"Whereas by the 20th section of an Act passed in the 29th year of your Majesty's reign, chapter eighty-nine, entitled 'The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865,' it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks, and Servants, for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of your Majesty in Council) fix the Salaries of such Officers and Clerks;

"We beg leave to submit that your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to authorize the following Establishment and Scale of Salaries of Officers, Clerks and others who are employed on duties connected with the administration of the Funds of Greenwich Hospital, and for the purposes of Greenwich Hospital School, viz. :—

"GREENWICH HOSPITAL BRANCH, ADMIRALTY.

"Superintendent £850 per annum, to be succeeded by a Senior Clerk, from £400, rising £20 annually to £650, with an allowance of £50 a year.

"A Clerk of the Higher Division, from £100, rising £10, after eight years £15, and after seventeen years, £20 annually to £500 a year, with an allowance of £100 a year.

"2 Lower Division Clerks, from £90, rising by triennial increments of £15 to £250 a year.

"One of the foregoing to receive an allowance of £50 a year for auditing locally the wages and store and other accounts of the Royal Naval College and Greenwich Hospital School: one moiety of this allowance to be chargeable to Naval Funds, the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury having signified their concurrence.

"A Civil Service Copyist.

"When the Playfair scheme comes into operation, the Branch to be as follows, viz. :—

"2 Clerks—£100 rising to £400 a year.

"2 Lower Division Clerks, from £90, rising by triennial increments of £15 to £250 a year.

"Duty-pay for Head of the Branch, £250 a year.

"Superintendent from £400, rising £25 annually to £500 a year (with residence). (The present holder of the office to receive £550 a year.)

"Medical Officer £350 a year (with residence).

"Chaplain £200 a year (with residence).

"† Cashier and Storekeeper £200 a year (with residence).

"† Clerk £300 a year (with residence).

"Head Master and Training Master of Pupil Teachers, from £230, rising £10 annually to £280 a year (with residence).

"4 Masters from £150, rising £10 annually to £180 a year (with residence).

"Music Master and Organist, £120 a year (with residence).

"Allowance to Masters for teaching French, £50 a year.

"Allowance to Masters for extra instruction to Pupil Teachers, £100 a year.

"Moiety of Salary of Clerk of Works from £190, rising by £10 annually to £300 a year.

"(The other moiety to be chargeable to Naval Funds, the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury having signified their concurrence)."

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves and of the new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge also within the original limits of the parish of Whalley aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves and of the said new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Matthew the Apostle situate in the new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves as aforesaid

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester as such Bishop and also as one of the alternate patrons (in right of his See) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge (in testimony whereof he the said Bishop has signed and sealed this representation) with the consent of the Right Honourable Benjamin, Earl of Beaconsfield Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, First Lord of your Majesty's Treasury, acting as such on behalf of your Majesty as the other alternate patron (in right of the Crown) of the same vicarage (in testimony whereof he the said Earl has signed and sealed this representation), and with the consents of the trustees of the estates devised by the late William Hulme Esquire, the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves (in testimony whereof they the said trustees have affixed their common or corporate seal to this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves and of the said new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Matthew the Apostle situate in the new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew the Apostle Habergham Eaves.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew the Apostle, Habergham Eaves, being:—

"All that portion of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves within the original limits of the parish of Whalley in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of

Manchester wherein the present incumbent of such new parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded on the south-west by the new parish of Saint Leonard Padiham on the east by the new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge both within the original limits of the parish of Whalley aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the north and on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves aforesaid at the point where Trafalgar-street is joined by Albion-street and extending thence south-westward for a distance of six chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named street to the centre of the bridge which carries the same street over the line of the Burnley and Todmorden Branch of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of the same branch line of railway for a distance of twenty-four and a half-chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Coal Clough-lane over the said branch line of railway and extending thence southward along the middle of the said line for a distance of six and a half-chains or thereabouts to its junction with the public footpath which leads past the houses called or known respectively as 'Kit Field' and as 'Higher Harger Clough' and across Cog-lane to Bare Clay Hills Colliery and extending thence that is from the said Coal Clough-lane first south-westward then westward and then again south-westward along the middle of the said public footpath for a distance of fifty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction at the said colliery with the road which leads from the said colliery in a southerly direction across Back-lane to Habergham Hall and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of forty-three chains or thereabouts to its junction at Habergham Hall aforesaid with the public footpath which leads to New Barn and extending thence first southward then south-eastward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-described public footpath for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of Habergham Clough with Micklehurst Clough and with New Barn Clough which boundary divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves from the new parish of Saint Leonard Padiham aforesaid.

"And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge which is bounded on part of the east and on part of the south by the new parish of Saint John Holme within the original limits of the parish of Whalley aforesaid on the remaining part of the south by the parish of Goodshaw also within the original limits of the parish of Whalley aforesaid on the south-west by the new parish of Saint Leonard Padiham aforesaid, on the west by the hereinbefore described portion of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the north-east and on the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Habergham Eaves from the new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge aforesaid at the point where Manchester-road is joined by Rose Hill-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of forty-nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sep Clough-lane and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a

distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which leads past the houses called or known respectively as 'Wood Plumpton' and as 'High Turnpike' and over the hill called or known as 'Crown Point' to the Windy Bank turnpike-gate and extending thence that is from the last-described point of junction first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of one mile and fifty-two chains or thereabouts to the boundary at or near to the summit of the hill called or known as Crown Point as aforesaid which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Paul Lane Bridge from the new parish of Saint John Holme, aforesaid."

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of the Blessed Virgin Mary situate in the township of Ketley aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Dalrymple Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Wellington which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of the Blessed Virgin

Mary situate in the township of Ketley as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary Ketley.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Dalrymple Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of the Blessed Virgin Mary situate in the township of Ketley, as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Mary Ketley being:—

"All that part of the parish of Wellington in the county of Salop and in the diocese of Lichfield which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the whole of the township of Ketley and of that portion of the township of Hadley, which, as lying to the south of the centre of the line of the Shrewsbury and Birmingham Branch of the Great Western Railway, is not included within the limits of the new parish of Hadley, in the county and diocese aforesaid."

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament, held in the seventeenth and eighteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make further provision for the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the petition of the Town Council of any borough stating that an Order in Council has been made for closing all or any of the burial-grounds of one or more parishes, being wholly or partly within such borough, that there is difficulty or inconvenience in providing, under the powers of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On Monday, the 16th February, during a very heavy gale, a vessel, which proved to be the Swedish schooner "Augusta," was observed by the Coast Guard at Peterhead showing signals of distress and labouring heavily in the trough of the sea.

On reaching the opening of the Peterhead South Bay the vessel headed for the land. As it was clear that she would come ashore, the life saving apparatus was at once started, but by the time it reached the beach the vessel had struck on the rocks near Boddam, about four miles south of Peterhead, and drifted towards the shore, where she lay exposed to all the fury of the gale. Two rockets were fired, and the second carried the line over the stern of the vessel, but the crew were quite ignorant of the working of the apparatus, and were unable to avail themselves of the assistance. OATLEY thereupon took off his clothes, and swimming through the breakers and broken water, reached the smooth water between the ship and the rocks, and was pulled on board by a rope thrown to him. He then proceeded to haul in the line and fix it to the rigging, after which the crew, five in number, were one by one drawn ashore. OATLEY, who contrary to the captain's wishes, was the last to leave the ship, was landed benumbed with cold and fatigue, and cut and bleeding from contact with the rocks. OATLEY is not of a strong constitution and was invalided five years ago for phthisis.
