parish of Easingwold in the county of York, excepting the Plantations and Allotments numbered 445, 445a, 446, 446a, 447, 447a, 447b, and 448, which are in the township of Tholthorpe in the parish of Alne in the same county.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirtieth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine in the words following; that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew situate within the limits of the parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich, of the district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich, in the said county of Stafford, and in the said diocese of Lichfield, of the new parish of Saint Peter, West Bromwich, in the same county and diocese, and of the new parish of Saint James Hill Top, also in the same county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective cures.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich, of the said district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich, of the said new parish of Saint Peter, West Bromwich, and of the said new parish of Saint James, Hill Top, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew situate within the limits of the parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Dalrymple, Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield who also is the patron, in right of his See, both of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter West Bromwich and of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint James Hill Top, with the consent of the Right Honourable William Walter, Earl of Dartmouth who is the patron of the vicarage of the said parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich, and with the consents of the said William Walter, Earl of Dartmouth, of Arthur Wright, of Highfields, West Bromwich aforesaid, Solicitor, of Henry Williams, of Rockingham Hall, Hagley, Stourbridge, in the county of Worcester, Esquire, of Walter Williams of Creswell Hall in the said county of Stafford, Esquire, of Thomas Bache

Salter, of Roebuck-lane, West Bromwich aforesaid, Esquire, of William Cottrell, of Hill House Farm, West Bromwich aforesaid, Farmer, of Thomas Jesson, of Beacon-street, in the city of Lichfield, Esquire, and of Joshua Fellowes, of Churchfields, West Bromwich aforesaid, Farmer, who or some of whom are the patrons of the vicarage of the said district parish of Christ Church, West Bromwich (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich, of the said district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich, of the said new parish of Saint Peter, West Bromwich, and of the said new parish of Saint James, Hill Top, which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Andrew, situate within the limits of the parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, West Bromwich.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, West Bromwich, being:—

"All those several contiguous portions of the parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich, of the district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich, of the new parish of Saint Peter, West Bromwich, and of the new parish of Saint James, Hill Top, all in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich from the district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich aforesaid at the point at or near to Carter's Green, where High-street, John-street, and Gun's-lane, all meet and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said Gun's-lane for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the main line of the Great Western Railway) to the point on the south western side of the said line of railway where the said lane is joined by Richard's-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dartmouth-street and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction at Cutler's End with Oak-lane, with Wood-lane, and with Gad's-lane, and continuing thence still south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of eighteen and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction at Ireland Green with Oak-road, and with Albion-road and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-five and a half-chains or thereabouts (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich from the new parish of Saint Peter West Brom-

wich aforesaid) to the centre of the bridge which carries the same road over the Birmingham Canal and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of of the said canal for a distance of one mile and sixteen chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter West Bromwich from the new parish of Saint James, Hill Top aforesaid) to the point near the southern side of the line of the Great Bridge Branch of the said Great Western Railway where the same Canal is joined by the Ridgeacre Branch of the said Birmingham Canal, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-named branch canal for a distance of seventy-seven and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Hill Top from the parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich aforesaid) to the centre of Ridgeacre Bridge which carries Church-lane over the same branch canal and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with the public footpath leading into Hargate-lane and extending thence that is from Church-lane aforesaid first southward and then south-eastward, along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of forty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hargate-lane aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Mill-street and with Sandwell-road and continuing thence still south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts (thereby following the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of West Bromwich from the district parish of Christ Church West Bromwich aforesaid) to the point where the same road joins High-street aforesaid and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts (thereby continuing to follow the last-mentioned boundary) to the first-described point at or near to Carter's Green aforesaid, where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding

"of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing, (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration, in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the Assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen; and for other purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That any such scheme or modification may be drawn up according to the regulations and directions in such Act contained, subject to the consent, in writing, of the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, under his or their hands, notwithstanding the vacancy of such benefice or benefices, and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council thereupon to make an Order for carrying such scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect, and such Order being registered in the registry of the diocese, as directed by the said Act, shall come into operation, and shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, notwithstanding such vacancy or vacancies;" and it is, by the same

Act further enacted, "That when by any order of Her Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges, and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole and exclusive cure of souls."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Worcester hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I, Henry Bishop of Worcester, beg leave to represent to your Grace that the parish of Bishop's Itchington in the county of Warwick and diocese of Worcester comprises two chapelries known by the names of Gaydon and Chadshunt respectively the boundaries of which are well known and defined.

"That each of the said chapelries contains a consecrated building or chapel in which Divine service has been celebrated for many years, the said two chapels being distant about a mile and a half from each other and about four miles from the parish church of Bishop's Itchington.

"That the populations of the said chapelries of Gaydon and Chadshunt are about 300 and 32 respectively; and the population of the remaining part of the parish of Bishop's Itchington is about six hundred and fifty-five.

"That the net annual value of the vicarage of Bishop's Itchington, arising from land and tithe rent-charge is about five hundred and fifty pounds; whereof about one hundred and thirty pounds arises from tithe rent-charge and about two hundred and twenty pounds from glebe land within the limits of the said chapelries; the remainder, namely, about two hundred pounds arising from tithe rent-charge in the remaining part of the parish exclusive of the said chapelries.

"That there is a convenient house of residence for the vicar situate near the church of Bishop's Itchington.

"That in the event of the separation of the chapelries of Gaydon and Chadshunt from the parish of Bishop's Itchington for ecclesiastical purposes and the formation of them into an independent new parish, and the whole of the income arising from land and tithe rent-charge within the said chapelries being assigned as an endowment for the said new parish, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have undertaken to augment the remaining income of Bishop's Itchington to three hundred pounds per annum.

"That in the same event the chief landowner of Chadshunt has offered to give one acre of land as the site of a parsonage house for the said new parish and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have undertaken to grant a capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds towards the costs of building a parsonage upon such site.

"That the vicarage of Bishop's Itchington is now vacant by the death of the late incumbent, and that the patronage is vested in the Bishop of Worcester for the time being.

"That it appears to me, upon consideration of the circumstances above stated, that the said chapelries of Gaydon and Chadshunt may, under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament 1 and 2 Victoria, c. 106, and 2 and 3 Victoria, c. 49, be advantageously separated from the said parish of Bishop's Itchington and be together constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I have drawn up a scheme in writing, appended to this representation, describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage may be made with justice to all parties interested; and I beg leave to submit the same to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may, if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme, certify the same to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this sixth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

*"H. Worcester."*

And whereas the scheme and consent mentioned in the said Representation are in the words following:—

"SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Representation.

"It is proposed to separate the two chapelries of Gaydon and Chadshunt from the parish of Bishop's Itchington, to which they belong, and to constitute them a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy, to be called the parish and perpetual curacy of Gaydon and Chadshunt, of which the consecrated building or chapel of Gaydon shall be the parish church.

"That such perpetual curacy shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the vicarage of Bishop's Itchington.

"That there shall be assigned and attached to the separate parish and perpetual curacy of Gaydon and Chadshunt so to be constituted, all the glebe land now belonging to the vicarage of Bishop's Itchington and situate within the limits of the said chapelries of Gaydon and Chadshunt, together with all the tithe rent-charge also now belonging to the vicarage of Bishop's Itchington and arising within the limits of the said two chapelries.

"That baptisms, churchings, marriages and burials shall be performed in the church of the benefice, so to be constituted; and that the fees for all such offices performed within the limits of the said benefice, and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said benefice and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the incumbent of the said intended perpetual curacy or benefice of Gaydon and Chadshunt.

"That the incumbent of the said intended perpetual curacy shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits thereof.

"That the right of nominating a minister to the church of the said perpetual curacy and benefice shall be for ever vested in the Bishop of Worcester for the time being.

"That the first fruits, twenty-six pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, and tenths, two pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, now charged upon the vicarage of Bishop's Itchington shall be apportioned as follows; namely, the vicarage of

Bishop's Itchington shall be subject to thirteen pounds six shillings and eight pence first fruits, and one pound six shillings and eight pence tenths; and the perpetual curacy of Gaydon and Chadshunt to thirteen pounds six shillings and eight pence first fruits, and one pound six shillings and eight pence tenths.

"H. Worcester.

"I the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Bishop's Itchington in the county of Warwick and diocese of Worcester (the same being now vacant) do hereby signify my consent to the annexed scheme proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this twelfth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

"H. Worcester."

And whereas the said Lord Bishop hath transmitted the said scheme to the said Lord Archbishop together with the said consent.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consent as aforesaid, to Her Majesty in Council, by his report dated the 14th day of February, 1879, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester has represented unto us (amongst other things):—

"That the parish of Bishop's Itchington in the county of Warwick and diocese of Worcester comprises two chapelries known by the names of Gaydon and Chadshunt respectively the boundaries of which are well known and defined.

That each of the said chapelries contains a consecrated building or chapel in which Divine service has been celebrated for many years past the said two chapels being distant about a mile and a half from each other and about four miles from the parish church of Bishop's Itchington.

That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelries may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106, and the second and third years of your Majesty's reign chapter 49 be advantageously separated from the said parish of Bishop's Itchington and be together constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rates and payments and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consent thereto in writing of the patron of the said benefice (which is now vacant) has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consent before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter

106 certify the same and such consent as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

"As witness our hand this fourteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and it is hereby order that the said scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Worcester be carried into effect.

THE following Despatch has been received at the Admiralty from Commodore Sullivan:—

FORWARDING REPORTS ON THE ENGAGEMENTS AT INYEZANE AND ISANDHLWANA.

"Active," off Natal,  
February 3, 1879.

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to forward herewith the report of Commander Campbell on the engagement with the enemy of the column under Colonel Pearson, on 22nd ultimo, at Inyezane.

2. Their Lordships will learn with pleasure the distinguished part taken by the Naval Brigade in this action, and the gallant behaviour of Commander Campbell, Lieutenant Hamilton, and other officers mentioned in the report.

3. I beg to recommend Commander Campbell to the especial consideration of their Lordships. His zeal and energy are ever conspicuous; and I learn from unofficial but reliable sources that his skill and courage on this occasion were remarkably so.

4. Lieutenant Craigie has rendered good service both during the late war in the Cape Colony, when his services were brought to their Lordships' notice, and again during the present war; he but narrowly escaped with his life a few weeks ago, being swept into river when working the pontoon at the time D. Martin, A.B., was drowned.

5. Lieutenant Hamilton's gallantry has before been brought to their Lordships' notice, and was by all accounts I have received especially conspicuous on this occasion. I rely with confidence on his merits being duly appreciated by their Lordships.

6. Sub-Lieutenant Fraser is mentioned as having done good service.

7. Lieutenant Dowding, Royal Marine Light Infantry, appears to have handled his men with skill, and to have shown here, as he did in the late war in the Cape Colony, all the attributes of a good soldier.

8. Mr. L. Coker, Midshipman, under considerable difficulties, brought his gun into action with promptitude, gallantry, and skill, and I learn by reliable sources did considerable execution with the Gatling under his charge.

9. Mr. Cotton, Boatswain, also, as stated by Colonel Pearson in his despatch "contributed to the success of the day with the rockets under his charge." He is an old and valuable officer, and did good service with the pontoons at the Tugela drift. He also served in the trenches during the Crimean war before Sevastopol. I commend him to their Lordships' favourable consideration.

10. Commander Campbell has also brought to my notice the gallantry of Thomas Harding, Ordinary Seaman, H.M.S. "Active," who was the first unmounted man in the enemy's position. (I may here remark that I have seen by letters from persons present that Commander Campbell himself and Captain Hart, Staff Officer to Natal Native Contingent, both being mounted, were together the first in.) I have in consequence rated him A.B. from the date of the action, but I venture to recommend him for some special mark of Her Majesty's favour.

11. I beg also to recommend to their Lordships' favourable notice E. White, P.O., 1 Cl. and E. Fletcher, P.O. 2 Cl., H.M.S. "Active" under the circumstances mentioned in Commander Campbell's Despatch.

12. Colonel Pearson in his report, a copy of which is attached, thus speaks of Staff Surgeon Norbury, H.M.S. "Active," :—"I cannot speak too highly of the energy and attention to their duties of Staff Surgeon Norbury, R.N., my senior medical officer and his assistants. The Field Hospital was established in a convenient place almost immediately after the firing began, and the wounded received every assistance."

It will be in their Lordships' recollection that I felt it my duty to recommend Dr. Norbury for promotion at the close of the late war for his services in the Transkei, it is with much gratification that I again bring his name under their Lordships' notice.

13. Surgeon William Thompson, R.N., H.M.S. "Active," was one of the assistants commended by Colonel Pearson.

14. In conclusion, I feel it but justice to again revert to the services of Commander Campbell during these operations.

Upon him devolved the whole onus of transporting the troops, their artillery, baggage, train, &c., across the Tugela River which happily by his skill and constant watchfulness was accomplished without loss (with the exception of one man) or delay. The Tugela, about 300 yards wide, is always a rapid river, and after rain a foaming torrent. It will be observed by Colonel Pearson's Despatch that his suggestions met with that officer's immediate approval, and were subsequently carried out by the commander with skill and gallantry.

15. Commander Campbell has been nearly nine years in that rank, has been 27 years in the service, and already wears several medals. I confidently recommend him to their Lordships for promotion.

I forward also herewith the report, plans, and notes thereon of the lamentable affair at Isandhlwana received by me from Lieutenant Milne, R.N., and A.D.C. to Lieutenant-General Lord Chelmsford, which appears to me to be remarkably lucid, and to do that officer much credit.

SIR,

*Ekwoe, January 28, 1879.*

IN continuation of my letter No. 13, of 24th instant, I have to report that no change has taken place in the distribution of the Naval Brigade.

Roughly speaking, nearly one-half of No. 1 column is employed, escorting convoys from the Tugela, and the other half, the largest, fortifying this place and preparing it for the depôt by which the whole fore in Zululand are in future to be supplied; a hospital is also to be established here.

Until a considerable quantity of stores, &c., are collected here, it is not intended that this column should advance further; this will perhaps occupy ten days more.

We are in constant expectation of a night attack, the alarm being given every night as well as the usual muster of everyone at the "alarm posts" two hours before day break.

No enemy have been seen since the battle of 22nd instant.

It seems the number of the enemy killed and wounded at the battle of Inyezane was underestimated, some of the convoys have passed over the ground since and found more bodies, which leads to the supposition that the killed must have been at least 400, and the wounded to double that amount.

Two of the wounded on our side have since died making our total loss as follows:—

Europeans—Killed 10; wounded 6; total 16.

Seven of the Europeans killed belong to the Native Contingent.

The wounded of the naval brigade are progressing favourably.

George Doran, bullet in thigh, bullet cannot be found, but he suffers no pain and seems doing well.

George Berryman, bullet in thigh, doing well.

H. Gosling, A.B., wounded in hand, doing well.

T. Butler, E. White, J. Ropeyarn, J. Lewis, slightly wounded, are well.

In addition to above two oxen drawing the rocket cart were wounded.

G. Berryman was knocked down by a bullet through his helmet just before being struck in the thigh.

George May, ditto.

The five white men were wounded on the hill when the Zulus were being driven back along the path by the A Company of Naval Brigade, and the right half of B Company; it will be observed that four men out of the five wounded belong to A Company which led the advance through.

Colonels Pearson and Parnell both had their horses shot under them as well as one of the mounted orderlies.

Other animals were also wounded and one ox killed.

Ammunition expended by the naval brigade at battle of Inyezane.

11 Rockets; 2,400 rounds Martini-Henry; 300 rounds Gatling.

I regret not having been able to inform you of the battle by the first messenger, but was unaware of his being sent.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Koenigsberg reporting that the precautionary measures taken in Germany on account of plague in Russia have been modified to some extent in favour of persons living near the borders of the two countries, so that persons furnished with two days' passport cards are allowed to cross the frontier. In cases of doubt as to the correctness of the passport cards the bearers are sent back. On the arrival of trains from Russia at the border, passports are examined in the Russian coupés, and only those persons are allowed to pass on to the German Custom-house revision saloon whose passports have the visa of a German Consular official. All other persons, without regard to nationality, are sent back to Russia.

The Consul adds that considerable quantities of grain and flax have lately passed the frontiers from Russia to the interior of Germany.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Notice issued by the Danish Government, prescribing further measures of precaution in consequence of the plague in Russia. The following is a translation of the Notice in question:—

## PUBLIC NOTICE.

Referring to the Plague Quarantine Law, passed on the 18th of February last, and to the Notice in connection therewith, issued the day following, prohibiting the importation from Russia of sundry specified articles, the present Supplementary Notice is now published, together with rules for putting in force the prohibition in question.

Sec. 1. To the list of prohibited goods from Russia shall be added "wool," when not cleansed at the place of manufacture.

Sec. 2. The Quarantine Inspectors shall see that every shipmaster coming from a Russian port, shall have put to him (besides the questions required by Sec. 7 of the Law of 8th February, 1805,) the questions, "If he has on board any of the prohibited articles specified in the Notice of the 19th February, 1879," and "If the ship is provided with the certificate" (Bill of Health) mentioned in that Notice.

Shipmasters coming from other foreign ports, shall be questioned as to whether on the journey they have received on board any of the above-mentioned articles from ships cleared out from Russian ports.

Sec. 3. The certificate referred to in Sec. 2 shall specially mention every person it includes.

Sec. 4. Ships entering Danish jurisdiction, and having on board any of the prohibited articles scheduled in the Notice of 19th February of this year, shall not be permitted to land them without the special permission of the Quarantine Inspectors; neither, shall any person or persons be permitted to land until their wearing apparel and luggage are thoroughly disinfected.

The necessity of disinfection does not apply to pilots and persons who for short periods, and under the supervision of the Quarantine Inspectors, have been in communication with such ships.

Sec. 5. In stranding casualties, and cases where goods and wreckage are cast on shore, when no proof exists that they (the vessel and goods) do not come under the prohibition of importation from Russia, the above rules are to be followed, with due regard, however, to the necessities of each case, and to the saving of life.

But in no case shall any part of the salvage property, consisting of prohibited articles, be landed; but if they cannot, without assistance from ashore, be got rid of, they shall be destroyed, without any compensation being allowed.

Sec. 6. The disinfecting process for linen, clothes, and luggage referred to in the preceding section, and in the Notice of the 19th February last, shall,

if possible, be effected by means of a disinfecting oven, which shall be heated to 120° Celsius.

In the absence of this means, or where it cannot be applied, exposure during six hours to the fumes of sulphur in a close room or space shall be used, in the proportion of one kvint (five grammes) of sulphur for every cubic ell (two Danish feet). Trunks and cases in which luggage has been packed shall be carefully washed with a solution of one part of chloride of zinc to fifty parts of water.

Sec. 7. This Notice comes into force immediately, and is hereby brought to the notice of the public.

A Tramway (No. 7) situate wholly in the township of Windle and borough of St. Helens, in the parish of Prescott, commencing by a junction with Tramway No. 3 in Ormskirk-street, at a point 70 links or thereabouts east of the junction of Bridge-street and Ormskirk-street, passing thence along Church-street to the junction of Church-street with Raven-street, along Raven-street and terminating in Shaw-street by a junction with Tramway No. 5 at a point 60 links or thereabouts north of the junction of Raven-street and Shaw-street.

A Tramway (No. 8) situate wholly in the township of Windle and borough of St. Helens, in the parish of Prescott, commencing by a junction with Tramway No. 2 in Ormskirk-street, at a point 80 links or thereabouts south-east of the junction of Westfield-street and Ormskirk-street, passing thence across Baldwin-street into Cotham-street and terminating in Cotham-street by a junction with Tramway

No. 4 at a point half a chain or thereabouts east of the junction of Baldwin-street and Cotham-street.

In the following instance it is proposed to lay one of the said tramways along the streets and between the points hereinafter mentioned, so that, for a distance of 30 feet or upwards, a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the footpath on the side of the streets and the nearest rail of the tramway (that it is to say):—

In the Township of Windle, Borough of Saint Helens, Parish of Prescott.

It is intended to extend to the said tramways such of the powers and provisions contained in the Bill with respect to the tramways therein described as may be applicable to the tramways above described and to make such amendments in the Bill and add such clauses thereto as have been agreed or may hereafter be agreed upon between the Corporation of St. Helens and other Local and Road Authorities and persons in relation to the purchase of land and as to sewers, roads, county bridges, deposit of money, variation of tolls, regulation of tramways and tramcars, bye-laws, and appointment of special officers and other purposes.

To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with any of the objects aforesaid and to confer other rights and privileges.

And notice is hereby further given that duplicate plans and sections of the tramways above described, together with a book of reference thereto, and also a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, will, on or before the 15th day of March next, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Lancaster, at his office, in Preston, in that county, and on or before the same day a copy of the said plans, sections, and book of reference, together with a copy of the Gazette notice will also be deposited with the parish clerk for the parish of Prescott, and with the Town Clerk of the borough of St. Helens, at their respective residences.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—EFFECTS, 1878-9.
