The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is

Her Majesty's command that no presentations should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the change consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph hath made a representation in writing to His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury:—

"I the Right Reverend Joshua by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. That to the vicarage and parish church of Llansilin in the counties of Denbigh and Salop and within my diocese of Saint Asaph belong (amongst other places) the district of Llanerch-gron-glywd in the township of Rhiwlas-is-foel and the districts of Fochddu, Bryncoch-uchaf and Bryncoch-isaf in the township of Lledrod the limits and boundaries of which said districts and townships respectively are well known and defined.

"2. That according to the last census the population of Llansilin including the said districts is one thousand seven hundred and sixty-two and the population of the said district is estimated at forty or thereabout.

"3. That the parish church of Llansilin affords accommodation for five hundred persons or thereabout.

"4. That the net annual income of the said vicarage of Llansilin amounts to two hundred and seventy-nine pounds or thereabout arising from vicarial tithes commutation rent-charge the rent of glebe land and surplice fees.

"5. That in the said counties of Denbigh and Salop and within my diocese of Saint Asaph are the rectory and parish church of Rhydygroesau a benefice which was erected by forming into a consolidated chapelry district certain contiguous portions of the said parish of Llansilin and of the parishes of Llanyblodwell Oswestry and Selattyn in the said county of Salop as appears by an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the twenty-third day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-four and published in the London Gazette of the twenty-third day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-four.

"6. That the population of Rhydygroesau according to the last census is three hundred and thirty-one and the church of Rhydygroesau affords accommodation for two hundred persons or thereabout.

"7. That the net annual value of the said rectory of Rhydygroesau amounts to one hundred and ten pounds or thereabout arising from tithes commutation rent-charge the rent of glebe land and surplice fees.

"8. That the patronage of the said vicarage and parish church of Llansilin and of the said rectory and parish church of Rhydygroesau belongs to me in right of my See of Saint Asaph.

"9. That the Reverend David Davies is the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Llansilin and the Reverend Robert Williams is the rector of the said rectory of Rhydygroesau.

"10. That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106 intituled 'An Act to abridge the holding of Benefices in Plurality and to make better provision for the residence of the Clergy' the said district of Llanerch-gron-glywd in the said township of Rhiwlas-is-foel and the said districts of Fochddu Bryncoch-uchaf and Bryncoch-isaf in the township of Lledrod which lie at a considerable distance from the parish church of Llansilin but within

a much shorter distance from the parish church of Rhydycroesau may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish of Llansilin and be united to the said rectory and parish of Rhydycroesau for ecclesiastical purposes.

"11. That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament I have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rights and payments and in respect to rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of myself as the patron of the said benefices of Llansilin and Rhydycroesau and of the incumbents of the said benefices respectively to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and such consents as aforesaid by your report to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are in the words and figures following:—

"The SCHEME referred to by the foregoing Representation.

"1. That there shall be separated from the vicarage and parish of Llansilin in the counties of Denbigh and Salop and within the diocese of Saint Asaph and be united to and be and be deemed part and parcel of the rectory and parish of Rhydycroesau in the said counties of Denbigh and Salop and within the said diocese of Saint Asaph for ecclesiastical purposes the district of Llanerch-gron-glywd in the township of Rhiwlas-is-foel and the Districts of Fochddu Bryncoch-uchaf and Bryncoch-isaf in the township of Lledrod.

"2. That the said several districts shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said rectory of Rhydycroesau and the rector of the said rectory of Rhydycroesau shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same districts.

"3. That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for marriages churchings burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said districts respectively shall henceforth belong to the rector of the said rectory and parish church of Rhydycroesau.

"4. That the parishioners of and residing in the said districts respectively shall not henceforth be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Llansilin but shall be entitled in common with the inhabitants of the said parish of Rhydycroesau to accommodation in the parish church of Rhydycroesau and shall be exempt from all liability to repair the parish church of Llansilin but shall be liable (subject to the provisions of 'The Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act 1868') to the repair of the said parish church of Rhydycroesau.

" CONSENTS.

"We the Right Reverend Joshua by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph being in right of the See of Saint Asaph the patron of or the person entitled to collate to the said vicarage and parish church of Llansilin and to the rectory and parish church of Rhydycroesau in case the same were now respectively vacant the Reverend

David Davies the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Llansilin and the Reverend Robert Williams the rector of the said rectory and parish church of Rhydycroesau do hereby respectively signify our consent to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained. In witness whereof we have respectively hereto set our hands the twenty-fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

And whereas the said Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph hath transmitted the said scheme to the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop of Canterbury being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council by his report in writing dated the 4th day of March 1879, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Joshua Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That to the vicarage and parish church of Llansilin in the counties of Denbigh and Salop and within the diocese of Saint Asaph (amongst other places) the district of Llanerch-gron-glywd in the township of Rhiwlas-is-foel and the districts of Fochddu Bryncoch-uchaf and Bryncoch-isaf in the township of Lledrod the limits and boundaries of which said districts and townships respectively are well known and defined.

"That in the said counties of Denbigh and Salop and within the said diocese of Saint Asaph are the rectory and parish church of Rhydycroesau.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106 intituled 'An Act to abridge the holding of Benefices in Plurality and to make better provision for the residence of the Clergy' the said district of Llanerch-gron-glywd in the said township of Rhiwlas-is-foel and the said districts of Fochddu Bryncoch-uchaf and Bryncoch-isaf in the township of Lledrod which lie at a considerable distance from the parish church of Llansilin but within a much shorter distance from the parish church of Rhydycroesau may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish of Llansilin and be united to the rectory and parish of Rhydycroesau for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing appended to his representation describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rates and payments and in respect to rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the said Lord Bishop as the patron of each of the benefices to be affected and of the incumbents of the same benefices has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration,

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

"As witness our hand this fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered that the said scheme of the Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph for separating the district of Llanerch-gron-glwyd in the township of Rhiwlas-is-foel, and the districts of Fochddu, Bryncoch-uchaf and Bryncoch-isaf in the township of Lledrod from the vicarage and parish of Llansilin and uniting the said districts to the rectory and parish of Rhydycroesau, for ecclesiastical purposes, be carried into effect.

PORT OF LIVERPOOL (BIRKENHEAD).

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Liverpool, in the county of Chester, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space at the Wallasey dock, in the borough of Birkenhead, and the township of Poolton-cum-Seacombe, situate on the east and north-east sides of the said dock, bounded by a line commencing on the Wallasey landing-stage at a point forty feet or thereabouts from the south-east corner of the said stage, thence running in an angular direction westwardly for seventy-five feet or thereabouts, thence in an angular line northwardly for two hundred and sixty feet, thence westwardly two hundred and twenty feet along

the south side of the north bridge connecting the said stage with the river wall, thence running in a straight line northwardly six hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts, thence in a north-west direction for a length of ninety feet to the south-east corner of certain cattle-pens, slaughter-house and premises, thence in a straight line westwardly for a length of four hundred and forty-eight feet along the south side of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-house and premises, thence in a straight line northwardly for a length of one hundred and thirty-six feet along the west side of the said cattle-pens and premises, thence eastwardly for a length of one hundred and forty feet along the north side of the said cattle-pens and premises, thence northwardly for a length of eighty-five feet along the west side of the said slaughter-house and premises thence in a straight line eastwardly for a length of three hundred feet along the north side of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-house and premises, thence in a straight line southwardly for a length of two hundred and sixty feet along the east side of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-house and premises, thence continuing southwardly for a length of six hundred and forty feet or thereabouts, to near the top of the said north bridge to the said stage, thence eastwardly two hundred and ten feet along the north side of the said north bridge, thence eastwardly in an angular line for a length of seventy-five feet, and thence southwardly along the eastern face of the said stage for a length of two hundred and seventy feet to the point aforesaid, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of the Wallasey dock deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Town Clerk of the borough of Birkenhead, and the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Chester.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Goole, in the West Riding of the county of York, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space in the town and port of Goole, in the West Riding of the county of York, situate on the west side of the Railway Dock, included within a boundary line commencing on its north side at a point at the edge of the coping on the west side of the Railway Dock at a distance of two hundred and forty-five and a half feet from the north-west corner thereof, proceeding in a westerly direction sixty feet and bounded by a gate and wooden fence, thence in a northerly direction sixty-nine feet and bounded by a shed and wooden fence, thence to a point in a further westerly direction one hundred and thirty feet and bounded by sheds and wooden fence, thence in a southerly direction a distance of ninety-seven feet and bounded by a gate and wooden fence, and in a westerly direction fifteen feet and bounded by a wooden fence, thence to a point in a further southerly direction thirty feet therefrom and bounded by the brick pier of the railway viaduct, such last-mentioned point being situate on the south side of the new mineral viaduct, thence in an easterly direction on the south side of the said viaduct a distance of one hundred and sixty-six

feet and bounded by a wooden fence and brick piers, thence in a northerly direction thirty-feet and bounded by a brick pier, and in an easterly direction a further distance of forty-one feet and bounded by a gate, wooden fence, and brick pier to a point at the edge of the coping on the west side of the Railway Dock at a distance of two hundred and eighty and a half feet from the north-west corner of the said Dock, thence in a northerly direction thirty-five feet to the point first-named, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the Port of Goole deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the West Riding of the county of York.
