THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Odessa, intimating that a Notice has been issued by the Russian Government to the effect that all vessels arriving from Varna will be subjected to a rigorous medical inspection, and that should the present rumours of cholera at that port be confirmed a quarantine of fourteen days will be imposed on all arrivals from Turkish Ports.
