**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present

Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value shall not exceed five hundred pounds, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such enquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty, as herein-after directed, cause with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and if shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the patrons, if there be more than one patron, shall present or nominate to such united

"benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the twelfth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in the words following, that is to say :—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Hereford having represented unto us that the rectory of Holgate in the county of Salop and diocese of Hereford and the second portion or deaconry in the rectory and parish church of Holgate aforesaid which second portion or deaconry is a spiritual sinecure rectory in the parish of Holgate aforesaid and of which parish of Holgate the population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Hereford being in right of his see the patron or person entitled to collate to the said rectory of Holgate if the same were now vacant and the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester being in right of his see the patron or person entitled to present to the said spiritual sinecure rectory of the second portion or deaconry in the rectory and parish church of Holgate aforesaid if the same were now vacant have signified their consents in writing to the union of the said rectory of Holgate with the spiritual sinecure rectory of the second portion or deaconry in the said rectory and parish church of Holgate into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Hereford our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consents in writing of the patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before-mentioned are herewith annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consents aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only. And for declaring that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall after the said benefices shall have been united into one benefice collate or present to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say for the first three turns the right to present to such united benefice

shall belong to and be exercised by the Lord Bishop of Hereford for the time being and the fourth turn of presentation shall belong to and be exercised by the Lord Bishop of Worcester for the time being and thenceforth for ever every three turns of presentation out of four turns shall belong to the Lord Bishop of Hereford and his successors and every fourth turn of presentation shall belong to the Lord Bishop of Worcester and his successors.

"As witness our hand this twelfth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered that the rectory of Holgate situate in the county of Salop and diocese of Hereford and the second portion or deaconry in the rectory and parish church of Holgate aforesaid shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall after the said benefices shall have been united into one benefice collate or present to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say, for the first three turns the right to present to such united benefice shall belong to and be exercised by the Lord Bishop of Hereford for the time being and the fourth turn of presentation shall belong to and be exercised by the Lord Bishop of Worcester for the time being and thenceforth for ever every three turns of presentation out of four turns shall belong to the Lord Bishop of Hereford and his successors and every fourth turn of presentation shall belong to the Lord Bishop of Worcester and his successors.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time

when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with certain modifications:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the first day of April last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the sixteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parish shall be discontinued as follows; viz.:—

**RHOS-LLANERCHRUGOG.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Rhos-Llanerchrugog, in the county of Denbigh; and also in the churchyard thereof, except as follows:—

- (a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:—
- (b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz.:—widows, widowers, parents, children, brothers and sisters as can be buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyard be postponed as follows, viz.:

In the parish churchyard of *Kinver*, in the county of *Stafford*, to the thirtieth day of *June*, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

The following place declared by Order of Council dated the sixth day of *May*, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—The southern portion of the *Smithfield Cattle Market*, situate in *North-street*, in the borough of *Leeds*, in the West Riding of the county of *York*, comprising an area of eight thousand seven hundred and fifteen square yards or there-

abouts, and extending for a distance of one hundred and forty-eight feet from the southern boundary wall of the said market in a northward direction, and for a distance of five hundred and forty feet from the eastern boundary of the said market in a westwardly direction, together with the cattle-shed or building standing thereon,—is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

An area comprising the county of Leicester, and the borough of Leicester.

#### THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

**THE** following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

**Bedfordshire.**—(1.) The parishes of Biggleswade, Potton, and Sutton, in the petty sessional division of Biggleswade, in the county of Bedford.

(2.) The parishes of Upper Gravenhurst, and Lower Gravenhurst, in the petty sessional division of Ampthill, in the county of Bedford.

**Buckinghamshire.**—The whole of the parishes of Cholesbury, and Hawridge, and such portions of the parishes of Buckland, and Drayton Beauchamp, as lie to the south-east of the bridle-way leading from Leylands Farm in the parish of Buckland to Oaken Grove Farm, in the county of Buckingham.

**Cambridgeshire.**—(1.) The whole of the petty sessional division of Bottisham, in the county of Cambridge.

(2.) The parishes of Chesterton, Histon, Milton, Waterbeach, Landbeach, Impington, and Cottenham, in the petty sessional division of Cambridge, in the county of Cambridge.

(3.) The parishes of Caxton, and Little Gransden, in the petty sessional division of Caxton, in the county of Cambridge.

(4.) The parish of West Wrating, and so much of the adjacent parish of Balsham as is in the occupation of Thomas Burkis, in the petty sessional division of Linton, in the county of Cambridge.

(5.) The parishes of Burwell, and Wicken, and the hamlet of Burwell Reach, in the petty sessional division of Newmarket, in the county of Cambridge.

**Cheshire.**—(1.) The township of Seacombe, in the petty sessional division of Wirral, in the county of Chester.

(2.) The township of Sutton, in the petty sessional division of Prestbury, in the county of Chester.

(3.) The township of Haslington, in the petty sessional division of Nantwich, in the county of Chester.

(4.) The township of Tiverton, in the petty sessional division of Eddisbury, in the county of Chester.

(5.) The township of Torkington, in the petty sessional division of Stockport, in the county of Chester.

**Derbyshire.**—(1.) The district of St. Thomas' Brampton, which consists of parts of the several parishes, townships, or places of Brampton, Walton, and Newbold, in the petty sessional division of Chesterfield, in the county of Derby.

(2.) The petty sessional division of Derby in the county of Derby.

(3.) The petty sessional divisions of Ashbourne, and Sudbury, in the county of Derby.

(4.) The parish of Crich, in the petty sessional division of Belper, in the county of Derby.

**Dorsetshire.**—(1.) The parishes of Turnworth, Winterbourne Clenston, Winterbourne Houghton, and Winterbourne Stickland, in the petty sessional division of Blandford, in the county of Dorset.

(2.) The parishes of Tarrant Keinston, and Tarrant Rawston, in the petty sessional division of Blandford, and the parishes of Preston-cum-Crawford, Tarrant Rushton, and Witchampton, in the petty sessional division of Wimborne, in the county of Dorset.

**Durham.**—(1.) So much of the county of Durham, as lies between the river Derwent as far as Lintz Ford on the south, the road leading to the Spen on the west, Blaydon Burn stream on the north, and the river Tyne on the north-east, in the township of Winlaton.

(2.) That part of the township of Cockerton which is bounded on the south by the Cockerbeck, on the west by the beck or stream at the west end of the village of Cockerton, on the north by a back lane leading from the west end of that village to the West Auckland-road to the point where the Alma Hotel stands on that road, and on the east by the boundary of the borough of Darlington up to the Cockerbeck, in the south-east division of Darlington Ward, in the county of Durham.

(3.) The petty sessional division of the south-west division of Stockton Ward, in the county of Durham, and the borough of Stockton-upon-Tees.

(4.) So much of the petty sessional division of the west division of Chester Ward, in the county of Durham, as lies within the following boundaries (namely),—on the south by a stream running to the north of Hedley Edge to New Cornsay, on the east by a road leading from New Cornsay to Clickern-in-Cross-road and thence by Rackwood Side to Browney Stream to Satlay and Cornsay-road on the north, thence on the west to Towlaw over a stream north of Hedley Edge.

(5.) The townships of Penshaw, Newbottle, East and Middle Herrington, West Herrington and Silksworth, forming the eastern portion of the petty sessional division of Houghton-le-Spring, in the county of Durham.

**Essex.**—(1.) The whole of the petty sessional division of Beacontree, in the county of Essex.

(2.) The parishes of Borley, Bulmer, Great Yeldham, Sturmer, Foxearih, Ovington, Ridgwell, Toppesfield, and Stambourne, in the petty sessional division of Hinckford North, in the county of Essex.

(3.) The hamlet of Bures, in the petty sessional division of Hinckford South, in the county of Essex.

(4.) The parish of Aveley, in the petty sessional division of Orsett, in the county of Essex.

(5.) The parishes of Great Horkesley, and Little Horkesley, in the petty sessional division of Lexden and Winstree, in the county of Essex.

**Gloucestershire.**—The petty sessional division of Tewkesbury, in the county of Gloucester, and the borough of Tewkesbury.

**Huntingdonshire.**—So much of the petty sessional division of Ramsey as lies within the following boundaries (namely),—the Great Northern Railway on the west, Connington brook—"Baouch's Drain," on the north, and the parish boundaries of Woodwalton adjoining Higney fen on the east and south.

**Lancashire.**—The townships of Barton-upon-Irwell, Stretford, Heaton Norris, the hamlet of Mossley, the townships of Tonge, Royton, Chatterton, Thornham, Butterworth, the hamlet of Whitworth lower end, in the hundred of Salford; the townships of Eccles Hill, and Clayton-le-dale, in the hundred of Blackburn; and the township of Ditton, in the hundred of West Derby; in the county of Lancaster, and the boroughs of Accrington, Bolton, Burnley, and Salford.

**Leicestershire.**—The parish of Market Harborough, in the county of Leicester.

**Lincolnshire.**—(1.) The parishes of Barnetby-le-Wold, Melton Ross, Kirmington, Croxton, Great Limber, Keelby, Searby-cum-Owmby, Grasby, Clixby, and Cadney-cum-Howsham, in the petty sessional division of Brigg, in the Parts of Lindsey.

(2.) The parishes of Bradley, Great Coates, and Laceby, in the petty sessional division of Grimsby, in the Parts of Lindsey.

(3.) The parishes of Ashby Puerorum, Hameringham, Hagworthingham, Mareham-on-the-Hill, Scafield, and Winceby, in the petty sessional division of Horncastle, in the Parts of Lindsey.

(4.) The parishes of Great Carlton, and Manby, in the petty sessional division of Louth, in the Parts of Lindsey.

(5.) So much of the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the parts of Lindsey, as is bounded on the east by the parish of Dalby, on the north by the road leading from Dalby Toll Bar to Langton Lime Kiln, and thence to a beck running under the new road leading from Sutterby to Aswardby Chapel, and on the south-west from the said beck by the road leading to and as far as Sausthorpe Rectory, and from thence to the south-west corner of the parish of Dalby, exclusive of the above-named boundary roads, and which area includes portions of the parishes of Langton, Sutterby, Aswardby, and Sausthorpe.

(6.) So much of the petty sessional division of Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven, as is bounded on the north by a road running from Deepdales through the village of Leasingham to North Rauceby, on the west by the same

road in part and by a line drawn from the turn to the west of the road near Brinkley Hill to the corner of an occupation-road from Sleaford, on the south-west by the same occupation-road until it meets the railway in course of formation on the south of such railway, until it touches the mainroad to Ruskington, and thence on the east by a straight line to the Deepdales road above-mentioned.

**Norfolk.**—The parishes of Guist, Twyford, Foulsham, and Wood Norton, in the Northern Division of the county of Norfolk.

The parishes of Fakenham, Shereford, Great Ryburgh, Dunton, Sculthorp, West Barsham, South Creake, North Barsham, East Barsham, Waterden, Houghton-in-the-Dale, Croxton, Fulmodeston, Alethorpe, Penshorpe, Little Ryburgh, Stibbard, and Little Snoring, and the parishes of Shouldham, South Runcton, Marham, Wormegay, Tottenhill, Holme, Shouldham-Thorpe, Wallington, Pentney, Narborough, Fincham, Stradsett, and the parish of Scarning, and the adjoining parishes of East Dereham, and Wendling, and the parishes of Clenchwarton, North Lynn, and West Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

**Northamptonshire.**—(1.) The parishes of Aynhoe, Croughton, Evenley, Hinton-in-the-Hedges, Newbottle, Kingsutton, and those parts of Brackley St. James, and Brackley St. Peter Steane, Farthinghoe, Thenford, Middleton Cheney, with respective hamlets lying south of the late turnpike-road from Brackley to Banbury, in the county of Northampton.

(2.) The parishes of Kelmarsh, Clipston, Great Oxendon, Little Oxendon, and Little Bowden, in the county of Northampton.

(3.) The parishes of Crick, and Yelvertoft, in the county of Northampton.

**Northumberland.**—The borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in the county of Northumberland, except the lands and buildings approved by the Privy Council for the landing or lairage of foreign animals.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Proclamation relating to quarantine issued by the Governor of Texas, from which the following are extracts, viz.:—

QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION. — No. 1 — 1881.  
Executive Office, Austin, Texas, April 26, 1881.

Be it known, that I, O. M. Roberts, by the authority vested in me as Governor, by the laws of this State, do hereby declare quarantine to exist, and to be enforced on the coast of Texas, at the stations hereinafter mentioned, to commence from and after the 1st day of May, A.D. 1881, and to continue until closed or modified by directions of the Governor:—First—Said quarantine shall be applied to all vessels sailing from or touching at any port or place infected by a disease that is liable to be carried by said vessels, their passengers, cargoes or crews, and entering a port of Texas. Second—Said quarantine shall be applied to all vessels sailing from or touching at

any port or place south of north latitude 25 degs., and entering a Texas port, unless it be some particular port or ports where no infectious disease exists, satisfactory evidence of which must be sent to this office beforehand, and exemption so declared by the Governor. Third—The said quarantine is to be enforced under the following rules: All vessels arriving at any of said coast stations shall come to anchor, and not be allowed to weigh anchor until boarded by the quarantine officer of the station, and free pratique is granted by said officer.

"It shall be the duty of the quarantine officer to detain vessels long enough for thorough inspection, and to ascertain every possible fact pertaining to their sanitary conditions that might endanger the inhabitants of this State. Vessels from an infected place, with clean bills of health, and having had no sickness of an infectious kind en route, shall be detained and subjected to processes for purification a sufficient number of days to make, when added to the number of days passed between the day of departure from last infected place and the day of arrival at said quarantine station, a sum total of twenty days. All vessels, with clean bills of health, and having had no sickness of an infectious kind en route from infected places so far distant from the Texas coast that twenty or more days must necessarily be consumed in the voyage, shall only be detained a sufficient length of time to enable the quarantine officer to enforce such rules and regulations as may be deemed requisite for the purification of passengers, crew, cargo, and vessel. All vessels, from any port, arriving at quarantine station, having at time of arrival, or having had during the voyage, sickness of an infectious kind, shall be detained twenty days after death or recovery of the last case of said sickness, and longer if the inspecting officer is not satisfied that proper measures were taken immediately after the recovery or death of the sick to thoroughly purify the apartments occupied by destroying beds, bed clothing, wearing apparel, &c., that could possibly be converted into fomites. In all cases where the above rules have been complied with, and there still remains a doubt in the mind of the quarantine officer as to the propriety of admitting a vessel, he shall detain said vessel, report his reasons for so doing to the Governor, and subject it to daily inspection until all doubt is removed, or orders received to admit it.

Any vessel coming from a port or place north of the twenty-fifth degree of latitude, and which has not been south of it during this season, or which has been properly disinfected after being there, and contains a cargo that has recently been brought from a port or place south of that latitude, or from an infected port north of it, which cargo has been properly disinfected, of which satisfactory information must be furnished to the Health Officer at any Texas port, may be admitted after thorough inspection and no suspicion of danger is entertained; but if there has been no proper disinfection of vessel and cargo when necessary, the vessel must be regarded and treated as doubtful; and passengers or crew recently from south of said latitude would give the vessel the same doubtful character.

Any contemplated modification of the above rules, that may be justified by the erection of disinfecting warehouses at Galveston or elsewhere, shall first be submitted to the Governor for his action, to be granted only upon such conditions as to expense, and under such regulations as may be prescribed, so as to secure positive safety, which action shall govern all ports alike, upon

similar conditions, regulations, and restrictions as nearly as may be found practicable. Said warehouse would greatly facilitate commerce, by diminishing the number of days now thought necessary to embargo a vessel from an infected port, and would probably give greater security in ten days than we now have in twenty; but with a warehouse or without one, the crew of a vessel from an infected port shall be held for ten days from the handling of, and breaking the bulk of cargo, before permitted to pass quarantine.

Vessels from infected ports, laden with only such articles as can not possibly convey yellow fever, such as agricultural implements, machinery, iron, lumber, wagons, bacon, salt, etc., an itemized list of which will be given, may be admitted upon conditions stipulated beforehand for the admission of such vessels at any port, and proper arrangements made therefor under such directions as may be sanctioned by the Governor.

Vessels coming empty from infected ports for shipping cattle may be admitted at any port, after complete arrangements have been made to insure positive safety under such regulations and restrictions as may be prescribed beforehand upon application therefor.
