**NOTICE** is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday, the 22nd of June next, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at this Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

**REGULATIONS**

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

*May it please your Majesty,*

WE, Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, convened in General Assembly, most respectfully and gratefully acknowledge the gracious letter in which Your Majesty has been pleased to renew the assurance of Your Royal affection for the Church of Scotland, Your confidence in its loyalty and attachment to Your person, and Your sense of the spiritual blessings which it has conferred upon Your people through the labours of its ministers.

We rejoice to learn that, in Your Majesty's opinion, our deliberations have been heretofore conducted in a spirit of prudence and charity, and with a zealous regard to the highest welfare of the Scottish nation.

We earnestly join in Your Majesty's prayer that the Divine blessing may rest upon our councils, and that, by the Grace of God, the labours of our ministers may bear abundant fruit in the diminution of sin and wickedness, in bringing consolation and hope to the afflicted, and in the advancement of true religion and virtue.

We gratefully accept Your Majesty's annual gift of two thousand pounds for the diffusion of religious knowledge in the Highlands and Islands, and we will endeavour so to employ Your Majesty's bounty as to promote the spiritual interests of those of Your Majesty's subjects for whose benefit it is designed.

It affords us peculiar pleasure to welcome, as Your Majesty's Commissioner, a Scottish Nobleman of high personal excellence, grandson of a distinguished statesman who held office in our Church, and reckoning among his ancestors one of our most illustrious martyrs.

That the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ may long spare to rule over us a Queen who, by the purity of Her character and Court, by the tender sympathy which she shows towards all Her subjects when in distress, and by Her constitutional appreciation of the rights and privileges of the Church and people of Scotland, has won for

Herself a place in the affections of the Scottish nation never before enjoyed by any British Sovereign; and that Your Majesty, Your children, and Your children's children may enjoy all the blessings of this life, and everlasting glory in the life to come is the earnest prayer of

THE FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE  
 No. 2 ORDER OF 1881, AMENDMENT.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 2nd day of June, 1881.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

The Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order may be cited as THE FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE No. 2 ORDER OF 1881, AMENDMENT.

2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881 is hereby amended as follows :

(i.) In Article 5.(a) (iii.) the word six is substituted for the word four :

(ii.) In Form C (Movement Licence from Market or other Public Sale to Slaughter-house) in the Schedule, the word six is substituted for the word four (twice).

BINGLEY HALL (BIRMINGHAM) DAIRY SHOW ORDER.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 2nd day of June, 1881.

The Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, on the application of the Local Authority for the county of Warwick, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order may be cited as THE BINGLEY HALL (BIRMINGHAM) DAIRY SHOW ORDER.

2. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

3. Notwithstanding anything in Article 4 of The Warwickshire (Movement of Animals) Order of 1881, store animals exhibited at the Dairy Show, to be held at Bingley Hall, in the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Birmingham, on the seventh and following days of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, may be moved out of that Show and then into the District of the Local Authority of the

county of Warwick, in manner and subject to the conditions following, and not otherwise :

(1.) There shall be a Licence in writing to be given by an officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority of the county of Warwick for the movement, which licence shall be available for twelve hours and no longer :

(2.) Such licence shall only be granted on a Certificate of Health signed by a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, and a Certificate of the Secretary of the Show, or of some fit person appointed by him to certify on his behalf, that the animals have been exhibited in the Show.

4. This Order shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

5. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

3. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

4. The parishes of Barnetby-le-Wold, Melton Ross, Kirmington, Croxton, Great Limber, Keelby, Searby-cum-Owmbly, Grasby, Clixby, and Cadney-cum-Howsham, in the petty sessional division of Brigg, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

## THE SCHLESWIG-HOLSTEIN ORDER OF 1881.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Schleswig-Holstein Order of 1881.
2. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland only.
3. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.
4. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of June, one thousand eight-hundred and eighty-one, and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.
5. Cattle brought from a port or place in either of the parts of the German Empire respectively known as Schleswig and as Holstein, (in this Order referred to as Schleswig-Holstein cattle,) and sheep and goats brought from Schleswig or Holstein in the same vessel with Schleswig-Holstein cattle, may be landed for slaughter in a foreign animals wharf, but not elsewhere.
6. The landing of Schleswig-Holstein cattle in a foreign animals wharf shall be subject to the

condition that they are accompanied by a declaration and certificates, such as are indicated in the forms in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.

7. If the declaration accompanying any cattle imported under this Order is untrue in any particular, as regards any one of the cattle to which it relates, the master of the vessel shall be deemed guilty of an offence against The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878; with respect to all the cattle to which the declaration relates, unless he shows to the satisfaction of the Justices before whom he is charged, that he did not know of the same being so untrue, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained that knowledge.
