THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs from Her Majesty's Minister at Athens the following Telegram on the subject of quarantine:—

"July 21.—Vessels arriving in Greece from England, and having touched at Malta, are allowed to discharge cargo at Syra and the Piræus on condition that they have taken in neither passengers nor cargo of any description at Malta, and have simply landed passengers or discharged cargo during their stay at Malta, in presence of the Greek Consul, who will deliver a certificate that the vessel has had no communication with Malta."
