Nottingham Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Nottingham Union, in the town and county of the town of Nottingham and county of Nottingham;

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and addressed, among others, to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Nottingham Union, the Local Government Board prescribed Regulations relating to the Election of Guardians of the Poor ;

And whereas by Articles 32 and 33 of the said

Order, provision is made for the remuneration to be paid to the Returning Officer for conducting such Elections; and it is expedient that such provisions should be suspended as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby suspend, until such time as We may by Order otherwise direct, the provisions contained in Articles 32 and 33 of the above-mentioned General Order, so far as regards the said Nottingham Union.
