In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is

THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Consul at Cadiz a translation of a notice issued by the Captain of the port at San Lucar relative to a new pilot station at Chipiona Point. The translation is as follows:—

In consequence of the great risk incurred, before receiving a pilot, by vessels approaching this port when there is much sea on the bar, the pilot service has been, by Royal Order, divided into two parts or zones, the outer extending from

Chipiona outwards to sea, and the inner from Chipiona inwards to Montijo as heretofore.

On account of extra risk and exposure, wear and tear of boats, &c., the pilots of the outer zone will be entitled to an extra pilotage, over and above the tariff, of 15 or 20 pesetas, according as draft of the ship piloted be more or less than 10 Spanish feet.

This pilotage is, however, not compulsory, and the pilot before taking charge is bound to show the master of the vessel a paper on which this extra charge is stated in French, English, and Spanish; the master is then free to accept his services or not, as he may think proper.

With respect to the inner zone, the pilotage continues, as heretofore, compulsory for all vessels not coasters, both Spanish and foreign.

The extra pilotage abovementioned is exclusively for the benefit of the pilots who perform the service, and is intended to stimulate them to the punctual and active performance of their duties at all times when the state of the sea permits them to board vessels arriving off the port.

SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the Next of Kin or others entitled, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the London Gazette, and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—EFFECTS, 1878-9.
