THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs despatches from the Acting British Consul at Ragusa, and the British Chargé d'Affaires at Vienna, reporting that on the 1st of January next, or as near as practicable to that date, Dalmatia will be brought within the General Tariff System of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, and that as a necessary consequence, most articles imported into that Province will be subject to higher duties than heretofore.
