**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 23rd day of December, 1879.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. So much of the area declared, by Order of Council dated the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease as was not declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease by Order of Council dated the seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine (namely),—the whole of the petty sessional division of Bottisham, in the county of Cambridge,—is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that portion of that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, also cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

## TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 5th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £1,585,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 9th day of January, 1880, and will be payable at three or six months after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz. :—on the 9th April or 9th July next, respectively.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount, per cent., which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 6th proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Friday, the 9th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

Zanzibar Harbour—Prohibited Anchorage near Telegraph Cables.

THE Government of Zanzibar has given notice, that in order to afford protection to the shore ends of the two telegraph cables in Zanzibar Harbour, which are laid down from Bawi Island
