It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

AT the Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, the 6th day of *February*, 1882.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances, titlings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such titling, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining titling, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and

other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury hath in pursuance of the said Act made a report to Her Majesty in Council in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"That there is in the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury the vicarage and parish of Tenterden which according to the census of 1881 contains a population (exclusive of the ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden hereinafter referred to) of two thousand five hundred and eighty-eight.

"That the net annual value of the said vicarage of Tenterden is three hundred and forty-eight pounds or thereabouts.

"That the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury are the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said vicarage of Tenterden in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Henry Robert Merewether is the present vicar of the said vicarage.

"That situate at a distance of a mile or thereabouts from the parish church of the said vicarage of Tenterden and contiguous to the ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden hereinafter referred to are two portions of the parish of Tenterden which portions are more particularly described in the scheme hereunder written.

"That the said portions of the parish of Tenterden contain a population of one hundred and sixty or thereabouts.

"That there is within the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury the ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden which according to the census of 1881 contains a population of six hundred and fifty-four.

"That the net annual value of the said ecclesiastical district or parish is thirty pounds or thereabouts but the Ecclesiastical Commissioners are about to raise the annual value to three hundred pounds and to make provision for or towards a house of residence for the incumbent of the said ecclesiastical district or parish.

"That the church of the said ecclesiastical district or parish affords accommodation for three hundred persons.

"That the said Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of Canterbury is in right of his See the patron or person entitled to collate to the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden if the same were now vacant.

"That the portions of the said parish of Tenterden hereinbefore referred to and more particularly described in the scheme hereunder written are situate at a distance of half a mile or thereabouts from the church of the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament

passed in the session held in the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 and in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign chapter 49 the portions before referred to of the said parish of Tenterden contiguous to the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden may be advantageously separated from the said parish and parish church of Tenterden and be annexed and united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme he doth by this report to your Majesty in Council certify the same to your Majesty in Council together with the consents in writing to the said scheme of the patrons and incumbents of the benefices affected to the intent that your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect."

And whereas the Scheme and Consents, referred to in the Archbishop's report are in the following words and figures:—

"The SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Report.

"That those portions of the said parish of Tenterden which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Tenterden from the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden at a point in the middle of the turnpike-road leading from Woodchurch to Tenterden near the bottom of Clay Hill opposite to the middle of the southern end of a certain lane leading to Brissenden Farm and extending thence westward along the middle of the said turnpike-road to the south-west corner of Knock Wood and extending thence along the the boundary fence of the said wood first northward then westward and again in a northwardly direction to a point where it touches the boundary of the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden in the middle of an occupation road or footpath leading from Knock Farm through Knock Wood to Tenterden thence along the middle of the said footpath first in a south-west direction and then westward past Mill Farm into the middle of the turnpike-road leading from Ashford to Tenterden thence southward along the middle of the said turnpike-road for sixty yards then westward along the southern boundary fence of closes Nos. 638 and 637 on the tithe map of the said parish of Tenterden thence in a north-west direction along the western boundary fence of the same closes and thence in a north-west direction along the south-western boundaries of the closes Nos. 636 and 635 on the same tithe map to a point where it meets the boundary of the said ecclesiastical district or parish in the middle of a certain stream which flows from Home Wood to Ashbourne Mill and on all other sides are bounded by the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden shall be separated from the said parish of Tenterden and annexed and

united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden.

"That the portions of the said parish of Tenterden so separated therefrom and annexed to the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden and the vicar or incumbent of the last-named district or parish shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That all fees and payments arising from baptisms churchings marriages and burials and for all other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed in respect of the portion of the said parish of Tenterden so separated and annexed and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the same portions of the said parish shall henceforth belong to and be received by the vicar or incumbent of the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden.

"That the inhabitants of the same portions of the parish of Tenterden so separated and annexed shall henceforth be exempt from all liability in respect of the repair and maintenance of the parish church of Tenterden but shall (subject to the provisions of the Church Rates Abolition Act) be liable in common with the inhabitants of the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden to the repair and maintenance of the church of the said last-mentioned ecclesiastical district or parish and the expenses incident to the due performance of Divine service therein.

"That the inhabitants of the portions of the said parish of Tenterden so separated and annexed shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the said parish church of Tenterden but shall be entitled to accommodation in the church of the said ecclesiastical district or parish of Saint Michael Tenterden saving the rights of all persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the said parish church of Tenterden and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That no alteration shall be made by this scheme in regard to the glebe lands tithe rent-charges or other endowments belonging to either of the said benefices.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of either of the said benefices.

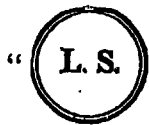

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground

should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with certain modifications:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the twenty-ninth day of November last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now; therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any of the undermentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued (except as herein otherwise directed) as follows; viz.:

MAREHAM-LE-FEN.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Mareham-le-Fen, in the county of Lincoln; and also in the churchyard after the first July one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

BELSFORD.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Belsford, in the county of Lincoln; and also in that part of the churchyard which lies to the south of the church, and within six feet of the church and of the wall which bounds its northern side.

CHAPPEL OR PONTESBRIGHT.—Forthwith and entirely in the church of Chapel or Pontesbright, in the county of Essex; and also in the churchyard after the first July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

CONWAY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Conway, in the county of Carnarvon; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

SAINT MARK, CONNAH'S QUAY.—Forthwith and entirely in Saint Mark's Church, Connah's Quay, in the county of Flint; and also in the churchyard, after the thirty-first August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by brickwork or stonework properly cemented:

(b.) In partly walled graves now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relatives of those already interred therein as can be buried at or below that depth:

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, and widowers, as can be buried at or below that depth.

SETTLE.—Forthwith and entirely in Settle Church, in the county of York; and also in the churchyard except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred therein as can be buried at or below that depth.

NEWBOROUGH.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Newborough, in the county of Anglesea; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:—

In partly walled graves now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relatives of those already interred therein, as can be buried at or below that depth.

That burials be discontinued in the churchyard of Saint Paul in the parish of Burslem, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and unmarried children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in and when opened are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. All the provisions contained in The Sales in Districts (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1882, and in The Sales in Districts (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1882, Amendment, shall apply to the districts described in the Schedule to this Order, (except such parts of those districts as may be for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease,) as fully as if those districts were included in the Schedule to The Sales in Districts (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1882.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—
