In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. Animals brought from the port of Coruña in Spain, and from the port of Oporto in Portugal, shall not be landed in England or Wales or Scotland.

2. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The

Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as **THE SALES IN DISTRICTS (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1882, AMENDMENT**

Commencement.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

The Metropolitan Market, or the Market, means the Metropolitan Cattle Market, at Islington, in the Metropolis, including the lairs therein.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Sales in Districts (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1882.

Movement into Metropolitan Market.

4. Notwithstanding anything in Article 6.—(a.) (iii.) of The Sales in Districts (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1882, animals which have been exposed at a public sale of fat animals held with a licence of a Local Authority under Article 6 of that Order, in a district described in the Schedule to that Order, but not in an area declared infected with foot-and-mouth disease, and which have been marked as provided in that Article, may be exposed at the Metropolitan Market within six days after the day on which the sale is held, on the following conditions, and not otherwise (namely) :

For the movement of the animals into the Metropolitan Market there must be a Licence of the Local Authority in whose district the public sale was held such as is indicated in the form given in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.

Disposal of Licences.

5. When the animals are brought to the Metropolitan Market, the person bringing them shall deliver the Licence to an officer of the Market or other fit person appointed by the Corporation of London to receive it, and the Licence shall be retained, numbered, and carefully preserved by such officer or person.

Slaughter.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorize the keeping alive of an animal beyond the six days aforesaid, prescribed for the slaughter thereof by Article 6.—(a.) (ii.) of The Sales in Districts (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1882.

Offences.

7. If an animal is moved into the Metropolitan Market in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved into the Market in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

No. 2 ORDER OF 1882.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 28th day of January, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT:

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 2 ORDER OF 1882.

2. This Order, except as otherwise expressed, shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; and, except as otherwise expressed, shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement from Northumberland, Cumberland, Westmorland, or Berwick-upon-Tweed.

5.—(a.) Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the District of the Local Authorities of the counties of Northumberland or Cumberland or Westmorland or the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, not in a place or area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, to a farm or premises in Scotland, with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved, which licence shall not be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority that the animals to be moved—

(i.) either have been bred on the farm or premises from which they are to be moved, or have been pastured or fed thereon for a period of at least one month: and

(ii.) have not within one month immediately before the granting of the licence been exposed in any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales: and

(iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.

(b.) This Article shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as regards the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

Offences.

6. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for

the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878. THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The following area (namely),—the parish of Fotheringhay, in the county of Northampton,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease. THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES
(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the south of the farm there, in the occupation of John Denchfield, and to the east of the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow.

(2.) So much of the parish of Swanbourne, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the east of the road leading from Swanbourne Church to the Aylesbury and Winslow main road at the boundary of Hoggston parish, and to the south of the road leading from Swanbourne Church through Mursley to Leighton Buzzard.

(3.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies between the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow, and the brook known as Wigwell Brook, commencing at the point where it crosses the said road near the village of Great Horwood, and continuing thence to the point where it falls into the Wash Brook which separates the township of Great Horwood from the parish of Addington, and also so much of the township of Great Horwood as lies to the eastward of the said road and is in the occupation of Frederick Denchfield.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Grandborough, in the county of Buckingham.

Cambridgeshire (Isle of Ely).—An area comprised within the following limits, that is to say, com-

mencing at Falls Drove on the west and proceeding to Singlesole, thence along Harley Drove to the Old Wryde Drain, thence along such Drain to Gold Dike, thence along such Dike to the Old South Eau to Falls Drove aforesaid, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

Cornwall.—(1.) The parish of Mylor, in the county of Cornwall.

(2.) The parish of Budock, in the county of Cornwall.

Cumberland.—The parishes of Whicham, and Millom, in the petty sessional division of Bootle, in the county of Cumberland.

Hampshire.—(1.) Those portions of the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, which are bounded on the south-east by the river Itchen, on the south-west by the road leading from Wood Mill through Burger Street to the Upper Common Gate, on the west by the Winchester road as far as the lane opposite Messrs. Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Bramley, in the petty sessional division of Basingstoke, in the county of Southampton.

Lancashire.—(1.) The township of Clayton-le-Dale, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(2.) The township of Samlesbury, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(3.) The divisions of Low Quarter and Middle Quarter and a portion of Kirkby Moor bounded on the north by the road from Beanthwaite to Garthwaite, in the township of Kirkby Ireleth, in the petty sessional division of Lonsdale North, in the county of Lancaster.

Lincolnshire (Holland).—The petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire.

Northamptonshire.—(1.) The parish of Fotheringhay, in the county of Northampton.

(2.) The parishes of Hardingstone, Wootton, Weston Favel, and Abington, in the county of Northampton, and the borough of Northampton.

(3.) The parishes of Warkworth, Middleton Cheney, Farthinghoe, and Thenford, in the county of Northampton.

(4.) The parish of Chipping Warden, in the county of Northampton.

(5.) The parish of Stowe-Nine-Churches, in the county of Northampton.

(6.) The parish of Long Buckby, in the county of Northampton.

(7.) The parish of Byfield, in the county of Northampton.

(8.) The parishes of Moreton Pinkney, and Canon's Ashby, in the county of Northampton.

(9.) The parish of Chalcombe, in the county of Northampton.

(10.) The parish of Hellidon, in the county of Northampton.

(11.) The parish of Norton, in the county of Northampton.

(12.) The parishes of Paulerspury, and Alderton, in the county of Northampton.

(13.) The parish of Rowell, otherwise Rothwell, in the county of Northampton.

Oxfordshire.—(1.) So much of the county of Oxford as is bounded on the north by the borough of Banbury, on the east by the river Cherwell, on the west by the main road from Banbury through Bloxham to the road which leads from

Bloxham to Adderbury, on the south by the last-named road to its junction with the Deddington and Banbury road at the eighteenth milestone, and thence in an easterly direction by the Banbury and Deddington road as far as the south corner of Adderbury Park, and thence by the tributary stream to the river Cherwell; such roads as are defined as boundaries not being included within the area.

(2.) The borough of Banbury.

(3.) So much of the Henley petty sessional division, in the county of Oxford, as is bounded by the following roads, but not including such roads,—the road leading from the village of Caversham to Cane End past the Pack Saddle Inn, and from Cane End to Kidmore End, and thence to the village of Caversham.

Sussex.—(1.) The whole of Boulder's farm, in the parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Thomas Brown; so much of the Limekiln farm in the parish of Chalvington, in the occupation of the executors of the late John Deadman, as lies east of the road leading from Chalvington to the Dicker; so much of the Claverham farm, in the parish of Arlington, in the occupation of Edward Shoosmith, as lies on the east side of the Wick Street Brook; the whole of the High Barn farm, in the said parish of Arlington, in the occupation of Edward Shoosmith; the whole of the Hole farm, in the said parish of Arlington, in the occupation of Edward Shoosmith; the whole of the Camberlott farm, in the said parishes of Hellingly and Arlington, in the occupation of John Deverell; the whole of Clifton farm, in the said parishes of Hellingly and Arlington, in the occupation of James Brotherhood; so much of the lands in the occupation of Robert Gutsell, at the Upper Dicker, as lie on the north-west side of the road leading from Berwick Station to the Upper Dicker; the whole of the lands in the occupation of Samuel Gutsell, in the said parish of Arlington; the whole of the lands in the occupation of William Wood, situate at the Dicker, in the said parish of Hellingly, and the whole of the lands in the occupation of James Wheatley, situate at the Upper Dicker in the said parish of Arlington; in the county of Sussex.

(2.) The whole of Leabridge farm, in the parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Mary Ann Heaver; the whole of the Broad farm, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Reuben Message; the whole of Lealands, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of E. A. Neville; so much of the Shaw Pits farm in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Spencer Piper, as lies west of the river; the whole of the Holmbush farm, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Cornelius Fox; the lands of Globe farm, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of William Burt; and the lands of Stonehouse, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Mary Ann Heaver; in the county of Sussex.

(3.) The whole of the marsh lands lying in Pevensy Level, within the parishes of Pevensy, Westham, Herstmonceux, Hailsham, and Wartling, in the county of Sussex.

(4.) The whole of Watkins Down farm, in the parish of Heathfield, in the occupation of Henry Edwards; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Richard Walters, in the parish of Warbleton; and the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Messrs. Dallaway Brothers, in the said parish of Heathfield; in the county of Sussex.

(5.) All that part of the parish of Willingdon, in the county of Sussex, lying within the following limits, that is to say, a direct line from the sea by the horse-path to the Langney Sewer, thence in a direct line to the north-western corner of the Anthony Hill Tower field, thence in a direct line to the south-eastern front of the Eastbourne Gas Works, and thence in a direct line to the sea.

Worcestershire.—So much of the parish of Chaddeley Corbett, in the county of Worcester, as lies on the northern side of the main road leading from Kidderminster to Bromsgrove.

Yorkshire (East Riding).—The parishes of Middleton, and Sledmere, in the East Riding of the county of York.
