THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Consul at Alexandria, viz:—Egyptian Sanitary Council decided to-day (4th instant) that vessels from Aden, India, and Singapore, having to perform quarantine now applicable to arrivals from Aden, must, after ten days from present date, proceed to Torfor that purpose. This is not compulsory on vessels in good health, which, by existing regulations, can pass the Suez Canal in quarantine.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Quarantine Notice issued by the Greek Government, of which the following is a translation, viz.:—

To all the Nomarchs and Eparchs of the Kingdom.

In consequence of the cholera having broken out at Aden, a Royal Decree is issued, by which all arrivals from Aden dating from the 26th instant, as well as those from the coasts of Asia, Africa, and of the Red Sea, which are subjected

to quarantine in Egypt, but which have passed the Suez Canal without performing it, are subjected to a full quarantine of eleven days at the lazarets of Delos, Corfu, and St. George, which are now opened.

Wilt you call, therefore, the attention of your Sanitary Authorities to the strict supervision and

application of these sanitary measures.

Circular relating to places infected with cholera and to the consignment of vessels with cholera patients on board to the Port of Christiansand.

From the Royal Norwegian Department of Justice and Police.

The following foreign places shall, until further notice, be considered as infected with cholera, viz. :-

The Ports of the Red Sea.

Japan.

Philadelphia.

Fez, Mequinez, and Dar el Beida, in Morocco; and

Uruquayana, in Brazil.

Vessels with cholera patients on board and bound for Norwegian ports shall be directed by the pilots to repair to the Quarantine Establishment at Christiansand. In other ports the masters of vessels will be required to keep their sick on board and to remain meanwhile in quarantine.
