THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

GRANTHAM FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Grantham, as owners, that a Fair has been annually held within the town or borough of Grantham, on the Sunday of the Passion of Our Lord, in Lent, and on the three days then next following, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be held in each year on some days, namely, the first Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday in April other than those on which such Fair is used to be held:

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly given to the Justices acting in and for the borough of Grantham within which the Fair in question is held, and otherwise published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873:"

And whereas, on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the time for the holding of the said Fair should be altered as proposed:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873," do hereby order that the days shall be altered for the holding of the Fair which has been annually held in the town or borough of Grantham, and that such Fair which has hitherto been held in the town or borough of Grantham on the Sunday of the Passion of Our Lord in Lent, and on the three days then next following in each year, shall in future be held instead on the first Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday in April in each year.

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Twerton.

ARTICLE II.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.

A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man to Wit.

By the Lieutenant-Governor.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of “The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865,” it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of any two members of the Council, by an Order, in writing, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals, for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction of any infectious or contagious disease among the cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals in this Isle.

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called the foot-and-mouth disease prevails amongst animals in certain places beyond this Isle.

And whereas by Order, dated this 31st day of May, 1883, in order to prevent the introduction

of the said disease amongst animals in this Isle, the importation of certain animals was prohibited until the 15th day of June instant, and it is deemed advisable to extend the time of such prohibition as regards places beyond this Isle, other than those hereinafter mentioned.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do, therefore, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of the powers given by the said Act,

Hereby order:—

That until the 31st day of July next, no bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, sheep, swine, or goat shall be imported into this Isle from any place beyond this Isle, other than from Scotland, and from Whitehaven and Barrow-in-Furness, in England, and from Belfast, in Ireland.
