In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presesentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the eards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department),

Whitehall Gardens, April 16, 1879. THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a translation of an Order of the Austrian Government respecting quarantine, which is as follows:-

ORDER of the Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce, dated the 8th April, 1879, respecting the restriction of the prohibition of Importation and Transit of Goods enacted against Russia by the Order of 1st February, 1879, with reference to the danger of Plague.

The Order of the Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce, dated 1st February, 1879, respecting the prohibition of importation and transit from Russia of several kinds of goods is, in accordance with the understanding come to with the Royal Hungarian Government, rescinded, except as regards the prohibition of importation and transit of worn body and bed linen, worn clothes, and rags of all kinds, which remains in force until further notice.

The prohibition of the importation and transit of bed feathers, published by the Order of the Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce of 7th June, 1878, and, with reference only to the German Empire, rescinded by the Order of the 1st of February, 1879, is put out of operation for all the frontiers of the whole Austro-Hungarian, as well as the Dalmatian, Customs' territory.

The present Order comes into force on the day of its publication.

METALLIFEROUS MINES REGULATION ACT, 1872.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17). WHEREAS by Section 68 of the above-named Act, it is provided as follows :--

"The Council of any Borough which is assessed to the county rate of any county by the Justices of such county, and the Commissioners of any Improvement District, may, by order of a Secretary of State made upon the application of such Council

or Commissioners, and published in the London Gazette, be declared to be a Local Authority for the purposes of this Act, and thereupon shall become a Local Authority accordingly for such part of their borough or district as is not included in any harbour, to the exclusion of the Justices in Petty Sessions :"

And whereas an application has been made to me by the Council of the city of Durham to be declared a Local Authority for the purposes of the said Act, in accordance with the provision aforesaid.

Now I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby, in virtue of the powers contained in the said section, declare the said Council of the city of Durham to be a Local Authority for the purposes of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the Next of Kin or others entitled, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the London Gazette, and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.— EFFECTS, 1878-9.
