THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Consul at Alexandria upon the subject of quarantine, viz. :—

Alexandria, August 6th.—Egyptian Board of Health removed to-day quarantine restrictions on arrivals from Persian Gulf and Red Sea, but continues to prohibit importation of rags, without, however, preventing ships bringing them from receiving pratique.
