of Sumatra, without having undergone quarantine at intermediate ports, will be subjected to three days of quarantine of observation, provided they have had a clean voyage.

If they have had cases of cholera on board, or have any at the moment of arrival, they will be subjected to a rigorous quarantine of ten days in a lazzaretto.

ART. 2. The merchandize on board such vessels will be treated according to the rules of the Quarantine Tables of 29th April, 1867, excepting tow, rags, and old or unwashed garments, the importation of which is forbidden until further notice.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces are charged with the execution of the present Ordinance. The Minister, DEPRETIS.
